

Eddie King's Leg Gives Trouble After He Runs 48.5 in 440 Yard Run⁵⁻¹⁰

CCAL track record book was practically rewritten here yesterday as the Watsonville lightweights and Salinas Cowboys won their respective divisions of the league meet. There were nine new records established and two tied as close to 200 thinclads gave their all for their schools. There were two accidents to mar the events. Eddie King pulled out of the 220 after running 50 yards when he felt a "twinge" in his right leg, the same muscle he injured at El Cerrito early last month. And Bill Costella of Watsonville fractured his left wrist when he came down after clearing the bar in the pole vault.

The final scoring of the events found, in varsity, Salinas 107, Watsonville 50½, Monterey 37, Gonzales 19½, Santa Cruz 16, King City 8, Pacific Grove 4, Hollister 3, Gilroy 2, Live Oak 1, and Carmel, no score. Lightweights, Watsonville 63½, Salinas 56 5/6, King City 50½, Monterey 30, Hollister 26 5/6, Live Oak 10, Carmel 8½, Pacific Grove 2, and Santa Cruz, Gonzales and Gilroy, none.

Cowboys Set Marks

Six new figures were posted in the lightweight meet and two others were equalled, while there were three marks, all by Salinas, increased in varsity competition.

The Cowboys' Mervin Anderson fired out the shot 52-2½ to set a mark that surpassed John Lewis' 1952 effort of 51-11½. The former Pacific Grove star saw his record stand up under two meets before being dropped.

The Salinas relay team of Hardy Nielsen, Rickey Axe, Don Pittman and Bill Baillie ran the 880-yard event in 1:31.7, against last year's Cowboy-owned time of 1:32.5. Nielsen, Jerry Lyman, Dick Casper and Eddie King were owners of that mark.

King Sets 440 Record

Eddie King won the 440, as was expected, and lowered his 1954 mark of 48.7 to a new 48.5. It was apparent he was not going all out to take this race and he apparently was favoring his right leg. It was his first real test of the once-injured muscle.

Last week's trials set up a new lightweight shot figure, but it was erased yesterday by Medina of Hollister, who tossed the iron ball 59-3½. Last week's figure, by Petty of Carmel, was 58-6.

Watsonville received sufficient points to insure victory.

The Babes had to win a first to nail down the meet, but King City knocked this idea out with its brilliant running.

Cowboy Winners

The Cowboys picked up their staggering 107 points when Jerry Lyman won both hurdles for the locals, Mario Pisetto of Salinas was third in the 120 lows. Ron Critchfield won the broad jump, Bob Woodring was third and Darryl Metzger fifth, Don Pittman took first in the 100-yard dash. Bill Baillie fourth, Rickey Axe was second, back of Kennedy of Watsonville in the 880-yard. Dave Martella was fourth in the shot. Mel Kelly won the pole vault, the last event of the evening to be completed, and Ivan Hartsell was second. Hardy Nielsen was second in the 440 and 220, and Pittman third in the furlong. Merv Anderson was second in the discus, and Rickey Tavernetti fourth.

Babe Point Men

Lightweight points were won when Sanchez tied for first in the pole vault at 10-6; Nardone was second in the 330, Don Agnelli was second in the high hurdles and third in the 120 lows. Nardone was third in the 150 and Pete Vona fifth. Sanchez tied for fifth in the high jump; Paul Lofte was third in the broad jump, Don Wizner was fourth in the 1,320; Jim Fanoie was second in the lightweight discus; Lofte second in the 75-yard dash, Ev Alvarez was second in the 660, Len Rabe fourth; Bruce Philpott fourth in the 80 high hurdles. Gil Hernandez, second in the 1,320 and Vona fifth in the 150, Lesoya third in the shot.

Next meet here is the CCAL consolation Thursday for athletes who did not make any points yesterday, and Saturday the NSC sub-sectional at Stanford.

