

End of Russell Era For CIF

Sadly, today's State Meet marks the end of the Bill Russell era.

For the past 26 years, CIF athletes, officials and coaches have known William Wilson Russell as THEIR commissioner.

The retirement of Russell — effective July 1 — concludes 26 years of memorable service as head of the largest high school athletic system in the United States.

As Commissioner since 1954, Russell has designed, organized, cajoled, directed and motivated CIF athletics into the streamlined, smooth-functioning system that it is.

In case you weren't aware, California high school athletics is the model for the rest of the country.

In his own quiet, efficient way, Russell got things done — always.

Here are a few of his achievements during the Bill Russell era:

Served on numerous National Federation of State High School Association Committees. He has been an advisory member to the voting representatives on the National Football Committee since 1954, and a member of the Executive Committee of the National Federation between 1973 and 1976.

Russell earlier this year was honored by the National Federation for 26 years of service on its Track & Field Rules Committee, and for 22 years as Committee Chairman. He was the first president of the U.S. Track & Field Committee when it was formed in 1962.

Santa Barbara is where Russell has his roots. He grew up there and will continue to reside there following his retirement. He is a graduate of Santa Barbara High School and Santa Barbara State College (now UCSB), where he captained the 1940 conference championship basketball team. He also competed

in baseball. Russell since has been inducted into UCSB's Hall of Fame.

Following military service during World War II and a member of UCSB's Graduate Department, Russell started his employment with the CIF in February, 1950 as a second commissioner for the Southern Section. He served in that capacity until his appointment to the State CIF post in 1954.

Through Russell's guidance, the State girls' athletic program blossomed into one of the best and largest in the U.S.

Russell organized the first committee meeting in 1973 to get girls' sports into the interscholastic competitive arena. That led to many more committee meetings from which emerged the Division of Girls' and Women's Sports.

Bill Russell undoubtedly will relish his retirement, but, as he put it, "My heart will always be with the CIF."

Tom Byrnes New CIF "Commish"

With his extensive background, Thomas E. Byrnes shouldn't miss a stride when he succeeds William W. Russell as Commissioner of the California Interscholastic Federation.

The new commissioner has served as commissioner of the Southern Section since 1974.

Byrne's potpourri of experience has spanned athletics, administration, teacher and military service.

As a coach, he was successful in football, baseball and swimming at three Southern California high schools: Moorpark, Valencia and El Dorado. He was athletic director and physical education chairman at El Dorado, then served as administrative assistant in the Southern Section office prior to being named commissioner.


His affiliation with a variety of other organizations reads like a who's who, and one wonders when Byrnes had time to make so many meetings.

The list is somewhat elongated, but some of the organizations are worth mentioning: President of the Orange County Chapter of the California Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation, and State vice-president for the same organization; a pioneer and former president of the Orange County Athletic Directors, and a member of the State Athletic Directors Association: member and Board of Directors of the California Tennis Association: member of the planning committee of the Watts Summer Games; member, California Coaches Association; Southern California Football Coaches Association; California Activity Directors Association; International Lions Club; and the National Junior Chamber of Commerce.


A native of Nebraska, Byrnes graduated from Eagle Rock High School, then received his B.A. in physical education in 1959 from Occidental College. At Eagle Rock and Oxy he was an outstanding athlete in football and baseball.

Byrnes later continued his education at California State University at Los Angeles and at Chapman College where he earned an M.A. in educational administration and a secondary administrative credential.

He went on to become a high school teacher and coach for 15 years. He taught history, geography and physiology, as well as coached football, baseball and swimming.

State Meet Architects

Since last year, prior to the 1979 State Meet in Sacramento, two men were already planning for the 1980 classic in Berkeley.

Dale Berven and Norm Guest of Castro Valley High are this year's meet directors. They have been planning, designing, directing and anticipating the 1980 event. Each has an outstanding background to qualify for the arduous, painstaking job of organizing and staging the most prestigious high school track meet in the world.

DALE BERVEN: Presently the physical education chairman at Castro Valley, Dale has directed the CIF Wrestling Championships in 1975, was on the North Coast Section track management committee the last four years; and is an NCS field representative.

