Reich's Record Vault **Tops Carlmont Relays**

Berkeley High used its superior depth to win two firsts and six seconds on way to capturing the seventh annual Carlmont High Track and Field Relays at Carlmont Saturday morning.

El Cerrito finished 15 points in back of the Hornets while Pittsburg, Los Altos, Carlmont and San Mateo rounded out the classy field.

Although all the events were run as relays, there were some outstanding marks - including two Northern California bests.

Carlmont's Eric Reich led his team to a pole vault victory with a NorCal best of 14-41/4.

The mark was a personal high for Reich, setting a stadium record and moving him behind only Dennis Phillips (14-6) in Carlmont and San Mateo County vault history.

El Cerrito's fine crop of sprinters set a Northern California best of 3:23.7 in the mile relay, while equaling its own NorCal best of 42.7 in the 440 relay.

Carlmont captured one other relay besides the pole vault when it easily won the eightmile with a team of Hans Templeman, Chris Carey, Ralph Furnnari and Al Coons. Carey ran away with the field with the fastest split of 9:36.2.

Other outstanding individuals included Los Altos' Chris Adams in the weights with a

172-4 discus throw and a 59-9 shot put; Alonzo Emery of San Mateo with a field record 23-2 in the long jump and Steve Arkley of Los Altos' triple jumped of 46-21/2 — eight inches short of his NorCal best.

The only disappointment was the absence of State 880 champion George Alfaro of Pittsburg, who had to skip the meet after pulling a muscle in a dual meet last week.
