JUNIORS STEAL SHOW AT PA-AAU 50-MILER (Feb. 26, Marysville to Sacramento): - Two 19-year-olds led one of the largest, fastest 50-mile fields in Northern California history in the Pacific AAU Championships. Dennis Rinde, a student at Sacramento State, completed his first ultra-marathon in a time that should rank among the fastest of the year. His 5:40:16 would have been among the top half-dozen 50-mile times for 1977. Chris Hamer's performance is also certain to rank among the fastest ever for a Junior (under 20) competitor. His 5:49:36 came 11 weeks after winning his first ultra-distance effort, the PA-AAU 100-Kilo in Woodside. Mike Souza and Marc Hoschler of the victorious Buffalo Chips also dipped under Darryl Beardall's 1975 course record of 6:21:59. Beardall led much of this year's race, sporting a six-minute lead at 20 miles. His 6:23:29 is the new Master's division course standard, 70 minutes under Vic Crosetti's 1975 mark. Also impressive was Sally Edwards' 7:46:32, just 22 minutes off Natalie Cullimore's PA record. Finally, Dick Goodman, of Yakima, Washington, may have set a national record in running 8:02:59 at age 58. Goodman plans to run across Death Valley this summer. /Bob Cooper/

ATHLETES IN ACTION WIN EXCITING CHRISTMAS RELAYS BATTLE (Dec. 18, Santa Cruz to Half Moon Bay): - This year's relays were not quite as big as we had expected, but 250 teams is big enough! The early morning rain broke up shortly after the start of the race, and most of the runners had only to contend with sunny skies and some brisk winds, which caused times to be slowed somewhat. Would you believe that not one single leg or division record fell? Of course we added a sub-masters division, so that becomes an automatic record, but WVTC's sub-masters did a 4:20:27 last year when there was no official division for them and they ran with the open teams. Anyhow, we apologize for the lateness of the results, which should be mailed out shortly... we had some real hassles when our Chronomix timer at 35 miles was accidentally reset a couple of times, but we think we've got the fast legs worked out at least. If your team got fairly accurate splits, you might let us know what they were on legs 5 and 6...when you get the splits, we are not guaranteeing their

accuracy. Perhaps next year everyone should do their own timing? Let us know what you think about that (except for timing maybe the top twenty teams to get fast legs). MACDONALD DEFEATS STELLAR FIELD AT LOS ALTOS MIDNIGHT RUN (Dec. 31, Los Altos): - Ex-American record-holder in the 5,000 meters, Duncan Macdonald, showed 1977's top-ranked road-racer (by *Runner's World & Track & Field News*), Bill Rodgers, a thing or two about running in the waning hours of the year as he registered an impressive 15-second victory over the American record-holder in the marathon. Current 5,000 meter recordman, Marty Liquori, was also left in the dust, another 8 seconds back, with 1977 Boston Marathon victor, Jerome Drayton, another few seconds behind. Probably one of the more impressive performances came from Mike Pinocci (6th in 28:36), who was running with Liquori & Drayton until about a mile to go. Ex-Washington H.S. teammate, Mike Ruffatto, was also high up in the field (7th in 24:04). Hal Higdon's 26:35 led the masters, while Kerry Brogan recorded a 30:15 to finish as top woman (only one in the invitational field). His nearest competitors were some 200 yards back, clocking 36:46 for a second-place tie (Joe Salazar and Scott Molina). Molina won the high school title. Surprise winner in the masters division was Richard Keene, 40, of the NorCal Seniors. A confusing age-breakdown but those under 40 in the 'open' division, but allowed those over 30 to compete in the 'senior' division. So there were 30-39 competitors in both! Keene's 42:26 beat runnerup John Armstrong (49) by a full minute. Linda Anderson won the open women's race and was tops overall too in 44:58 (42nd place). She was followed by Liz Strangio (48:09), who won the girls' high school title, and Sharon Yaninek (48:12), who took the junior girls' title. 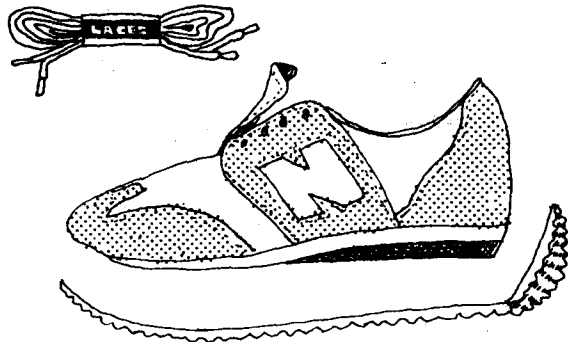