A graduate of San Leandro High ('48) where he played varsity football and basketball for two years, Dale attended San Francisco State until 1950, then returned to earn an AB and MA in physical education in 1956.

From 1951 to 1955 his education was interrupted by the Korean conflict. Berven served as a Navy jet fighter

pilot, first on the carrier USS Phillipine Sea, then aboard the USS Hornet, patrolling the Formosan Straits.

He launched his coaching career at Castro Valley High in 1956, serving until 1962 when he left to become an assistant principal at nearby Foothill and Canyon high schools in the Hayward area.

After two years in administration, Dale returned to his first love: coaching. His 1962 Castro Valley wrestling team shared the NCS championship with Hayward. From 1973-74 he was head soccer coach and assisted in football, basketball, baseball and track.

Dale and his wife Joanne have four children: David, 17; Matt, 15; Beth, 13, and Susie, 10.

NORMAN GUEST: If there's one word that best describes Norm, it's probably "organizer".


Last year he was selected the North Coast Section Boys' Honor Track Coach. He was the primary organizer for the development of the NCS track committee which assumed the management of the NCS track meet in 1976.

Since 1973, Guest has been director of athletes for both boys' and girls' sports at Castro Valley. It was Guest who originated and directed the Castro Valley Invitational Track Meet between 1964 and 1975, as well as the Hayward Area Invitational Cross Country Meet from 1975 to 1978.


A San Lorenzo High graduate where he was a three-year varsity letterman in football and track, Norm later attended San Jose State where he participated in the track program as a high hurdler under Coach Bud Winters. He graduated in 1958, received his teaching credentials in 1959, and began teaching at Castro Valley High in 1960. In 1972 Guest returned to San Jose State to complete his master's degree in physical education.

Norm and his wife Barbara have five daughters.

CIF SECTION MEN'S HONOR COACHES



CAMERON OSTRAND, Reedley High, Central Section. Came to Reedley in 1958 after earning his masters from the University of Colorado and from coaching one year at Centralia JC (Wash.). At Reedley he has coached track and field cross country, football; was teacher-nead of the P.E. Dept. and athletic director. His varsity track teams have won several Central Section titles, while his cross country teams have won two CIF championships. This past year Ostrand, at his own request, was assigned to Kings Canyon High in the Reedley District as principal. He made the request to spend more time with his family and daughter Sheri, an outstanding athlete at Reedley who won a volleyball scholarship to Utah State this year.

CHUCK SHELEY, Chico High, Northern Section. As varsity coach the past eight years, his teams have won six consecutive league and five Northern Section championships. During that span his teams have been an awesome force in the area, stringing together an 82-3 dual meet record. His girls and boys cross country teams have captured eight league and seven section titles while compiling a 95-14 dual record. His 1977 girls team was rated No. 2 in the nation by Harrier Magazine.





AVIS KELLEY, Gilroy High, Central Coast Section. Over a 13-year coaching career at Gilroy, Kelley's varsity track teams have compiled a record of 70 wins, 11 losses and a tie in league dual meets, including six championships. Kelley's frosh-soph teams have won nine league titles, including the last eight consecutive, and have posted an enviable record of 76-6-1, including a string of 57 straight dual wins. Kelley has also been the guiding light of the annual Gilroy Invitational Meet.

JACK WALKER, Oakdale High, Sac-Joaquin Section. Since arriving at Oakdale, Walker has transformed the track teams into winning machines. Under Walker since 1954, Oakdale has won 17 league varsity championships and racked up a dual record of 149-10. Walker was born in Richmond and is a graduate of UC Berkeley ('50) following service in the South Pacific in World War II. He launched his coaching career in 1951 at Esparto High before moving on to Oakdale.





BLAINE CROWTHER, EI Camino Real High, Los Angeles City. Although now an assistant, Crowther's influence on young men has been significant in the L.A. area. After finishing out his 32nd year in coaching, Crowther is retiring. But his legacy will live on with the many young men he has coached and helped through life. He arrived in Los Angeles in 1948 after graduating from the University of Utah. He first taught at Luther Burbank Junior High for a year before becoming head basketball and track coach at Roosevelt High until 1968. Among his track stars were Willie Davis (BJ), who later starred in baseball with the Dodgers, and Mike Garrett, of USC and pro football fame. He developed two outstanding high jumpers in the past six years, Rob Olson, who set the present City record in 1977 at 7-1, and Kenny Thompson, who in 1974 sailed over 6-10.

