** Visas will be issued to these Countries at the International Casablanca or Marrakesh Airport upon arrival and according to lists confirmed by the different delegations.

ARRIVAL IN MARRAKESH

Airport Welcome

Welcome desks will be operating at both Casablanca Mohamed V Airport and Marrakesh-Menera International Airport. The staff will provide the necessary information and assistance to all arriving delegations prior to accreditation and accommodation procedures.

To avoid tiring delay due to accreditation procedures, the athletes and team officials will be taken immediately to the accommodation centers. It is about a 10 minute drive from the Airport to the hotels.

Accreditation procedures

Only the Team Leaders will be taken to the Atlas Marrakech Hotel where the accreditation centre is located. Here the Team Leaders will be asked to complete the usual formalities before collecting the accreditation cards :

- ④ Payment of accommodation expenses for non quota athletes and officials
- ④ Photocopy of all athletes' passports
- ④ Athletes' final confirmation and declaration
- ④ Collection of welcome package and accreditation cards

TEAM ATTACHES

Team attaches trained for this purpose will be assigned to each delegation upon arrival at the Airport. These volunteers will assist every one in baggage claim, transportation, accreditation, accommodation and other matters relevant to the Championships.

INFORMATION TO TEAMS

An information desk will be available at each of the athletes' hotel will be open from 8h00 to 22h00 for the period of July 9 to 18. The staff will act as liaison between the Team Leaders and the Technical Delegates/ Competition Management and will be in charge of :

- ④ Distribution of Information
- ④ Answers to General Competition Questions
- ④ Receipt of Written Questions for the Technical Meeting
- ④ Final Confirmations
- ④ Distribution of Entry Lists, Start Lists and Results

Next to the information desk, there will be a display of all technical information on the notice board.

Technical Information Centre

During the competition days, the same above services will be available at Technical Information Centre at the Stadium, which will also be responsible for handling any protests.

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Phone Services

The telephone will not be automatically switched through to rooms in the hotels. Any athlete, official or team leader requiring the use of the room phone for outgoing calls must make arrangements at the hotel desk.

The phone will be made available upon the presentation of a valid credit card or cash to cover the charges.




Public phone booths are also available in the hotels.

Food Services

All meals will be served at the athletes' dining room of the hotels. Accreditation cards are essential to access to the restaurants. The teams are required to take their meals in the hotels where they are accommodated.

A variety of cuisines are available to fulfill cultural and religious differences of the participants. A buffet self service will be set up for meals as well as for juices and other drinks.

*** NB** : An exception will be made for the walking competitors only on the day of competition (Saturday July 16).

Lost Room keys

Any loss of the hotel room keys must be reported immediately to the information desk of the hotel. A replacement key is possible but with a penalty specified by the hotel management.

Transportation

From Marrakesh International Airport to the hotels :

Transportation will be available according to arrival dates and times confirmed by different delegations. It will take no longer than 10 minutes by bus to reach the accommodation centres.

From the hotels to the training facilities :

Buses will be available and will operate on a shuttle system. Some training venues are at a walking distance.

From the hotels to the competition site :

A shuttle service is provided on a regular basis from the hotels to the competition stadium. Buses will leave from the hotels every 30 minutes during the period of 13 to 17 July.

For the opening ceremony, transportation will be provided on the 13 July, buses will also be available for the closing ceremony which will take place on the last of competition July 17.

Free public transportation :

Public buses will transport free of charge the IAAF/ MAROC TELECOM World Youth Championships participants within the City of Marrakesh upon the presentation of the accreditation card.

INTERNATIONAL CLINIC

As it was done in Sherbrooke, the IAAF and the LOC will again organise a clinic for the Youth July 10,11 and 12 prior to the Championships.

The Scheduled activities will be as follow :

- ④ An opening ceremony to enhance the promotion and development of the IAAF Youth program throughout the world.
- ④ Workshops with elite international athletes.
- ④ Workshop on doping in sport.
- ④ Training sessions with athletics stars.
- ④ Visit of historic monuments.
- ④ Attending cultural events.

To accomplish this program, subgroups will be established the accreditation procedure.

TRAINING FACILITIES

The Cross Country Course :

Home of the 1998 IAAF World Cross Country Championships, this area is appropriate for the athletes wishing to run and stretch on the grass prior, and during, the competition period.

A specific area is reserved for all throwing events (javelin, hammer, discus, and shot put). A weight training facility is also available in this area.

Event though the course is at a walking distance from the hotels, a shuttle bus service is available.

The Harty Stadium :

A grass surface soccer field next to the hotels is also available for athletes wishing to run and stretch on grass.

The Warm Up Area and the Competition Stadium :

Both the competition stadium and its warm up area will be available for training outside the Competition hours. These facilities will be available only for track events, jumps and hurdles.

Age Category :

Any athlete who is 15, 16 or 17 years of age on the 31 December 2005 may compete in these IAAF/MAROC TELECOM World Youth Championships (boys and girls born in 1988, 1989, or 1990). Team Leadres must bring ALL the athletes' the passport to the accreditation centre upon arrival for the necessary check of the date of birth and for the copies to be made.