Dunson Wins Two

Pettit of King City tied the 75-yard dash time of 7.9, which is now held jointly by Mits Hashamoto of Watsonville and Troy Welch of Salinas. Dunson of King City won both lightweight hurdles, and equalled the mark in the 70 highs with his 9.3. Calderon of Salinas set it back in 1951. His 120 low hurdle speed was 13.8, one-tenth of a second faster than Perry's 13.9 in 1954.

Prieto of Monterey highjumped 5-11 3/8 for a new record, the old mark was owned by Ellanson of King City at 5-8; Pettit of King City wrote a new time for the 150-yard dash, 15.1, compared with the time run up by Troy Welch of Salinas, 15.3 last year.

Thomas of Watsonville won the 330 by a scant step from Salinas' Johnny Nardone, and had to set a new record to do it. Thomas bettered his own mark of 37.5 by four-tenths of a second, to 37.1, to catch the tape ahead of the Cowbabe entrant. Aaron Ardaiz won the 1,310, stepping out in record time of 3:23.9. Forbes of Santa Cruz won in 3:24.0 last year to nail up the old mark.

Lose at Relay

While the Cowbabes actually were beaten by one point, because King City Mustangs took the lightweight relay, they were disqualified for an illegal baton pass at the first exchange, and

Arlo McKinsey was referee of the meet yesterday, assisted by a corps of officials. The first five athletes in each event, and the first five relay teams were given official medals. These were handed the grinning trackmen by Queen Lonnie Sachs and her four attendants, Rosemarie Clampitt, Dixie Hagan, Betty Eckerson and Mary Robinson.

Hollister Wins CCAL-B Title; K.C. Cops B Class

HOLLISTER—Hollister High chalked up 63 points to shade Gonzales for the varsity division championship in the CCAL-B "Little Seven" meet here Wednesday afternoon. Gonzales tallied 55½ points. Hollister was sparked by Shirley Langden who scored victories in both hurdle events. Hollister's only other first place finish came in the 880-yard relay, but the Haybalers piled up points with second and third place spots.

Winning eight of the 13 events, King City won the lightweight crown with 79 points to 55¼ for Hollister. Bill Pettitt scored a triple for the winners, capturing first places in the broad jump and both sprints.

Carmel's Don Petty got off a terrific heave of 59-ft. 2-in. to win the shot put over Rudy Medina who had a mark of 58-ft. 1-in.

Since records have not been kept in previous CCAL-B meets, all marks recorded Wednesday will go into the books as official standards.

Salinas Wins CCAL Meet; King Runs 440 In :48.5 ⁵⁻¹⁰

SALINAS—Winning eight out of the 13 events, Salinas' powerful track and field machine repeated as champion of the Coast Counties Athletic League Monday on the Cowboy oval. Coach Bill Kearney's Cowboys tallied 105 points to 50½ for runnerup Watsonville.

The victory may have proven costly to Salinas as its fabulous Eddie King walked off the track half way through the 220-yard dash when he felt a twinge in his injured leg. King suf-

fered a pulled muscle four weeks ago and was making his third appearance in a race since the injury.

King, however, had already cracked his own meet mark with a sizzling :48.5 in the 440. His old mark was :48.7. Two other meet records were cracked, both by Salinas.

Merv Anderson cracked the shot put standard with a toss of 52 ft. 2½ in. and a Salinas relay team running without King stepped off the distance in a blistering 1:31.7. Old marks were held by Pacific Grove's John Lewis in the shot put, 51 ft. 11½ in., and last year's Salinas relay team at 1:32.5.

Jerry Lyman of Salinas was the meet's lone double winner. He won both hurdles. Watsonville won four of the five events not taken by Salinas and Ray Perez of Gonzales took the other, the 220 in :22.1.

Watsonville won the lightweight meet for the second straight year as six new marks were established and two more equaled. The feature was a tre-

mendous 59 ft. 3½ in. toss in the shot put by Hollister's Rudy Medina.