ELMER RUNGE, Patrick Henry High, San Diego Section. When it comes time for the league track meet in San Diego, you can figure that Henry will be among the top finishers, as well as its athletes. Since arriving at Henry, Runge has converted the school into a track power. In 11 seasons, the Patriots have won the league championship eight times, and runnersup in the section twice. Runge holds an 80 percent winning record in 11 years. Among his standout performers were sprinters David Russell, 1977 State champ with bests of 9.4 and 20.7, and Kipper Bell (9.5, 21.0); halfmiler Paul Becklund (1:52.2) and distance ace Thom Hunt (4:06.6/8:45.2).



JOHN NULES, EI Cerrito High, North Coast Section. In his 20th year as high school coach, Nules holds the respect of every coach in the Bay Area for his work with young people and in directing track events. As head track coach the past three years, Nules' teams have won 27 dual meets while losing only three. His boys teams are undefeated in league dual meets, and his 1977 girls team were North Coast Section 4A champions. His boys 440 relay team were State champions in 1978. He was director for the 1976 State Meet, and director of the Hale Roach Relays the past four years.


PAUL HENDRICKSON, Indio High, Southern Section. Under Hendrickson's guidance, Indio's track teams have won outright or tied for the league title the last 14 consecutive years. During one stretch, from 1967 through 1976, his teams won 50 straight league dual meets. In 16 years at Indio, his teams posted a dual record of 144-10-2. He graduated from Compton High and then served four years in the Navy. He received his degree from New Mexico Highlands. Among his most famous athletes were Ed White, now with the San Diego Chargers, and Mike Harris, whose 13.6 in 1974 led the nation's prep hurdlers.





STATE TRACK GIRLS HAVE COME A LONG WAY

Girls track and field in California has come a long way, baby.

There was a time when it wasn't considered "the thing" to do. In fact, Linda Sawyer, girls track coach at Las Lomas High of Walnut Creek, recalled with amusement about one of her early competitors, Mary Reiboldt, who ran the 880 and mile.

"Mary came out her freshman year and enjoyed running. But in her sophomore year, her parents wouldn't allow her to come out for track. They said it wasn't 'very lady-like'."

Well, just look around Edwards Stadium today.

You'll find many girls "lady-like." Not only are a good number of the girls pretty, cute, attractive or foxy, but they're ALL great competitors. They got here through sheer hard work, dedication and plenty of sacrifice, just like the boys.

"Sports definitely has not interfered with the girls' so-called femininity," Linda insists. "They still worry about their hair, how they look, dating and becoming cheer leaders. In fact, sports has given the girls more self-confidence. They're more outgoing in their personal and social life."

If you're wondering whether the track girls date the track boys, the answer is: "You bet," according to Linda. "As an example, we have six or seven of our girls dating boys on the track team."

So, if you've worried about the girls ignoring their femininity after turning to sports, don't.

The girls competing in track and other sports are in great shape, folks.

Linda started coaching girls track back in 1971, when hardly any high school in California had a girls team.

"A few girls came to me and asked if we could form a track team," Linda said. "All we had in those days was the GAA (Girls Athletic Association) for intramurals. We finally got enough girls to compete in the 100, 220 and 440 relay. We had one meet that year, against Acalanes. But the seed was sown.

"The next year we competed against a few other schools, including Berkeley. In 1973, aside from a few

meets, the only major events the girls could look forward to were the Amador and Washington of San Francisco relays

"By 1974, leagues were formed: The Foothill, East Bay and Diablo Valley Athletic Leagues. Leagues also were being organized throughout the state. Prior to that, in 1973, we had formed a Contra Costa Sports Association that included girls teams from the Walnut Creek, Diablo Valley and San Ramon areas, plus teams from Piedmont and Berkeley, to compete on an interscholastic level.

