

James Jackson's 10-Year-Old Record Broken

Spring marks, considered fabulous a decade ago when established by an Alameda High School athlete, are gradually being erased from the prep record books.

Another record set by James Jackson of the Hornets back in 1953 was broken yesterday by a new flash from Berkeley High School.

Jerry Williams, another great Negro athlete, was clocked at :09.4 in the North Coast Sectional I meet at Mt. Eden yesterday.

The burst of speed erased Jackson's :09.6 set back in 1953 and equalled the present U.S. interscholastic time for the 100-yard dash.

Hurdle Mark, Too

Greg Ford, long-legged hurdler from Clayton Valley, was clocked in :14.0 in the 120 high barriers to break the eight year old mark of Dave Krowel of Mt. Diablo.

The winds at Mt. Eden were gusty yesterday, but was under the allowable 4.8 mark during the running of these two races. Later on the program Williams ran :20.4 in the 220 and Ford hit :19.0 in the lows, but the records were not allowed because of excessive wind.

Neither Alameda nor Encinal won a varsity event as the competition gets tougher each week in the climb towards the North Coast section next at Pittsburg, and finally the California State meet at Berkeley on June 1.

However, two Hornets distance runners — Bob DeCelle in the mile, and Albert Rincon in the 880 — came back after an off performance in the ACAL-HAL meet. DeCelle was second behind Sunset's great George Rios in 4:26.2, approaching his early season time. Rincon, placing third, was nosed out by his old rival from Encinal, Ken Williams, in the 880. Williams' time was 1:59.0 and Rincon's was 2:00.2.

Class B Winners

Encinal placed in two field events as Jim Newell was fourth in the shot put with a heave of 51-3, and Ron Johnson went over the high jump bar at 6-0½ to win fourth spot.

Two first places were captured in the class B events as Ted Ferguson of the Hornets won the 1320 by five yards in 3:20.8 for Alameda, and Frank Ortiz of the Jets

captured the 70 high hurdles. Ortiz placed second to Ells' Charles Jackson when he ran a sensational wind-aided 120-yard low in :12.8. Ron Swisher of the Jets was fourth in the 330 and Stan Armoukus put the shot 48-2.

clocks at the finish line weren't even close. One caught the Berkeley senior in 9.6, a second in 9.4 and a third in 9.2.

Due to the wide divergence of the watches, the mark will not be submitted as a national record.

"We just couldn't substantiate it with only one watch at 9.4," explained Hempler. "There is no basis at all for a claim."

The mark will be entered as a meet record, according to Frederick.

Williams also won the 220 in

a wind-aided 20.4 and the broad jump at 22-6 1/4 to give Berkeley 24 of its 39 points.

Travis Williams of Ells, who is unfortunate to be competing at the same time as his namesake, had sprint times of 9.5 and 21.1 and Castro Valley junior Jeff Perenon clocked 9.7 and 21.1.

Moe, of whom much had been expected after he jumped 6-3 last year, finally got off a good one and won on fewer misses. His previous best this season was 6-2. Stuart improved by an inch, while Doe has done 6-5 1/4. Ricky Rogers of Ells and

Berkeley's Jerry Chatman had 14.1 and 14.2 respectively behind Ford in the highs.

Ford's 19-flat in the lows was wind-aided, and Ron King of Livermore surprised by taking second in the same time.

The only other double winner was Bill Staley of Las Lomas, who won the "uphill" shot put at 55-1 and the discus at 168-10.

Pittsburg's Peter Slapar upset Brian Hunt of College Park in the pole vault, both clearing 13 feet but the Pirate having two fewer misses.

Dave Anderson of San Ramon and Miramonte's Rich Kay finished one-two in the half mile again in times probably slowed by wind in the backstretch.

The mile was a surprise in that Bill Romell of San Lorenzo and Art Burkhart of Clayton Valley failed to qualify for next Saturday's North Coast Section meet at Pittsburg, while Steve Tingley of Hayward and Bruce Hutchinson of Miramonte did. George Rios of Sunset remained unbeaten.

Richmond quarter miler-broad jumper Joe McKelvy, who suffered an asthma attack Thursday night, and Del Valle sprinter Bill O'Toole, who had a bad cold, did not compete yesterday.

Under the hardship rule they will challenge fifth place finishers during the Richmond City meet Tuesday.

Williams' 9.4 100 Snubbed as Record

A 9.4-second 100-yard dash by triple winner Jerry Williams of Berkeley High caused a king-sized controversy during the North Coast Section Division I track and field meet won by the Yellowjackets at Mt. Eden Friday.

Coming shortly after Greg Ford of Clayton Valley had posted a 14-flat high hurdles victory and San Leandro's Russ Moe, Tennyson's Wally Stuart and Livermore's Terry Doe had all cleared 6-5 in the high jump, the 9.4 century time was announced as tying the national high school record.

Williams, who has a 9.5 to his credit and now had apparently made good on his vow to tie the U.S. standard, was naturally elated. But NCS commissioner Phil Hempler wore a worried frown.

Since it is his responsibility to sign any national record applications, Hempler wanted to be absolutely certain the mark was perfectly legal.

A gusty wind had nullified times in the early afternoon trial heats, and although Ford's time in the highs was certified as a meet record there was considerable doubt as to how hard the wind blew during the 100.

Miss Marilyn Gise, a science

teacher who was operating the wind gauge, assured Hempler and meet director Jack Frederick the needle had approached but never passed the red line during the race.

However, the three official
