

Cheatham Ties Marks At Davis

DAVIS, April 15.—Menlo-Atherton's Jim Cheatham tied two sprint records as Pittsburg High School scored 21¾ points to capture the large school team title and the 27th annual Woody Wilson Memorial Invitational Track and Field Meet today.

Cheatham, the only double winner in the large division, took the 100 yard dash in 9.9 to equal the meet's oldest record established by Claude McWilliams of old Commerce High (San Francisco) in 1931.

TIE FOR SECOND

The M-A speedster led the pack in the 220 21.1 seconds as his team tied Serra High of San Mateo for second place in team scoring with 13 points. Sacramento was 4th with 12½ and Modesto 5th with 10.

James Marshall high of West Sacramento won the medium school crown with 31½ points and Amador of Sutter Creek took small school honors with 28 points.

McClatchy of Sacramento was the Class "B" winner with 18¾ points.

Leading the way to Pittsburg's first team trophy and the large schools division was Henry Lawson, who won the 180 low hurdles in 19.7 and added a pair of second places in the broad jump and high hurdles.

HURDLE MARK

Steven Holloway of Armijo High of Fairfield, won the 120 high hurdles in the record breaking time of 14.6, while Dave Rambeau of El Dorado pole vaulted 13 feet 1½ inches for another new mark.

A third record was set in the 880 relay by the Modesto foursome of Dennis Elwess, Clifford Savage, Gil Middlebrooks and Roger Lee.

Pittsburg in Woody Wilson Track Victory

DAVIS, April 15—Pittsburg High, paced by Henry Lawson, scored 21¾ points to win the large school championship in the 27th annual Woody Wilson Memorial Invitational track and field meet here today.

It marked the first time a central Contra Costa County school has won this division. Antioch placed sixth with 8¾ points.

Lawson won the low hurdles in 19.7 and took seconds in the high hurdles and broad jump.

The Pirates' Paul Davis and Alonzo Mitchell tied for first in the high jump and 440, respectively, and pole vaulters Paul Connor and Peter Slapar tied for second and fourth at 12-9 and 12-6.