The year 1974 is an epochal one for girls track in California. Plans were formulated by the CIF to include a program for the girls right alongside the boys in the State Meet. "The plan to include girls in the state meet was encouraged and implemented by Commissioner Russell," Linda said. There was some opposition, but Mr. Russell really carried the ball for us.

"Only one entrant from each section qualified per event, which meant we didn't have trials. We threw the discus, but it was only an exhibition event. Now it's a regular part of the program. The next year the same formula as the boys was adopted, which meant the same number of girls qualified in each event which required trails to qualify for the finals."

As an indication of how the girls' program has expanded, 11 events were included in that inaugural state meet in Bakersfield. Today there are 13 girls events compared to 16 for the boys. The only events the girls don't compete are the triple jump, pole vault and 330-yard (300 meter) hurdles. Don't be surprised if those events for girls aren't included in the near future.

Another interesting note about the first state meet for girls: Not a single record set in 1974 has survived. In fact, of the 13 girls events, 10 of the records were recorded since 1978.

Which indicates that the girls are just warming up to this record-breaking routine.

Coach Sawyer agrees.

"The marks are really starting to drop. I believe you can attribute this to more girls competing, better coaching, girls working harder, which all adds up to stronger competition.

"I can remember when girls weren't allowed to run in more than one event after 880 yards. Now, the girls can double in the mile and 2-mile, and even run a leg of the mile relay."

Coach Sawyer sees dramatic improvements in the 2-mile, hurdles, long jump, high jump, shot put and discus this year. She credits Cheri Williams of Livermore High with recording perhaps the most dramatic record of all, her 10:17.71 2-mile set in 1978. "That record probably will hold up for some time to come," Linda said. "But I foresee a lot of girls running in the low 11-minute range, and some under 10 minutes. Cheri's time was just exceptional. It will be broken, but I don't see it happening for another year or two."

Because the running events are in meters, all winning times automatically become records, so Coach Sawyer can't very well forecast records. But she did volunteer her thoughts about the field events. (Marks in parentheses represent existing state record):

HIGH JUMP (5-101/4)—With good weather, the winner or winners will clear 6 feet.

LONG JUMP (20-01/4)—Should hold up for at least another year.

SHOT PUT (49-61/2)—Definitely will go. Watch for a winning throw of over

DISCUS (167-1) — Doesn't stand chance.

A DECADE OF THRILLS, CRISP CO

The Sizzling Seventies

Quite apropos, the decade of the '70s started with the State Meet staged right here at Edwards Stadium.

That was the year a Northern California team (Los Altos High) fittingly dominated the meet — and what a meet it was. With 13,000 fans looking on, a skinny, bespectacled kid named Rick Brown led Los Altos to the team title while a total of one national and three State records were shattered.

Los Altos' Chris Adams broke his own national discus record with a 20-3 whip. Earlier in the year he set the national mark of 201 feet even. That 201-3 still stands as the State standard.

State records set that day included: Two Miles, 8:55.6, Ron Johnson, West Torrance; High Jump, 7-01/4, Jerry Culp, Oceanside, and 440 Relay, 41.4, Santa Ana.

But the big story was Brown. He performed a phenomenal triple: winning the 440 in 47.8; the 880 in 1:50.6, and anchored the victorious mile relay team in 3:15.6 with a 47-flat leg. By entering three events Brown, who later starred at UC Berkeley, competed in six races over the two-day haul, and wound up with 12 of his team's 29 points.

1971 (UCLA STADIUM)—One of the finest assembly of California preps tore up the Westwood track with six meet records in one of the most thrilling meets ever held. The record assault was led by the loquacious Dwight Stones of Glendale who upped the high jump standard to 7-1½, breaking the national record (7-1¼) enroute. Stone, of course, went on to set a world record, since broken.

The other records that toppled that day: 120 HH, 13.6, Charles Jackson, Lompoc; Two Miles, 8:53.8, Dale Fleet, San Diego Clairemont; Shot Put, 67-21/4, Mark Stevens, Newport Harbor; 440 Relay, 41.1, El Cerrito; and Mile Relay, 3:13.2, Castlemont.

