## Paly's Roger Stephens breaks PAL mile mark

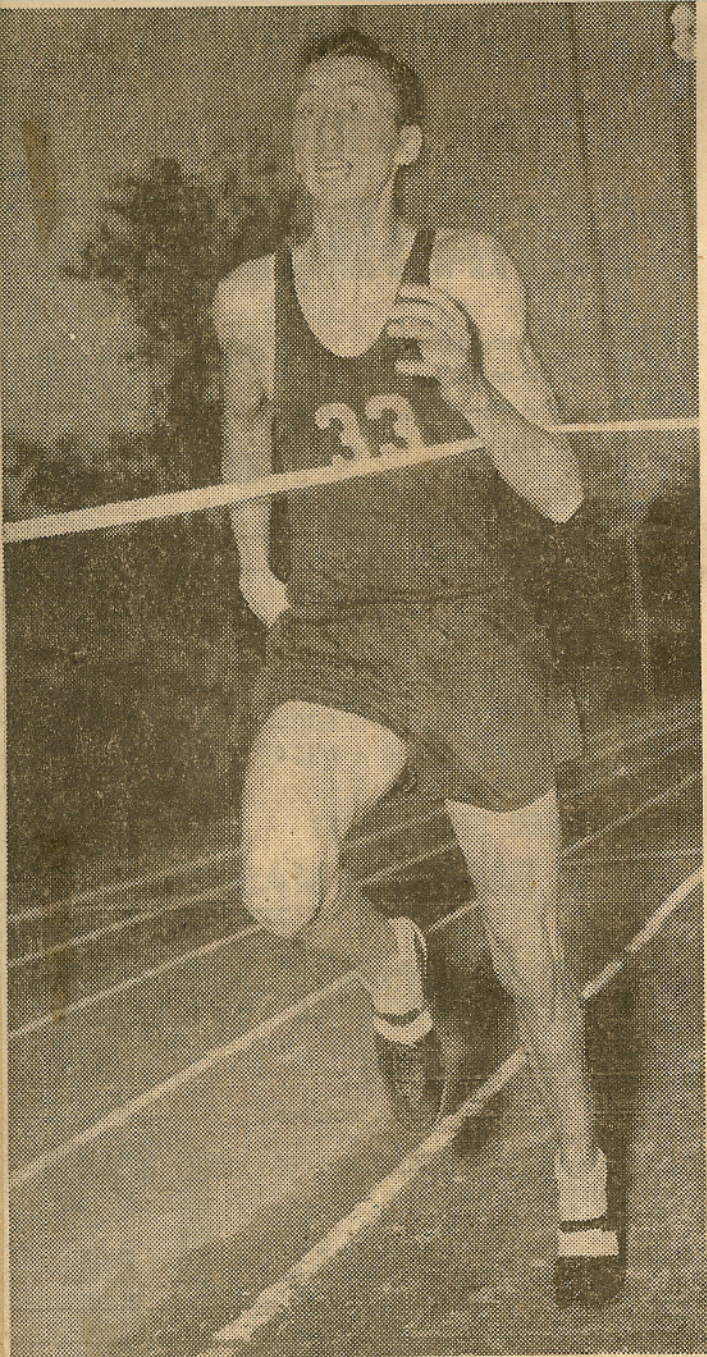
An estimated 2200 track fans were on hand last night to see Lincoln High School's Don Bowden run the fastest half mile ever recorded by a high school athlete. Bowden cracked the National Interscholastic record by seven-tenths when he gunned the two lap event in 1:53.2 to highlight the Peninsula Athletic League track finals at Sunnyvale's Fremont High School.

The former record was 1:53.9 set in 1950 by Lang Stanley of Jefferson High School in Los Angeles.

Menlo-Atherton's Hal Turner led the Bears to the Class C Peninsula Athletic League track championship last night at Fremont. The flashy freshman copped the 75 and 150-yard dashes, anchored the winning relay team and placed second in the shot put.