Ben's winning time was 19:42. In the faster of the two races, Jerry Lewis defeated C. Rochez (new master?), 21:36 to 22:49 for the 40-and-over division win, while super-star Roxanne Bier of the Cindergals clocked 22:02 to beat teammate Cathy Demmelmaier by a quarter-mile! Carl Martin (Div. II master) ran one of his better races in capturing the Los Gatos-Saratoga masters trophy in 22:07, while teammate Maynard Orme waged a super-close battle with John Flather and Bob Mackey, who each were timed in 23:01. Kathy Perkins' 23:22 defeated Sue Munday's 23:40 for the top women's award in that race. A good turnout for this first-ever event saw nearly 600 finish both runs. GEIS WINS CALIFORNIA "10"; SMITH UPSETS O'NEIL IN MASTERS DIVISION; CRISP BLITZES WOMEN'S RECORD
 (Jan. 8, Stockton): - On a wet day, Athletics West's Paul Geis, currently doing graduate work at Stanford Univ., ran to a 22-second victory over surprising Stanford frosh, Tom O'Neil, however, the 48:37 course record set by Jim Nuccio was not remotely approached. In fact, nobody broke 50 minutes on this usually super-fast course. Ever-improving Fritz Watson, who just a month before had notched a marathon PR of 2:21:00 at Livermore, ducked in for third at 50:54, beating such good runners as Pete Flores and Bill Clark, among others. Ross Smith, who had just recently turned 50, helped celebrate with a solid upset over 2:35-marathon, Jim O'Neil, 55:07 to 56:28, just missing his own course mark by 9 seconds. Gordon Gane was a very competitive third at 56:41. The only course mark to go was the 64:28 set last year by Sally Edwards, and it went in a big way. Laurie Crisp, only a junior at Modesto's Downey High, scored a big victory with her 61:01, dragging Kerry Brogan (63:42) and Jo Williams (64:07) under the old mark too, as defending champ Edwards was 20 seconds slower than last year in fourth. Another well-run competition by the Sundance T.C., as there were 430 finishers, despite the adverse conditions. /Frank Hagerty/

MAXWELL DESTROYS TALENTED FIELD AT PAUL MASSON MARATHON (Jan. 22, Saratoga): - This year's event went to great expense to fly in the top talent from around the country (and even Japan) to participate in this popular race. Despite the hilly course, the well-managed race always seems to pack them in, with this year's field at a record 670 finishers. Brian Maxwell, third-ranked marathoner in the world last year by *Track & Field News*, started the year off on a good foot by destroying the old course record (2:29:13), held by Paul Thompson (13th this year), with a superlative 2:20:06. This was good enough for a half-mile margin of victory over John Bordell of Colorado, and was good for another minute on third placer, Dan Cloeter of Illinois. The top six runners dipped under the old mark, to indicate the depth of the field. Ulrich Kaempf set a masters mark with his 2:42:59, just 13 seconds off his own PR. Mike Healy (2:47:55) had the old standard from 1977. Kaempf took a two-mile margin of victory over others in his age-class, but the real excitement was for the next four places, as all finished within 24 seconds, led by Joe Sloan's PR of 2:56:03. Ted Wilson's 2:56:12 slipped in for third. In the women's division, Penny DeMoss' fine 2:59:14 held up from last year as two newcomers to the marathon game garnered the top spots. Carol Dickinson (3:03:05) just edged Marche Unnasch (3:03:17) in that battle. Ruth Anderson led the masters women with her 3:18:01, well off her own personal record. /Dan O'Keefe/ (more Pg. 42)