Lompoc, with Jackson accounting for all the points, won the team title with 13 points. Jackson also won the 180 lows in 18.5 (wind), and placed fifth in the long jump.

1972 (OROVILLE)—This meet featured an array of brilliant middle distant and distant runners, led by Mark Schilling of Garden Grove, Curtis Beck of Santa Monica; Terry Cotton of El Cajon; Dave Taylor of Merced; Dale Scott of El Cerrito; James Robinson of McClymonds; and Tom Kovacich of Buena Park.

Two meet records were broken and a third tied.

Beck broke the two-mile record in 8.52.3, clipping off a 61.5 final lap to nip Merced's Taylor, who clocked 8:53.5. It was such a competitive field that Gordon Innes of Upland, runnerup in 1971, finished seventh!

Schilling lowered the mile standard to 4:05.4, which still stands. But Cotton was credited with pushing Schilling with a 4:05.5, also under the old mark of 4:07 set by Tim Danielson of Chula Vista in 1966

Another thrilling race was the halfmile in which two-tenth seconds separated runnerup Robinson (1:51.5) and third-placer Kovacich (1:51.6). Scott, who later starred at Oregon State, won in 1:49.7.

Perhaps the outstanding individual performance was turned in by Carl McCullough of Sacramento who led his team to the title, racking up 16 of the 18 points. McCullough, later a star running back at USC, won the 100 (9.5), long jump (24-7), was second in the 220 (21.2) and anchored the 440 relay team to fourth place.

Dan Jones of Palo Verde Valley tied Charlie Jackson's high hurdle record of 13.6 for another sparkler that day.

1973 (WOODLAND)—Stiff competition in nearly every event prevailed as the sprinters sparkled.

A sophomore, Elijah Jefferson of San Diego's Crawford, won the 100, followed by Clancy Edwards (later of USC) of Santa Ana, and Ray Clark of Ells, all timed in 9.6. Edwards won the 220 in 21.2, while Millard Hampton of Silver Creek was runnerup in 21.5. Competition was so stiff that Albany's Mike Shaver, the defending 100 champion and runnerup in the 220 in 1972, failed to place in either event.

Another failure saw defending twomile champion Curtis Beck relegated to fourth place in 9:02.8. Terry Williams of Lompoc won it in 8:54.81 almost three seconds under Beck's state record.

Three meet records were eclipsed: Pole Vault, 16-2¾, Tim Curran, Crespi of Encino; Shot Put, 67-3¼, Jim Neidhart, Newport Harbor; 440 Relay, 41-flat, SF Wilson. Tom Andrews of West Bakersfield tied the high hurdle mark of 13.6, and the triple jump was added to the schedule for the first time since 1939. Willie Banks of Oceanside added five feet to the record, stretching 49-1 to better the old mark of 44-8½ set by Jack Laughner of Long Beach Wilson in 1939.

San Francisco's Wilson High won the team title with 20 points.

1974 (BAKERSFIELD) — Welcome, girls, to the State Meet family. Naturally, all winners established records, but, quite surprisingly, seven were national records.

Berkeley's relay teams set two of them, 47.5 in the 440 and 1:46.4 in the 880 medley. Veronica Venezia of Terra Linda did 56.4 in the 440; Kathy Costello of Pleasant Hill, 2:10.4 in the 880: Jill Caldwell of Westminister, 5:02.2 in the mile; Pam Blackburn of Palo Alto's Cubberley, 5-8 in the high jump; and Jodi Anderson of LA Washington, 19-7 in the long jump. Of the four other events (there were 11 events compared to 15 today), Janice Wiser of La Jolla was the only individual double winner, 10.8 in the 100 and 24.2 in the 220: Yvonne Boone of Oakland's Fremont, 11.1 in the 80-yard hurdles, and Kathy Devine of San Diego Mission. 47-41/2 in the shot put.

Berkeley High won the first team title with 13 points, three more than runnerup La Jolla.