Ron Larrieu of Palo Alto established a new Class B 1320-yard record but both Paly and M-A finished far behind winning Sequoia.

Turner streaked to an :08.5 in the century and :16.4 in the 150, followed in both cases by teammate Pete McIntyre. Turner and McIntyre teamed with Bob Newman and Dick Telles to capture the relay in :47.4. Hal boomed the shot 46 feet 6½ to place behind Bob Sanders of San Jose with a 48 feet 6¾ mark.

M-A's Chuck Weesner aided the cause with a 120 low hurdles victory in :14.9 while Dave Skuce and Jim Stanford were part of a three place tie in the high jump.

Larrieu, a sophomore who set the Palo Alto High School varsity mile record of 4:29.3 Tuesday, completely shattered the 1320 record of 3:25.1. Pressed by Jefferson's Jim Rector, he churned to a remarkable 3:16.0.

Burlingame High unseated defending San Mateo for the team championship but the meet was decided in the final event—the relay—when San Mateo's Floyd Arterburn stumbled within 75 yards of the tape. Arterburn was pulling next to leader Roger Peterson of Burlingame when his foot hit the six-inch wooden rail bordering the inside lane.

Palo Alto's Roger (Bannister) Stephens broke the only other varsity record. He fouled the mile in 4:30.5 to better the 10-year-old mark of 4:30.8 by Lincoln's Fred Frevert.

Lincoln High, pegged as the meet favorite, lost all hope for victory when mainstay Bob Knoth contracted foot trouble. The Lion star managed to win the 220 but had to be satisfied with a third in the 100 behind Paly's John Tynan and Gordy Tinker of San Mateo. Lee Cox pulled his relay team from the final event for fear of further irritating Knoth's injury. The Lions were not a threat at this point, however.

Palo Alto finished a strong fourth on the basis of come-through performances by Stephens, Tynan and Rich (Rinky) Babka. Stephens completely outran Lincoln's Marv Gross while Tynan surprised with the 100 win and a third place tie in the 220.

Babka got off his best shot put heave of the season—50 feet 10½—to grab a second behind Gino Della Libera of San Mateo. The winning put was 53 feet 6½.

Babka also cleaned up in the discus, hitting 140 feet 4 to hand Walt Swarthout of Willow Glen and Della Libera their first setbacks of the season.

Don Bowden became the greatest prep half-miler of all time when he broke the tape for the two-lap race in 1:53.2 last night at the Peninsula Athletic League finals held on the Fremont High oval.

The Lincoln star broke the former National Interscholastic mark of 1:53.9 held by Lang Stanley by seven-tenths of a second. He outdistanced the field and won going away over second place Larry Allen of Jefferson. Willow Glen's Walt Swarthout, John Geimer, and Steve Scott followed in order.

Lee Cox, Lion mentor, kept a watch on Bowden at the 220 and 660 marks to give the lanky Lion ace furlong times. Bowden was clocked in 24 seconds for the first 220, 53 seconds for the quarter, and 1:21 for the 660.

At the 660 mark Bowden was two seconds ahead of schedule, but he finished his last 220 in 32.2, which was three seconds slower than he had hoped to run. One timer got Bowden in 1:53.1, two others in 1:53.2, and one in 1:53.3.

The 17-year-old Bowden still has three more meets left in which to break his new United States record, and Cox has high hopes that the Lion great will get down to 1:51.

The team championship went right down to the relay until Burlingame's Roger Peterson broke the tape to give the Panthers the title. Burlingame totaled 56 points to runner-up San Mateo's 48½. Lincoln topped local schools with 38 markers.

Burlingame's victory had a weird twist. San Mateo was leading by one point going into the relay. Burlingame's Peterson had an eight-yard lead when he got the baton for the anchor lap. However, San Mateo's Floyd Arterburn closed the gap and was about to pass Peterson when he fell down 75 yards from the finish line.

