## Messer Defeats Sandin; Clocks 1:56.3 for 880

Woodside's Teall Messer beat Carlmont's Jack Sandin last night in the duel of the half-mile titans, but Coach Loren Lansberry's Scots arrived on schedule throughout the rest of the evening to run away with their fifth consecutive Sequoia District track

Carlmont scored 1021/2 points to 411/2 for secondplace Sequoia and 40 for Ravenswood.

Ravenswood outscored Woodside for the B championship, but Coach Joe Greggans' Wildcat C's won their division over challenging San Carlos.

Seventeen district records (including trial marks) fell and another was tied in ideal running weather before an enthusiastic crowd that overflowed Terremere Field's south bleachers.

Messer's 1:56.4 half mile triumph earned him the trophy as the meet's outstanding track performer, while Carlmont's Lynn Arnesen, with a record pole vault of 12-9, captured field event honors.

The slim Woodside junior had tough competition for the track hardware from San Carlos miler Jim McNutt, who ran a best-of-life 4:23.0 for a district mark, and Carlmont sprinter Andy Sears, whose 9.8 century en route to a double triumph clipped onetenth from the old record.

Meet Referee Don Dorfmeier was not called upon to settle a single serious hassle as the program ran off like clockwork in a brisk 21/2 hours.

It looked indeed as If Sandin was in command going into the final turn with a seven-yard bulge. But Messer, with an advantage in sheer speed, jumped the Scot veteran in the run for the tape and pulled away by nearly 10 yards. The winning time was Northern California's best this year. Unfortunately, nor one got Sandin's second-place mark, but it almost certainly was below 1:58.

Other Sequoia come-throughs included a superb 49.0 quarter-mile by hard-working Bill Johnson and a 51-9½ shot put by gridder Mike Baird that stood up from Tuesday's trials for first place.

Records fell like rain. Brian Hea, the division's only double winner, cracked the 150 standard in 15 flat after blasting his own mark with a scorching 1:23.8.

M-A's Mike Meri improved his own shot put record with a 50 foot, ¼ inch heave, and Ravenswood's Don Brown soared 5-11 to eclipse the high jump record by mearly three inches. Trojan Bob Washingston, best B broad jumper in district history, sailed 22-10 in the trials, more than a foot beyond the previous standard.

Dan Dempsey of Woodside clipped two-tenths off his 330 record with a nifty 35.9 and Ravenswood's Dwight Turner continued his brilliant hurdling with a record li3.5 in the 120 lows.

Ravenswood's 440 relay team needed a sensational 44.2 to edge Woodside by a couple of inches, and Barooshian is bemeaning the fact he's tied up with a journalism conference next week and can't take his charges for a shot at the gold medals in the Fresno Relays.
