

Davis Third In Discus At Fresno

Sophomore Mike Davis of Hillsdale High School took third in the discus throw at 161-6 in the Fresno Relays, and San Mateo captured two firsts, but other Mid Peninsula League trackmen failed to place.

The San Mateo fourths came in the distance medley relay, anchored by Dave Madigan, and by Jim Lydon, who tied for fourth in the pole vault.

San Mateo's 440 relay team was last when Alonzo Emery came up with a sore leg, and Craig Newgard went unplaced in the shot put.

Burlingame's distance medley relay team scratched and Mills mile relay team plus Mike Shea in the shot put were unplaced.

Prep sails 25-10³/₄

FRESNO — Getting off a great series of jumps, including four of them better than 25 feet, junior Heulon Hewitt of Merced cracked the National Interscholastic long jump record here last night.

Hewitt, a 17-year-old, thrilled a West Coast Relays crowd of 9,000 fans as he won the event with a tremendous leap of 25-10³/₄ to better Jerry Proctor's national prep mark of 25-7.

The series by the new champ included a leadoff of 23-9¹/₄, followed by 24-10, a wind aided 25-1, 25-8¹/₂, a wind aided 25-6¹/₂ and his windup record-breaking leap.

In winning the vote as the outstanding prep performer, Hewitt, also cleared 6-7 to take second behind Otis Hailley of Wasco (6-9) in the high jump.

Hailey, who has done 7-1¹/₄, bettered the meet record of 6-8 by Jim Flynn of Fresno's Roosevelt but then missed three attempts at seven feet even.

Not satisfied with his long workout, Hewitt also ran third on Merced's 440 yard relay team. The team finished first

in 41.7 for what would have been a meet record, but Hewitt's baton pass to anchor man Charles Bennett was out of the zone and the team was disqualified.