Lincoln's chance for victory went out the window when sprinter Bob Knoth hurt his foot and was unable to run at his best form. The little Lion star, took a third in the century and copped the 220 in 23.1.

Only one other record fell besides the half-mile and that was the mile. Palo Alto's Roger Stephens ran away from Lincoln's Marv Gross to post a time of 4:30.5, three-tenths of a second faster than Lincoln's Fred Frevert's old mark.

Sequoia won the class B championship with 41 points, but it was Palo Alto's Ron Larrieu, who was the star. Larrieu edged Jefferson's Jim Rector in the 1320 by one yard to post an outstanding time of 3:16, nine seconds under the old record. Menlo-Atherton won the C class with ease by totaling 51 points to second place San Jose's 23.

# Bowden Sets U. S. Record

Don Bowden, lankly Lincoln of San Jose senior, ran the fastest half mile in United States high school history last night when he recorded a 1:53.2 in the Peninsula Athletic League track championships at Sunnyvale's Fremont High.

The record erased was 1:53.9 set in 1950 by Lang Stanley of Los Angeles' Jefferson High School.

Bowden, defending State 880 champion, was clocked in a :53.0 quarter and at 1:31.2 at the 660 mark. During the last 220 he pulled away from his nearest opponent to win by 30 yards over Jefferson's Larry Allen.

Roger Stephens of Palo Alto bettered a 10-year-old league mile record by three-tenths of a second, being clocked in 4:30.5. Bowden, of course, also bettered the league record.

San Mateo's last ditch effort literally fell short of passing Burlingame for the team championship when anchor man Floyd Arterburn fell within 75 yards of the 880-yard relay tape. Burlingame's Roger Peterson sprinted to victory to unseat the defending Bearcats.

**SUNNYVALE**—Don Bowden, Lincoln High's "daddy long legs" of prep cinder circles, stole the show by setting a new U. S. interscholastic 880 record here last night in the Peninsula Athletic League's annual championships.

Bowden's spectacular feat—slashing the old record by Lang Stanley of Los Angeles' Jefferson High from 1:53.9 to a blistering 1:53.2—overshadowed a fine team effort by Burlingame's unlimiteds.

The lanky Lion ace, who had been flirting with the national mark all year, simply ran away from his field. He took

off early en route to a :53 first quarter and won over Jefferson's Larry Allen by some 35 yards.

The half-mile thriller was one of two P.A.L. records shattered as the classy field basked in the spotlight before a crowd of about 2,300.

Palo Alto's smooth-striding miler Roger Stephens ran Lincoln's Marv Gross into the ground to set the other varsity standard in a blazing 4:30.5—three tenths under the old mark. Gross just didn't have anything left as Stephens pulled out in a hurry 120 yards from the tape.

Burlingame wrapped up the meet when its twin pole vaulter jack-knifed into first place tie to head a standout field. Both Jess Undlin and Dick Stein cleared 12-6 after the Panthers had killed off San Mateo in the relay.

San Mateo, doped by many to win, saw its hopes blasted when anchor man Floyd Arterburn fell to the track 75 yards from home in hot pursuit of Burlingame's Roger Peterson.

It's highly questionable whether Arterburn could have overhauled the fleet Panther even had he remained upright. A win here would have given the Bearcats 56½ to the champs' 53, but...

Nobody will ever know just who might have won had both run the full distance.

Aside from the San Mateo upset, biggest surprise of the night came in the sprints, where Lincoln's one-two punch of Bob Knoth and Hank Olguin had been figured a cinch.

Knoth injured his foot before the 100, getting only third behind Palo Alto's surprising John Tynan. He came back to grab off the 220, but the Lions' thin chances had already blown away.

Another upset came in the broad jump, Capuchino's Stan Bergesen winning with a good 21-3 leap as Ron Frizzell dropped out to concentrate on the pole vault.

