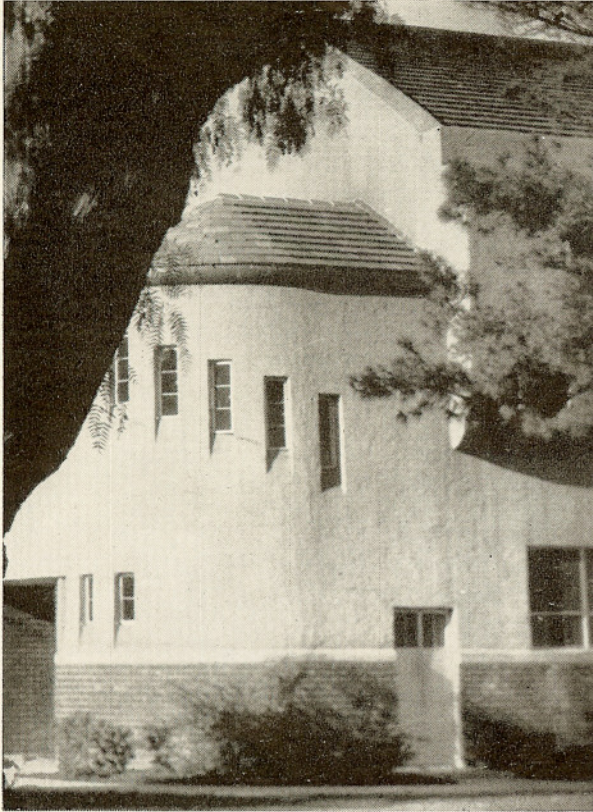

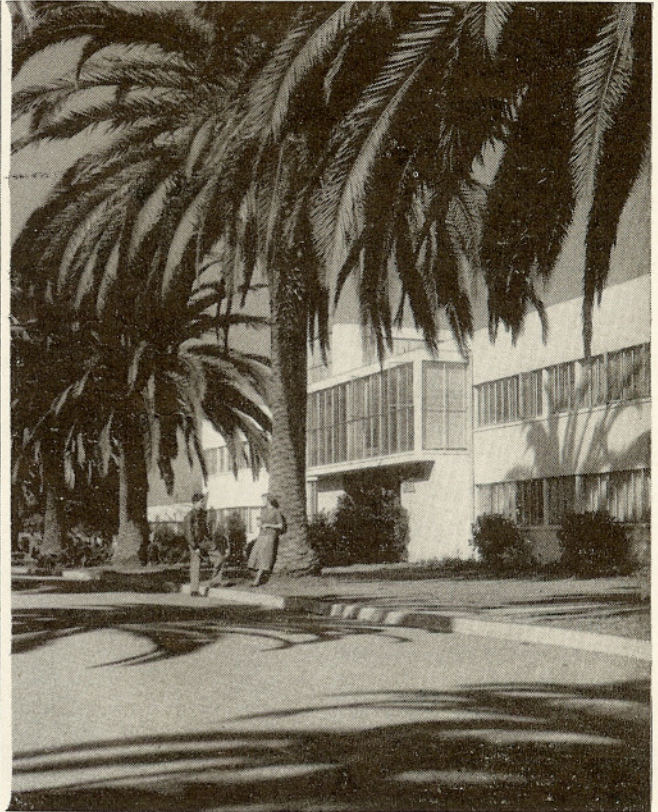

Unpredictable Waves

As this was being written, well in advance of tonight's shindig, it was hard telling just what to expect from the invading Waves.

The Pepperdiners seemed to have absorbed most of Coach Ray Richards' T tricks pretty well when they slammed Arizona State at Flagstaff, 33-7, in an opening affair. But the following week the Sun Devils from Tempe upheld Arizona honors by clipping the Waves, 33-13, at Inglewood.

In their home start, the Waves met a rough, tough club too early in the season. While the Sun Devils were in midseason form, the Waves weren't; and the Arizonans had Whizzer White, who personally made four touchdowns.

We don't want to lead you San Jose fans to believe your local hopefuls have a pushover tonight. They haven't. Most of these Pepperdine men are playing the T for the first time and it takes several games to acquire the proper techniques and polish. This will be their fourth game and we expect the Waves to give the Spartans quite a pounding. And Pepperdine could easily be on the long end of the score. They haven't forgotten the 61-6

blasting they received from San Jose last year and have been pointing for this game all season.

Pepperdine has plenty of lettermen — but the Waves don't go too deep on the line. And if you can't spring a man loose, you aren't going to hit pay dirt often enough to do much good.

We think the Waves will have that situation under control by tonight. There are several second stringers who may be first stringers before now! Jack Bighead, a reserve end, is one lad you San Joseans better watch tonight. He's big and rough and we look for him to displace a veteran end before long — if not by now.

And there are some subbacks who may be regulars by tonight — Mel Embree,

Clay Bieck, Dick Meltvedt and Elmer Noonan among others.

Watch out for Terrific Terry Bell and Battling Bobby Hayes, a couple of scatbacks who can make knots—if sprung loose.

If you like to watch line play, take a good peek at big Bo Williams, a center converted to guard. Then there's Marty Cook a rugged tackle. You'll find both of these guys all over the field.



The Waves Come Rolling In

This will be the second grid meeting between San Jose State and Pepperdine and neither is likely to forget the first.

It was last year and came after the Spartans had stumbled through three desultory games. The Wave team was splintered by internal troubles and the Spartans picked that night at Wrigley Field, Los Angeles, to find the right combination. They rolled over Pepperdine, 61-6.

Despite the score they found the Waves a tough, if disorganized opponent, with plenty of latent talent. Pepperdine remembers the score and will be out to even it up. If the Spartans think too much about that tally sheet they could learn to regret it.

Spartan fans can look for new polish at quarterback, if Gene Menges repeats his performance of a week ago. The T-man from Fullerton pitched three scoring strikes against Brigham Young last week and his ball handling sent the Rocky Mountain sports writers to the closet for extra adjectives.

Marv Johnson, Harry Russell, Al Cementina and Jack Donaldson also starred at Provo and could hit the lime-light again tonight.

As usual, the game will probably be decided up front and you can look for Co-Captains Harley Dow and Jack Faulk, Guard Dick Harding, Center Bob Cheim and Ends Junior Morgan, Billy Wilson and Mel Stein to pace Bob Bronzan's Spartan line.