MACDONALD SETS PR AT WEST VALLEY MARATHON (Feb. 12, San Mateo): Nearly 500 started the 8th Annual race, but only about 60% of those stuck it out for the entire distance, as stormy conditions prevailed for most of the run (45° and strong headwinds on portions of the course). It would have been interesting to see how fast it would have been with less traumatic weather conditions, but Duncan Macdonald was still satisfied with his 2:17:16 PR, which also broke Don Kardong's meet record (for this course) and Alvaro Mejia's all-time meet record (for other course)... they were 2:18:16 (in 1972) and 2:17:22 (in 1971), respectively. The only other finisher under 2:20 on this normally quick course (5 were under 2:30) was 2:17 man, Mike Pinocci, who recorded a 2:19 flat for his second-best time. Mike hung on doggedly until just after 20 miles (1:44:04, just 14 seconds back), and then let go. Dunc actually doubled his lead in the last 1.5 miles. Ernie Rivas, Atkins Chun and Angel Martinez all broke 2:30, with the latter two also getting PR's. Jim O'Neil, now 52, blitzed a super 2:39:48 (4 minutes off his time of last year) to cripple the rest of the masters field (Russell Kiernan's 2:52:33 was next). Lucy Shapiro, 39, was the very surprised winner of a trip to Atlanta for the Avon (Women's International) Marathon in March... she was not aware of it until told so. Her 3:17:34 was a PR, but not a time you'd think would qualify for such a trip. Nonetheless, everyone else had an equal chance, as it was clearly stated on the entry to win the masters women's trophy (she was the only one to finish!). West Valley defended their team title with Macdonald, Pinocci, and Barker (2:36:46), with Excelsior runnerup and West Valley Joggers in third. A total of 305 officially finished. /Leydig/ (P.S. - For those that ran, we're still working on photos & certificates and should get them in the mail shortly.)

