## Abe Johnson Runs 14.2 in **High Hurdles**

By ALAN MCALLASTER EDWARDS STADUIM, May 20 — With record-breaking hurdler Abe Johnson leading the way, McClymonds High rolled up 406<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> points to win its first track and field championship in five years at the 42nd annual Oakland Athletic League meet here today.

Defending champion Castlemont finished second with 363 points as quarter miler Ray Saddler and high jumper Curtis Crum accounted for two more records. Oakland took third with 211

points, followed by Tech with 200 and Fremont with 1721/2.

Johnson, who also won the low hurdles in 19.2 seconds and ran on the winning relay team, shattered the meet record in the highs with a 14.2 clocking. The former stand-ard of 14.6 was set by Tech's Sam Perry in 1956.

Saddler won the 440 in a breeze, finishing the one-turn race in 47.7 to clip threetenths of a second off the record he set last year. Crum cleared 6-61/8 to erase

the 6-4 5/8 high jump mark set by Mack's Ray Goodwin in 1952.

Ed Moody led a McCly-monds sweep of the first three places in the 100 in 9.8, tieing the record set by Bob Garoutte of University in 1941.

Coach Jim Coleman's team outscored the Knights in seven of the 12 events, and got a big boost toward the title in the shot put.

The Warriors'. T. C. Jones was first with a put of 55-8, and teammates James Dawson and Willie McHenry were third and fourth respectively, giving them 40 points to Castlemont's 18.

The Class A high hurdlers vere real eager, jumping four times before getting off to a clean start. Johnson beat Knight Bernie Whitfield con-vincingly i his one, but in the lows they were even all the way and finished in a virtual dead heat.

Moody looked like a cinch double winner in the 220. However halfway through the race the Mack junior slowed down, looked over his shoulder at the other runners, and ran just fast enough to finish second behind Dale Rubin and give his senior teammate a State meet berth.

The only first place, and resulting Los Angeles trip, which didn't go to McCly-monds or Castlemont was in the 880.

Gene Crenshaw of Fremont set a blistering pace for the first 660 yards, moving into the lead by about 40 yards. But his early speed took foo much out of him and the other four runners began to close the gap down the backstretch.

## Knight Gives **Jump Berth** To Teammate

You won't find David Hughes' name in the results of the Oakland Athletic League track and field meet held yesterday at Cal's Ed-wards Stadium. And it's not because the Castlemont high jumper, who competes despite an artificial leg, was afraid of the compe-tition.

Hughes has cleared six feet twice this season, and that would have been good enough for a second place tie yesterday

The Knight junicr volun-teered to give up his spot on Castlemont's three-man high jumping team so teammate Eddie Brackins, a senior, could earn his block letter. Brackins, who had to fin-

ish in the top seven in order to earn his monogram, came through with flying colors. He cleared five feet 10 inches to wind up in a tie for fourth.

Hughes, who is determined to excell but not at a teammates's expense, feels his handicap gives him an advantage over normal jumpers.

He says he can keep his left leg-the one that's artificial from the knee downstraight going over the bar, whereas other jumpers with stronger hamstring muscles tend to bend their legs and knock off the bar.

About five yards from the tape Crenshaw, still in the lead, fell and lay prostrate as the field passed him. He finally got to his knees and crawled across the finish line. Oakland's Elton Cox won

in two minutes flat. Other Castlemont winners were Curtis Stovall in the pole vault, with a personal high of 12-6; Jay Gailbreath in the mile and Willie Crum in the broad jump.
