

ROGER STEPHENS RUNS FOUR LAPS IN 4:27.9

Palo Alto's Roger (Bannister) Stephens became the cream of Northern California milers last night by running the second fastest mile in the state to highlight the North Coast Section II track meet at Fremont High School in Sunnyvale.

Stevens, competing in a field including Bill Wilson of Santa Clara, Marv Cross of Lincoln and Wes Bond of Salinas, triumphed by 15 yards in his best-ever time of 4:27.9.

The performance was second only to Ty Hadley of Bellflower, in Southern California, who has a 4:25.5. Stephens' time was one of six meet records established last night and the fastest mile ever run by a Peninsula athlete.

Salinas galloped to the team championship on the jet propelled legs of Little Eddie King. King captured the 440 in record time of :49.2, the 220 in :22.0 and anchored the relay team in a record setting 1:31.6.

Although Lincoln's Don Bowden failed to get under his national half mile record of 1:52.2, the blazing San Jose ace shattered his 1953 meet record by almost five seconds in running 1:54.8.

Palo Alto's Rich (Ricky) Babka topped the discus field and eclipsed Don Malionoff's record of 137 feet 3½ with a toss of 140 feet 6½. Malionoff set the mark in 1952 while competing for Palo Alto.

The other record went to Willow Glen's Ron Frizzell in the pole vault. The stubby Ram cleared the bar at 12 feet 6¾ to better Chuck Hightower's

1953 standard by three quarters of an inch.

Burlingame's Bob Newman was a double hurdle winner in fast times of :15.2 and :19.9. San Mateo's Gino Della Libera came within one inch of bettering the shot put mark with a put of 53 feet 1¾.

Biggest surprise came in the Class B 1320 when Palo Alto's Ron Larrieu was overtaken in the stretch and had to be satisfied with a third place behind Jefferson's Jim Rector and Ken Ardaiz of Watsonville. Rector set a new meet record of 3:18.3. Larrieu topped the Jefferson ace by two yards in last week's Peninsula Athletic League finals in a record 3:16.0.

Palo Alto will send six men to the NCS meet Saturday in



Berkeley. Varsity contestants will be Stephens, Babka and John Tynan, who took second in the 100. Lightweights will be Larrieu, Gene Bettencourt, fifth in the hurdles, and Fred Balcomb, fifth in the pole vault.

Palo Alto Prep Runs Fast Mile

Roger (Bannister) Stephens of Palo Alto defeated some of the best of Northern California high school milers last night at Sunnyvale when he toured the four laps in 4:27.9, second best time in the State this year.

The mile highlighted the North Coast's division two meet.

Stephens, never out of second place, won over Wes Bond of Salinas, Bill Wilson of Santa Clara and Marv Gross of San Jose's Lincoln.

Eddie King led Salinas to the team championship by winning the 440 in a record :49.2, the 220 in :22.0 and anchoring the record setting 880 relay team which clocked 1:31.6.

Salinas scored 44 points to Burlingame's 32.

Don Bowder of San Jose's Lincoln, national half-mile champion, failed to better last week's time of 1:53.2 but recorded a 1:54.8, good enough for a new meet record.

In other record performances Rink Babka of Palo Alto tossed the discus 140-6½ and Ron Frizzell of Willow Glen pole-vaulted 12-6¾.

Class B records set were Jim Rector's 3:18.3 in the 1320 for Jefferson, John Nune's :36.5 in the 330 for Santa Clara and Bud Hamblin's discus toss of 130-3 for Watsonville. Watsonville won the Class B title.