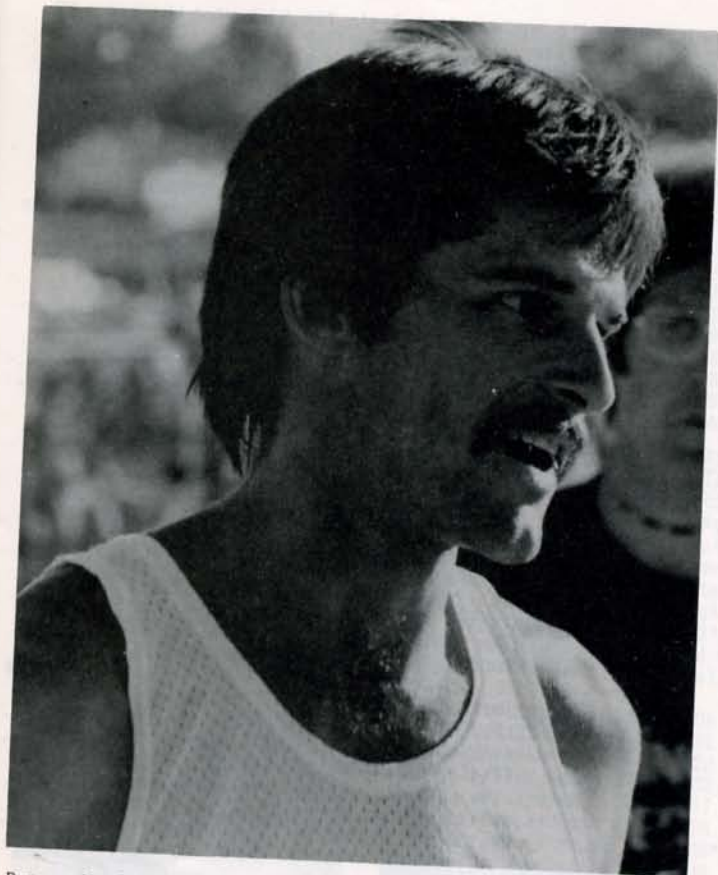

PENNY DEMOSS SETS NOR-CAL RECORD, FINISHES SECOND AT BOSTON: (Apr. 17, Boston): - Under conditions that every marathoner waits for, a record field of 4000+ created the fastest finish (in numbers) ever at Boston. Both men's and women's records stayed intact, but Bill Rodgers came within 18 seconds of his own course standard and had all he could do to hold off fast-finishing Jeff Wells (by 2 seconds), recording a very quick 2:10:13. The weather, in the mid-40's and overcast, was a marathoner's dream, and many made good that dream as 32 dipped under the once-sacred 2:20 barrier, and 29 women broke three hours in similar amazing fashion. Gayle Barron caught fast-starting Kim Merritt on the hills and went on to record a PR, scoring her first-ever marathon victory in 2:44:52. But the biggest surprise for the women was back in second place. The feature-story in the May *Runner's World*, WVTC's Penny DeMoss didn't succumb to any jinx as she started conservatively, and moved from about eighth place midway through the race into contention on the hills as she passed the faltering Merritt. Closing the gap over the final few miles, she came within 42 seconds at the finish, chopping over five minutes from teammate Judy Leydig's NorCal record with a blistering 2:45:34... that averages out to 6:19 per mile! What was more amazing was the fact that she took nearly ten minutes from her own PR in the process. Her 36:30 for 10K a few weeks earlier was an indication of her capabilities, but even she probably didn't expect anything quite this fast. Candy Hearn of Carmichael also ran amazingly well, finishing sixth in 2:52:35 (but the results in the paper also list her as finishing 42nd in 3:05:55...and we have had no verification of either. Can someone tell us if she did indeed run the former time?). Joan Ullyot added another sub-3 hour effort (2:58:43) to her list in 24th slot, and Elaine Miller dropped her PR way down to 3:03:27. Top Bay Area men to finish were Jim Bowles, whose 2:19:57 fell just short of his PR of 2:19:25, set here three years ago. The biggest sur-

prise among the men was Berkeley's Tim Niekewich who ran a PR 2:20:23...his name isn't even familiar to us, so we don't know what his old PR was, or any other of his credentials. Anyone out there know? Another big story was Fritz Mueller's 2:20:47 American masters record in 38th place. Not too shabby either was the 2:25:23 of Ken Mueller (no relation), who was second in the over-40 crowd (gives us young guys some hope!). Since the newspapers and every other running magazine around the country has printed the top finishers, we'll dispense with that and simply list our local troops (the ones that we've been able to spot in the preliminary results). RECORDS TUMBLE AT LIVERMORE MARATHON (Dec. 10, Livermore): - Running virtually a solo effort and finishing as if he could have run several minutes faster, 32-year-old Fritz Watson lowered his PR by almost four minutes to completely destroy the old course record of 2:26:31, set by Adam Ferreira, set the previous year. His 2:21:00 clocking was over two miles ahead of second-place finisher, Dennis Rinde, who also had a PR (we think). Meanwhile, back in 15th place, Ulrich Kaempf was taking aim at Jim Simpson's 1975 masters standard of 2:46:42. The 46-year-old runner who competes for the Tax Reducers AC was easily under that with a swift 2:45:13. Two 47-year-olds followed: Gordon Gane at 2:51:55 and Jim Nicholson at 2:52:26. Vicky Bray's 2:53:14 mark from the previous year wasn't even approached, as masters competitor, Ruth Anderson, clocked a slow (for her) 3:14:32. Caron Schaumberg was almost two minutes back in second place with her 3:17:28. A large field of 379 finishers made this one of the most successful local marathons locally in terms of numbers. Sixty of those finishers made it in under three hours and 205 dipped under 3:30, including six women. 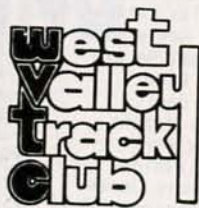

