Women

Rankings Commentary: OVERALL - MEN Bellarmine - simply the best; set CCS team time course record (76:59); unbeaten among CCS schools; 25 seconds separated 1st to 5th man in CCS finals while taking 1-2-3-5-6 places; Div.1 Champions. Gunn- had the biggest come-through performance by improving 1:30 (80:06), their season best team time at Crystal in CCS finals; this team really came together at the end of the season; Division II Champions. Live Oak- was consistent and strong all season; they have all juniors & sophs on the team; had solid efforts in every big meet; this is their highest finish ever; Division I runner-up. St. Francis- had a tremendous effort at CCS finals with an improved :59 second team time at Crystal (81:01); had two under 15:50; was 4th in CCS overall last year with the same group; was not as consistent as Live Oak; Division II runner-up. Los Gatos- was always in the thick of things in every meet all season, placing well in invitationals and sectionals; heat winner in sub-section with a 81:52 season best; always fairly tough. Homestead- was a dominant factor two-thirds into the season (outside of Bellarmine) with 3 races under 82:00 team time at Crystal; ranked #2 most of the season; won 3 invitationals; had illness and injuries in the end; they return almost entire team for 88. Half Moon Bay- also very strong the first two-thirds of the season with Homestead; they have beaten everyone except Bellarmine & Homestead; had nothing left in CCS; too strong too early. Leigh- had two consistently under 16:00; had a good shot at making state while placing 3rd in Division II, but came up short; has a great tradition and is always solid; could be Coach Hotchkiss last year. Serra- had the talent from a year ago return (3rd overall in 1986), but never quite reached that form this year; had a solid four at the end of the season; ran a respectable 82:16 at sub-section. Lick- showed improvement the second half of the season; was a close 4th in Division II; placed well in a few invitationals; their top runner almost reached his form from last year. OVERALL - WOMEN Leland- it took them the whole season to catch Los Gatos, and did by winning Division I by 2 points; big improvement in the big meets, especially from their 5th girl; ran 97:35 season best at sub-section; won CCS two years in-a-row; works through early meets. Los Gatos- very strong all season with tremendous depth; won 3 invitationals; had 3 major injuries which had almost recovered in time; return 4 of top 7 next year; have been in top 2 in CCS the last 5 years while winning in 83-84-85; ran 98:06 at sub-section. Mitty- the most improved team in CCS of 1987; they tied Los Gatos in league; Division II Champion; had great team grouping; ran 99:12 in CCS finals; their best team in Mitty history; last 3 meets were solid. Willow Glen- Division II runner-up; upset Leland at their league meet; has good depth; beat Gunn on 6th girl rule at CCS finals in order to go to state; improved 1:32 seconds at Crystal. Gunn- had a close dual with Willow Glen at sub-section & CCS finals; almost was the only school that made state in boys & girls along with Los Gatos; came on strong at the end of the season; improved 2:10. Fremont- had the two runners up front, but really dropped off; had the whole team return from last year, however, only two kept running great and improving; won the 2-mile postal; top 2 is back in 88. Santa Teresa- showed much promise with the upfront 2 to 3 runners; didn't put it all together like they had hoped; ran their best team time at sub-section (100:46); return 6 of their 7 in 88. Watsonville- ran to a surprise 3rd in Division I with only a 102:42; winner of 2 invitationals south of Santa Cruz. Aptos- 4th in Division II; best of 103:03; return all 7 in 1988 like St. Fran. St. Francis- showed some signs of a solid team at times; 102:46 best. Mountain View- their 102:36 at a center meet was good; 6th in Div. II.