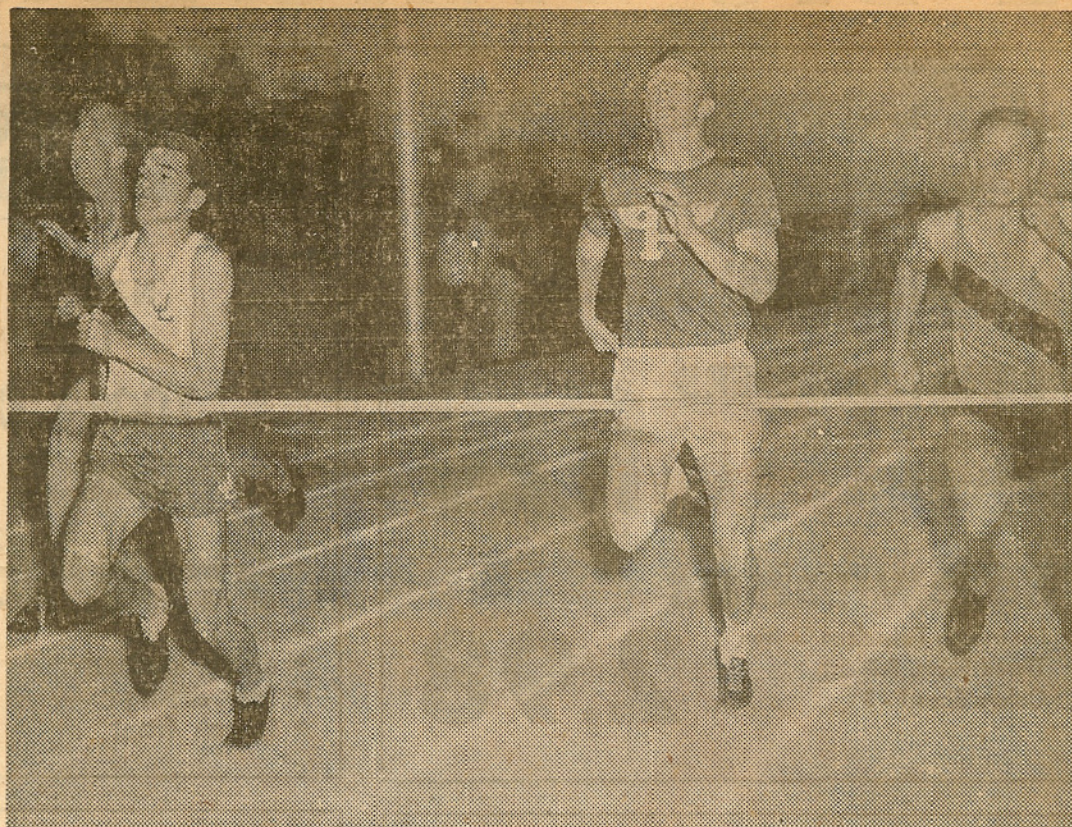

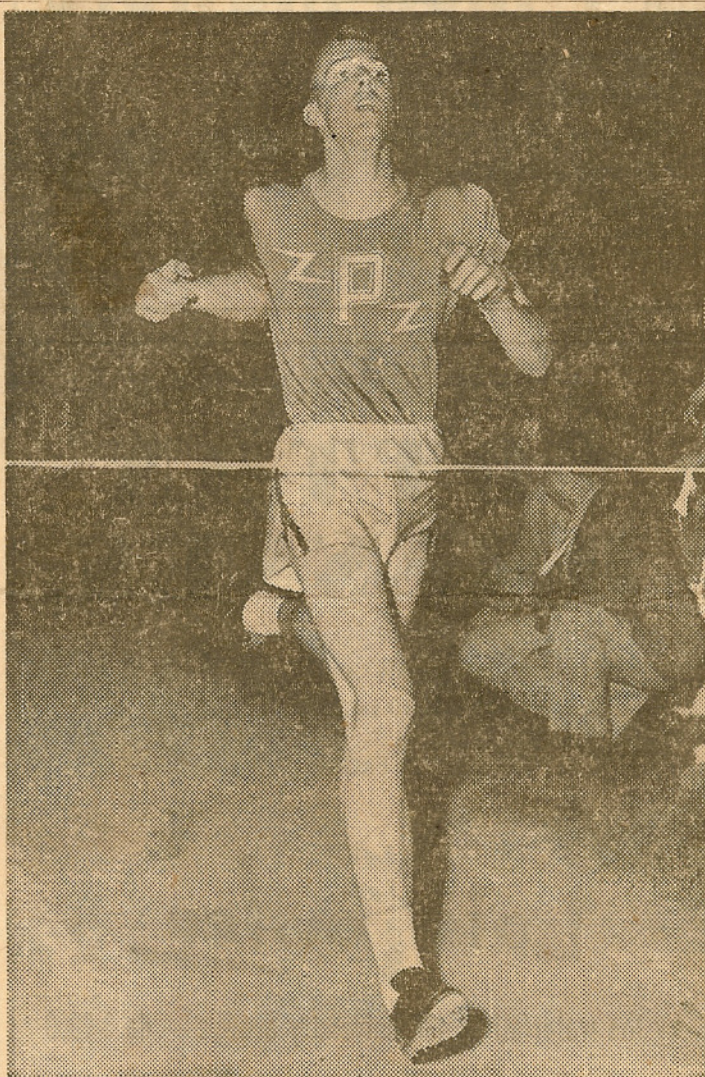

Salinas Flash Wins Twice, Anchors Relays

Stephens Runs Northern California's Fastest Mile of Season; Spilman Fifth

SUNNYVALE—Salinas' fleet Eddie King guided the Cowboy varsity track team to the mythical championship of the North Coast Section's Area II here last night, but Palo Alto's miler Roger Stephens shared the spotlight.

The little Salinas dash man was one of the night's two double winners and shattered ex-Sequoian Bill Rupp's 2-year-old meet record for the 440 in the process in copping the one-lapper in a swift :49.2.

A little later he nudged Lincoln's defending Peninsula Athletic League champion in a photo finish for the 220 crown in :22.0—mighty good on a track which isn't noted for being fast.

And finally, with the meet hinging on his showing, the slender little Cowboy star staged a thrilling stretch drive in the relay to shade Burlingame's Roger Peterson by another tiny margin.

Stephens, however, made the 2,500 fans on hand sit up and take notice by running away from a crack mile field in new meet record time of 4:27.9—fastest in Northern California this season and second best in the state.

Carlmont's Craig Spilman finished fifth in the feature grind, an unofficial clocking of 4:38.1—one of his best performances of the year. That was the only point the Scots posted, however.

Stephens started to lengthen out his strides on the back stretch of the last lap and poured on the coals to win handily despite a good bid by Salinas' Wes Bond.

Santa Clara's Bill Wilson edged Lincoln's Marv Gross for third and Spilman had fifth without much opposition.

Burlingame's Bob Newman took both hurdles from James Lick's Ed Brewer to lead the Panthers in their near-miss against Salinas, but didn't set any records on his way to the tape.

Ron Frizzell staged a minor upset by cracking Hightower's pole vault mark by three-fourths of an inch at 12-6 $\frac{3}{4}$, trimming both Dick Stein and Jess Undlin of Burlingame as well as Bob Fierro of Monterey.

All three were over 12 feet, but Frizzell had it in the clutch. Jim Matejka also handled 11-6, but found the going rugged thereafter.

Larry Meade of Sequoia and Ron Valentine of Carlmont finished 1-2 in the B broad jump to head a disappointing local field. Meade, tuckered out after his leaping, was able to take only a fifth in the 330 and Valentine failed to make the finals of the B shot.

Junior Barker of Sequoia also had trouble, injuring his right foot while high jumping and having to settle for fourth in the highs a little later.

Gary Hauser of the Tribe cleared 5-8 $\frac{1}{4}$ for place in the high jump, but otherwise it was slim pickings for South San Mateo County athletes.