BARKER, LATIMER AND CRAY GRAB BIG VICTORIES AT BIDWELL CLASSIC (March 4, Chico): - West Valley TC's Jim Barker captured his first PA-AAU victory in the Marathon Championships here with more than a six-minute victory over teammate Jim Bowles. His 2:30:27 was just shy of the 2:30 mark but was good enough to easily break Pat Buzbee's 1977 standard of 2:36:52. Doug Latimer, who turned 40 last December, made his mark as a class masters marathoner with a 2:43:25 win, almost two miles ahead of second placer, Harry Daniell of Redding. Likewise, the first woman finisher, Merrill Cray of Chico, scored a PR 3:01:38 in breaking her own 3:09:31 course record. Candy Hearn of Carmichael was second at 3:11:46. In an extremely tight team battle, the sponsoring Chico Running Club just edged WVTC's crew by 19 seconds (total team time) with an 8:21:11. The SWEAT masters squad ran away with the masters team title in 9:28:09, upending the Pamakids by almost 8 minutes per man. There were no complete women's teams! There were two shorter races held concurrently with the marathon, with the half-marathon running into some troubles when a policeman misdirected runners at the halfway point...about 20 runners were affected, but the winner, Wayne Badgley, scored an honest victory with his 1:07:12, while the women's title went to Cindy Claiborne, 17, of Chico, in 1:26:07. Much of the problem was caused when heavy rains the night before washed out many markings and areas had to be re-measured and marked on race morning. In the shortest race, a 3-miler, Lee Ferrero of Weed had a solo effort 14:52.8, well off Randy Sturgeon's 14:25 of 1977. Jim Bevins of Susanville (16:14) & Kathy Sullivan (18:38) won their divisions. /Schafex/

NIMITZ MINI-MARATHON (May 27, Treasure Island): - /By Len Wallach/ "If Admiral Chester Nimitz was still alive today, he would have had a few blistered words to lay on his troops, who ran his memorial "Mini-Marathon", a 10-kilometer

trip around portions of Treasure Island and its sister, Yerba Buena. The race, which was run around the perimeter and up the tough hill of the US Naval Base, drew a huge crowd who enjoyed the antics of the Navy band, whose member's hair was just a bit long for military regulations but seemed to improve their music. The race instructions were delivered by a bemedaled marine captain who fired a tiny chrome-plated 22-calibre pistol, which was lost in his huge hand like a compact in the paws of a fat lady at the circus. The Marines showed up elsewhere, complete with packs, boots, and unit flags, revealing some underlying competition to be forthcoming between the small squads of burr-headed riflemen. One Marine officer even showed up in a flack jacket and a hiking staff, possibly prepared to reject the bullets of any potential angry running civilians which he couldn't beat off with his seven-foot stick. The race was a sleeper, as the Yerba Buena hill lies in waiting to clobber the unsuspecting, including the U.S. Marine Corps, which tackled its slopes in style, and in at least one or two cases, disastrously. At the foot of the Yerba Buena climb, as it leaves Treasure Island, one squad of Marines suffered the revenge of the Costanoan Indians, who left the island to the Spanish and seagulls some 200 years ago. This spot comes at about the four-mile mark, and with the combination of distance and heavy boots, the hill extracted the last full measure of devotion by members of the Corps (see photo below). Regardless of the battle with the terrain, all of the Marines finished, and the Captain with the flack jacket and stick didn't have to beat off any civilian admirers or potential enlistees. 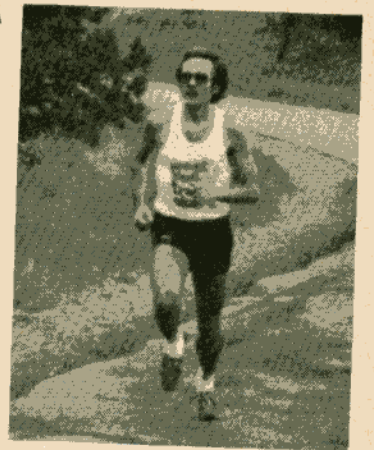