In the boys' meet, two meet records were shattered and one tied. Rich Kimball of Concord's DeLaSalle performed a spectacular double, breaking the two-mile record with an 8:46.5 after winning the mile in 4:06.6, one-tenth ahead of Sunny Hills' Andy Clifford. Willie Banks of Oceanside broke his own triple jump mark at 50-9, the first time anyone exceeded 50 feet, and Elijah Jefferson of SD Crawford tied the century record at 9.4 to successfully defend his title.

Pasadena's Muir, collecting three firsts, including a hurdling double from Fred Shaw (13.7 and 18.9), was the team champion with 23 points.

1975 (SAN DIEGO)—Dedy Cooper of Richmond's Ells and Elijah Jefferson (again!) of SD Crawford were the big newsmakers in the 57th State Meet.

Cooper, undefeated all season, wound up breaking a national and two state records and leading the Eagles to the team title (22 points), while Jefferson was aiming to become the first athlete in State Meet history to win three straight 100 yard dash titles. Alas, Jefferson failed by finishing second to Kevin Williams of San Fernando. Williams tied the 9.4 record while Jefferson timed 9.5.

Cooper, in his heat, shattered the State Meet 120-yard high hurdles record, lowering it from 13.5 to 13.2, which still holds up. It was also a national record until Renaldo Nehemiah dipped it to 12.9 in 1977.

MPETITION, RECORDS RAVAGED

Cooper christened a new event, the 330-yard low hurdles with a sizzling 36.2, also in the heats. That mark remains today.

Excitment ran high, naturally, for the hurdles and dash finals. Cooper's old nemesis, Robert Gaines of Richmond's Kennedy, who had never beaten Cooper, won the highs, with John Peterson of Saddleback third. All were timed in 13.3.

Eric Hulst of Laguna Beach bettered Kimball's two-mile record with a superlative 8:44.9, which still stands.

In the girls' meet, six meet records went by the boards and LA Washington swept to the team title with 22 points. Pleasant Hill's busy Kathy Costello easily was the outstanding athlete with a double that included state and national records in the 880 (2:09.2) and mile (4:53.5), both since broken.

Other national records were set by Jodi Anderson, LA Washington, 55.3 440; Yvonne Boone, Oakland's Fremont, 10.1 80-yard hurdles; and the LA Washington 880 medley relay team in 1:44.5.

Sandra Howard of Manual Arts set a state mark in the 100 with a 10.6, while Kim Maddox of Los Angeles upped the high jump to 5-8. Pam Blackburn of Cubberley, the defending high jump champion, failed to clear the qualifying height.

1976 (UC BERKELEY)—While the boys were checked with only one new meet record, the girls continued their record assault with four, though two events were new.

Added to the girls' program were the mile relay and discus. Kathy Middleton of Poway near San Diego had the distinction of becoming the first discus winner with a throw of 134-5, thus entering her name into the record books. The LA Fremont mile relay team of Adrienne Lair (57.9), Rebecca Trotter (61.2), Glenda Besheans (60.6) and Robbie Mitchell (56.2) won it in 3:55.9.

Marquita Belk of San Jose's Silver Creek clipped Jodi Anderson's one-year 440 mark by one-tenth second to 55.2, while Kari Grosswiller of Upland added two inches to the high jump standard by clearing 5-10. Berkeley's Freda Cobb, favored in both sprints, finished a hair-line second twice to Bell's Pam Waters, who won the 100 in 11.0 and the 220 in 24.8. Cobb's times were 11.0 and 24.9. However, Berkeley won the team title with 20 points.

Husky Steve Montgomery of Lassen was the boys' lone record-setter with a 68-foot toss in the shot put. Heavy winds prevented more records.

But the competition was fierce in nearly event. Only two of the four defending champions were able to repeat. Eric Hulst of Laguna Beach became only the third athlete in history to win back-to-back two miles by kicking home in 8:57.3.

1977 (UCLA)—This was the year the electronic timer was introduced into State Meet competition. It prevented one State record when James Sanford of Pasadena won his preliminary 220 heat in an electrically-timed 20.80, but was hand-timed in 20.7, which would have tied Mel Gray's record.