Frizzell, like his teammate, discus jockey Walt Swarthout, had to be happy with runner-up honors in his specialty. He was able to clear only 12 feet to deadlock with Sequoia's soph whiz, Jim Matejka.

Matejka led a flock of good performances by the Cherokees, hitting his all-time best in the grueling vault. Before last night the bespectacled Injun ace had made 11-6 only and that height just once.

Gary Hauser of the Tribe got a tie in the high jump for 6½ points and Roger Flynn heaved the shot past his all-time best in another good effort.

Warren Whaley and Dennis Ballam scored singletons in the hurdles and discus-heaver Jerry McNamara completed the scoring with a fourth.

Burlingame's rush in the score column as Bob Newman collected a pair of wins in the hurdles.

That was no surprise, but the way Panther Reed Baird edged in for second ahead of Dick Schumacher in the highs really jolted the Mateans' victory plan.

Rich Babka of the Vikings also proved a minor upsetter by spinning the discus out past 140 feet to top Swarthout for the first time.

Allan Bergstedt of the Bearcats hurt his team's chance for victory here, getting a fifth when the dope sheet said he could expect no worse than third.

# Barker, Meade Share Honors for B Champs

SUNNYVALE—Sequoia High wears the Peninsula Athletic League Class B track crown today — thanks to the come-through performances of just five placers.

Junior Barker, who doubled up to take the night's first running race and then wrapped up the title by high jumping 5-8 to close out the lightweight fare, was the big hero for the Tribe.

Barker not only walked off with 16 precious points, but his winning leap in the high jump broke a 33-33 deadlock with Burlingame, clinching the championship.

Barker's height equaled the best the varsity brigade could muster and he barely missed eclipsing the unlimiteds by an inch at 5-9.

Larry Meade, the other big gun for Coach Bud Presley's Cherokees, met with mixed success. He racked up 14 important digits with a win in the 330, a second in the broad jump at 19-6 $\frac{3}{4}$  and a fifth in the 150.

Meade got in his winning licks early in the meet by edging Willow Glen's onrushing youngster, Lee Courtwright, by a foot in a snappy :37.6 330—three-tenths off the P.A.L. record.

Courtwright gained some measure of revenge, however, by trimming the Sequoia frosh flash in a disappointing 150—won by Burlingame's surprise, Bill Bevilockway, another double winner.

Meade was shunted back to second in the broad jump by Carlmont's Ron Valentine. He had been expected to triumph. Obviously tired from his tough battle in the 330, Meade was unable to leap within a foot of his previous best.

Take nothing away from Valentine, however. His 19-11 $\frac{1}{2}$  winning effort didn't measure up to his best, but he was a very busy young man, too.

The Scot junior proved one of the night's most versatile per-

formers by placing third in the 330, taking another third in the shot at 51- $\frac{3}{4}$  and then coming back at the close to annex the jump.

Incidentally, it was chiefly through Valentine's efforts that Coach Phil Arnot's Highlanders were able to finish in sixth spot at 20 points.

Tom Jent, game little frosh, and Harley Smith also dug into the Fremont oval for important contribution, but it was Valentine who carried the load.

Aside from the relay, where Meade closed out in strong fashion to win by eight yards, the Tribe was limited to few points by others. Ken Crawford hung for a fourth in the 66 and Fred Schulenberg chunked in another in the broad jump.

Bevilockway's double win gave the Panthers a big lift and helped them battle the Sequoians all the way down to the wire.

Probably the outstanding effort of the night, however, came from sophomore Ron Larieu of Palo Alto.

He and Jefferson's Jim Rector staged a thriller down the stretch before the tiny Vike edged in with a record-breaking 3:16 clocking.

Menlo-Atherton's entries were pretty well outclassed except in the shot, where Gary Grider finished second. Loss of Wade Hampton's full effectiveness in the sprints through injury precluded any better showing.

All in all it was quite a display of future track power.