MAXWELL CRUSHES PINOCCI, BREAKS COURSE RECORD AT ANGEL ISLAND (May 6, Angel Island): - Using this run as a 'tuneup' for his crack at the Canadian "National Capital Marathon" in Ottawa the following weekend (Trials for Commonwealth Games), Berkeley's Brian Maxwell ran to a very impressive victory over speedster Mike Pinocci, leaving his younger competitor some 31 seconds back. In the process, Maxwell clipped some 33 seconds from his 1977 course standard, dragging Pinocci under the old mark as well. (Note: Brian won a narrow victory at the Marathon...less than a second, and took a spot on the Canadian team for the Commonwealth Games in Edmonton this August.) We don't know who was really in third spot...he's listed as "C. Lenechi", and is no doubt one of the "Aggie RC crazies" who ran as a 'centipede' in the Bay to Breakers (all had last names of Lenechi in the results, thus hiding their true identity). His time was 24:31 (can someone tell us who he was?). There were two starts this year, with the women and masters taking off in the second race (also, some runners were late for the open race because of the ferry service, ran the second race anyway, and are integrated into the first race times below). Fast-improving Judy Fox (28:51) upended Elaine Miller (29:15) in the women's division, while her daughter, Joan, grabbed third spot in 29:35. Ralph Bowles' 26:01 took a 10-second victory over B. Montgomery (results only had first initials and we're not familiar with this runner...is he front out of the area?) winning the over-40 division, while Bruce Carradine was a well-beaten third at 27:30. Judy and Chuck Fox easily captured the husband/wife trophy with a fine 56:01 total. The next team was over eight minutes back. The total number of runners this year was 1218, down from the 1398 of last year (but it wasn't in the scheduling booklet this year either)...4.8 Miles. /Guardsmen/