Two records were set: Dennis Smith. Santa Monica, 7-2 in the high jump. adding a half-inch to Dwight Stones' mark; Dokie Williams, Oceanside, 51-0½ in the triple jump, and Sanford, 46.6 to tie the 440 record. Sanford was the outstanding performer, placing second in the 220 (21.22), and anchoring Pasadena wins in the 440 (41.61) and mile (3:13.7) relays. Sanford also became the first State Meeter ever to place in both the 220 and 440. Jim Walters of Estancia ran the third fastest 880 in State Meet history: 1:49.4. Pasadena won the team crown with 26 points.

The girls continued their assault on Meet records as 10 of the 13 events failed to hold up. Two national marks were set: 2:08 halfmile by Ann Ragan of Camden, and the San Diego Crawford 440 relay team in 46.14.

The hurdles were extended from 80 to 110 yards. Julia Haynes started the heats with a 14.4 but by the time the finals came around, Kris Costello of Lynbrook won it in 13.97. Another new event was the two mile, won by Roxanne Bier of San Jose's Independence in 10:39.7. One point separated the top three teams. Locke of LA won the team title, edging North High of Bakersfield, 14-13, while Centennial was a close third with 12.

1978 (BAKERSFIELD)-Although four defending champions were back along with 17 athletes who scored more than 60 points in the 1977 meet, only two records were set, one a national. Bagging's sizzling mile relay team clocked a blazing 3:11.6 to clip two-tenths off the national mark. Banning's team consisted of Darryl Davis (49.3), Sam Caesar (48.1), Chris Blaylock (47.4) and Devin Lewis (46.8). In the other record, Anthony Curran of Crespi bettered the old pole vault standard of 16-234 set by his brother, Tim, in 1973 by soaring 17-01/2.

There were three double winners: Dokie Williams of El Camino won both jumps, the triple in 50-41/4 and the long in 25-11/4. He also placed fourth in the

100 in 10.01. Dave Porath of Atwater captured the weights, the shot at 65-10¾ and the discus at 199-5. Mike Sanford of Pasadena won both sprints in 9.85 and 21.42. Williams paced Oceanside's El Camino to the team title with 16 points, one more than Gardena and Pasadena, and two ahead of Banning.

The girls didn't let up on their record bombardment as 10 went by the boards, including a national. That was the 2:07.93 by defending champion Ann Regan of Camden. Livermore's Cheri Williams won an amazing double, the mile in 4:45.0 and the two-mile in 10:17.8. Kris Costello of San Jose's Lynbrook defended her 110 low hurdles crown by lowering her record to 13.83.

The team title went to San Jose's Hill with 16 points, four ahead of runnerup Livermore, all by Williams.

1979 (SACRAMENTO)—Only one CIF record went up and that by 1¼ inches Glendale's Lee Balkin added to the high jump. He increased the record from 7-2 to 7-3¼. Competition was so stiff that five leapers cleared 6-10 or better.

Tightest race of the day saw San Ramon's Jim Scannella and Long Beach Poly's Gary Lee charge stride-for-stride down 120 alley. The judges awarded Scannella the blue ribbon when his time was recorded at 13.870 to Lee's 13.875. But Lee turned the tables in the 330 lows, 36.215 to 37.01. In fact, Scannella just did edge Sacramento Johnson's Henry Andrade, who timed 37.2.

Pasadena made it two titles in three years with 16 points, thanks to Mike Sanford's 220 win (20.995) and runnerup in the 100 (9.655), and the 440 relay team's 41.450 victory. Locke was second with 12 points while San Ramon and LB Poly shared third with 10 points.

As usual, the girls exceeded the boys in the record-shattering department. They tacked up six State and three national marks.

State standards: 220, 23.535, Gwen Loud, LA Westchester; 440, 53.65, Shari Howard, San Gorgonio; Mile Relay, 3:44.055, San Gorgonio; Long Jump, 20-41/4, Gwen Loud, Westchester; Shot Put, 49-61/2, Susie Ray, Villa Park; Discus, 167-1, Leslie Deniz, Gridley. Howard in the 440, the mile relay, and Deniz in the discus established new national records with their efforts.

Westchester's 24 points captured the team title, edging San Gorgonio's 19 points. Loud also won the 100 in 10.615, edging Howard's 10.8.