AUSSIE RUNS MUCH DISPUTED "COURSE RECORD" AT BAY-TO-BREAKERS (May 14, San Francisco): - This year's edition of the world-famous S.F. Examiner Bay-to-Breakers "cross-city" race (7.6 miles) started at the gun for the first time in several years, thanks to the efficient control supplied by the sponsors and several other groups, including College of San Mateo. Although the chanting crowd several times came close to 'breaking', the start was remarkably more orderly than in previous years. However, many top runners, including Aussie winner, Gerard Barrett, were up the street at various distances when the gun sounded, either out of paranoia or wisdom, knowing the 'usual' stampede start would hinder their starting efforts greatly. As it was, Barrett knocked an incomprehensible 1:46 from Olympian Paul Geis' 37:03 standard set last year, which makes one wonder just where he did start. But as is the case with this race, many of the top finishers similarly got either intentional or unintentional headstarts, and so comparison of times and places is not really valid, although we are listing some of the top runners (as listed in the Examiner) on the next page. It's obvious that several of those in the top 50 should not have been anywhere close to the top, and one wonders if those runners actually ran or just gave their numbers to someone else. But if one forgets about these matters and treats the race(?) as just a happening, it was certainly enjoyable. Skip Swannack was a two-second victor over Deena Wallace in 47:00 to take the top woman's spot. Some 12,000+ runners did it this year...see the Examiner for more lengthy writeups. /S.F. PAUL REESE IN RUNAWAY VICTORY AT MT. MISERY HANDICAP (June 3, Placerville): - Taking full advantage of his 15-minute headstart, veteran Paul Reese, now 60 years old, clocked 41:24.2 (handicap time) to win this gruelling race by more than four minutes. The next finisher, Bryan Holmes, himself taking a 5-minute headstart, was timed in 45:35 (handicap time). The first scratch runner, Mike Emry of UC Davis, was close behind at 45:56. Jim Bowles of Sacramento, in fourth place, was second in the scratch division at 47:58. As the times indicate, this 6.1-mile course is ROUGH!! The handicap system was assigned to various age-groups as follows: scratch group--11th & 12th grades & open; 5-minutes--9th & 10th grades & 40-49 & ladies open; 10-minutes--ladies 40 & over and 50-59; 15-minutes--60 & over and 8th grade & under. Sharon Jarrett was the first female finisher, clocking a handicap time of 58:32, but Joanne Schooner's 59:46 in the ladies open division was the fastest actual time at 64:46. This year there was a larger than normal turnout (101 finishers) for this "masochists' delight". HARMS' FINISH BEATS CARY AT Y-TO-Y RUN (June 24, Pinole): - Surprised that anyone was still with him at about the four mile point, ex-UC Davis ace, Peanut Harms put on a strong stretch drive over the last mile that put 12 seconds between him and Vic Cary to capture the Y-to-Y Run at Pinole, clocking 25:38 over the 5.3 mile course, which averages out to a quick 4:50 per mile. In the masters division, Kent Guthrie ran a solo effort of 27:33 (eighth overall) to easily defeat Dennis Teeguarden's 30:29. Other divisional records were set by: Frank Krebs (30-39) 32:17; Chris Hamer (17-19) 31:09; Harold Kuphalt (13-14) 34:27; Sally Edwards (30-39) 39:47; and Alisa Fong (12/Under) 49:13. The Heineken Harriers' 52 points took the team title away from the Buffalo Chips and WVTC (both got 121 points in second). MAXWELL NIPS MORENO, KAEMPF RIPS MASTERS FIELD, LEYDIG TOPS PERKINS--PA 15KM (July 2, Los Altos Hills): - Canadian Brian Maxwell had a battle on his hands in the highly competitive District 15-kilometer championships. He nipped Camino West's fast-improving John Moreno by a mere 4 seconds in a closing sprint, 47:00 to 47:04. PALLADINO, KAEMPF & PETERSEN SMASH RECORDS AT SAN FRANCISCO MARATHON (July 9, San Francisco): - While teammate John Moreno was cleaning up at Felton, Camino West's Steve Palladino was doing the same at the second running of this race, which this year had a whopping 2281 finishers. Steve's 2:21:15 chopped a big 3:44 from Athol Barton's 1977 record and was just over a minute ahead of Mark Sisson's PR 2:22:17. Vic Cary, in third, running his first marathon, closed fast over the waning miles and was also under the old standard in 2:22:44. Last year's champ, Barton, was running in second behind Palladino at about 20 miles when he was hit with leg troubles and had to retire. The increased depth in this year's event was evident, as 12 broke 2:30 (compared to only 4 last year). Weather was generally perfect except for a pesky headwind for a few miles along the Great Hiway... (more on page 38)

(S.F. Marathon, cont'd)...The women were led by the sterling performance of Sue Petersen's (Senior TC of Los Angeles) course record 2:50:14, which was a PR and knocked 3:06 from Tina Anex's 1977 mark. Judy Leydig followed in a fine 2:53:42, running conservatively for a hard workout but not overextending herself. Surprise third-place finisher, Carol Young, scored a big PR of 2:54:15, as both she and Judy got their airfare paid to the National AAU Marathon in New York City by the PA-AAU Long Distance Running Committee. Penny DeMoss' 2:55:25, also a less than maximal effort, was the only other time under three hours. The West Valley men and women garnered team honors with 32 points (5 men) and 784 points, respectively. Irene Rudolf completed the trio of WUTC women with a PR 3:05:06. Ulrich Kaempf defended his title from last year and brought the masters record down to a quick 2:35:42 (over 7 minutes better than in 1977), good enough for 29th overall in a very classy field. Ralph Bowles' 2:39:25 (PR) and Ross Smith's 2:41:09 (at age 50) were also under the old standard. Lyn Levy of the Sun Valley Striders (Idaho?) ran away from the competition to annex the masters women's title in a quick 3:08:09, some 11 minutes faster than Ruth Anderson's course mark. Today Ruth had to settle for third, as Michele Gauthier's 3:18:48 was 3 seconds faster, as all three were faster than the previous mark. In all, times were very quick on a course that is not rated as fast. The entire course was blocked to traffic, but many runners further back in the pack met with depleted aid-stations and a long wait at the finishline. /Jon Mohr/

HILL SMASHES TOP-OF-STATE 7-MILE RECORD (Aug. 19, Weed): - Ideal weather conditions and a record field of entries blessed the 3rd Annual Top-of-the-State Footraces as Leonard Hill of Phoenix, Oregon, and Paul Resignato of Chico, won the seven and four mile races respectively...114 runners competed. The high calibre of the field, as well as the ideal conditions, were evident, as 16 of the 24 age-division records were broken. Hill, a product of Oregon State University and a one-time participant in the US-USSR track meet, duelled briefly with Weed's Lee Ferrero, who also served as meet director. PINOCCI ECLIPSES HART RECORD AT DAMMIT RUN (Aug. 26, Los Gatos): - WVTC's Mike Pinocci, running virtually a solo race for most of the 5.6-mile loop in hilly West Los Gatos, clipped 2.6 seconds from the record set by Benton Hart the previous year. Mike Porter broke away from a good field that included Angel Martinez, Matt Yeo, Pete Flores, Bill Clark, and others, opening over a minute in the final 10K to cruise to an unpressed 1:19:25 win, well off the course record of 1:17:22 set by Jim Nuccio in last year's race. ROJAS DEFEATS CLASSY FIELD AT SCHLITZ 10K (Oct. 8, San Francisco): - The sponsoring Schlitz Beer Company flew Colorado TC's Ric Rojas down for this big race (1118 finishers), and he didn't disappoint anyone. After running with Brian Maxwell for much of the longer-than-advertised 10K race (6.374 miles to be exact), the altitude-trained ex-AAU cross-country champ turned on the afterburners and easily pulled away for the victory. His 30:13 was equivalent to a 29:27 for the correct distance. Debbie Heald came up from Los Angeles and proved too much for all the women and all but two masters men. Her 34:47 equates to a very quick 33:55 for 10K. Amazing Judy Fox, just about to turn 38, was a solid second place at 36:10, well ahead of 1977 AAU Marathon champ, Leal Reinhart (37:19). Darryl Beardall churned to a 33:33 clocking in turning back Jim O'Neil, who did 34:40, only one place in front of Heald, the women's champ. Marilyn Harbin, 41, was the women's over-40 champ at 43:10. She was only a bit less than 100 yards ahead of Marty Maricle (43:32) and Jeanie Jones (43:35) in a tight three-way battle for the divisional awards. For those running the course at about 6-minute pace, subtract about a minute to get your 10K time. /Don Capron/

SHAPIRO SETS RECORD AT SONOMA STATE MARATHON; WALL RETAINS OVERALL TITLE (Oct. 29, Rohnert Park): Rapidly improving Lucy Shapiro, finding renewed vigor now that she's in the masters division, dominated the women's field at the 4th and final "Wrong Turn" Marathon. Her 3:09:16 was not only a masters record by some 13 minutes, but also goes into the books as third fastest ever on the course by a woman. Only Penny DeMoss (3:02:00) and Peggy Lyman (3:06:12) have run faster. What was most amazing about today's effort was that the runners had to battle stiff winds over long sections of the course. Jeff Wall, last year's winner at 2:36:16, retained his title with a slight improvement to 2:35:24, running virtually by himself for the majority of the distance, as Philip Sanfilippo was nearly eight minutes back in the runnerup spot. Roger Price nipped Hans Roenau in a fairly close masters matchup, as the Santa Rosa airline pilot clocked 2:57:37, less than a minute in front of the over-50 divisional winner. Mari Kolb made it a 1-2 sweep for WVTC in the female competition, as she won the 'open' division in 3:24:17, just ahead of Frances Sackerman's 3:25:34, who was runnerup to Shapiro in the 40-and-over race. Only 131 managed to complete the race today, as the inclement weather discouraged a high percentage of the starting lineup. We hope that the athletes who've competed over the years in this marathon will take time to drop a note of thanks to the meet director...guess he figured it was just time to 'phase out'. Anyone else who's been a racedirector in a marathon can sympathize. /Bob Lynde/