Entry Rules:

A maximum of two athletes from any one Member Federation can compete in each event (except for Relays). Three competitors can initially be entered per event, provided each has achieved the entry standard but only two will be permitted to compete.

The maximum number of events that an athlete can compete in is two individual events plus the Relay.

If the two individual events are track events, only one of these individual races may be longer than 200m.

Members who have **no male and/or female qualified athletes** whom they wish to enter in any Championship event may enter one unqualified male athlete and/or one unqualified female athlete in one event of the Championships (except the Combined Events and field Events –see below).

Member Federations (or Area Associations, on behalf of its members) who have no male and/or no female qualified athlete but whose best athlete excels in a **field event**, may submit to the IAAF the name of their athlete(s) and their performance(s) they would like to enter in the field events. The Technical Delegates will make the final decision.

If the **host country** of the World Youth Championships does not have an athlete qualified with a standard in an event, it may enter one athlete in these events regardless of any entry standard.

Relay Teams :

Each country may enter one relay team composed of a maximum of 6 athletes. (See rule 170 -17 of the IAAF).

- Performances must be achieved during the period 1.1.2004 to 27.6.2005.
- Performances must be achieved during an official competition organised in conformity with IAAF Rules.
- Performances must be achieved during competitions organised or sanctioned by the IAAF, its Area Associations or its National Member Federations. Thus, results achieved at university or school competitions must be certified by the National Federation of the country in which the competition was organised.
- Performances achieved in mixed events (between male and female participants), held completely in the stadium, will not be accepted (IAAF Rule 147).
- Wind assisted performances (IAAF Rules) will not be accepted.
- Indoor performances will be accepted.

Final Entries

The Final Entries indicating the names and performances of the athletes, the names of the Team Officials and all other requested information must be submitted through the IAAF Online Entry System (<http://evententry.iaaf.org>) by no later than June 27 2005 (midnight Morocco time).

Member Federations are reminded that the IAAF has introduced financial penalties for those Member Federations that do not respect the deadlines or provide inaccurate information.

Final Confirmation and declaration of competitors

Team Leaders or their representatives must confirm, before the first or only round of each event, the names of the competitors already entered who will actually take part in the competition and any relay teams. The Final Confirmation forms will be given to each delegation upon arrival

The forms will have to be returned to the Hotel Information Desk or the TIC at the stadium by the following deadlines:

However, in order to avoid unnecessary delays in preparing the start lists, Teams will be asked, if possible, to complete and return the Final Confirmation and Declaration Forms, for all days and for all events, upon arrival during the accreditation procedure.

Relay Teams

The composition of a team and the order of running for a relay shall be officially declared no later than one hour before the published call time for the first heat of each round of the competition. This declaration must be done at the Call Room where an official will be based for this purpose.

Written Questions

All questions and proposals concerning the conduct of the athletics competition, to be discussed during the Technical Meeting, must be made (in English or French only) on the form provided to the delegations upon arrival. This form must be returned to the hotel information desk by Monday July 11 at 16:00.

Qualifying Heights, Distances and Progressions

The qualification procedure for track events (number of rounds, number of heats in each round and the method of progression from one round to the next), the qualifying standards, the starting heights and the raising of the bar will be decided by the Technical Delegates after the closing date for entries. Starting heights and rising of the bar for the finals will be announced after the qualifying rounds. Team Leaders will be informed of the decision at the Technical Meeting.

Team Clothing and Equipment

Each team leader must present a sample of the athletes' uniform upon his arrival at the accreditation centre for inspection. Once the uniform has been approved and photographed, copies of the photographs will be distributed to the judges, who will inspect the athletes' clothing at the Call Room.

Only the officially photographed uniforms will be approved for use when competing in the IAAF/MAROC TELECOM World Youth Championships. Athletes are reminded that the eventual lap of honour and victory ceremonies are part of the competition, therefore the same uniform regulations apply.

Spikes, which will be checked at the Call Room, shall not exceed 9 mm except for the high jump and javelin (12mm).

To widen the selection of throwing implements, the use of personal (IAAF certified) implements will be allowed. These have to be taken to the Equipment Control Room for checking and, if approved, will be under the authority of the LOC from the time of checking to the end of the Finals. They are not to be used for training and will be available for use by all athletes during the competition.

Bib Numbers

There will be a total of 3 numbers for each athlete taking part in the competition: 2 numbers for their competition vest and one for their bag. They will be distributed at the Technical Meeting. These numbers must not be cut, folded or obscured in any way.

The same bib number will be used by an athlete regardless of the number of events they participate in.

All competitors must display the numbers on their chest and back, except in the High Jump and Pole Vault events, where one number only may be worn on either the chest or the back.

Athletes taking part in the relay events will wear the number on their back and the country code on their chest. The bib numbers with the country code will be distributed at the Call Room. Relay athletes must all wear the same National Uniform.

All competitors taking part in track events will also be given two adhesive hip numbers before entering the track. The hip numbers must be fixed to both sides of their shorts or legs.

Competition Procedures

Call Room

The Call Room will be set up in a tent adjacent to the Stadium. All athletes must report according to the following Call Room times for their particular event:

Team Leaders must inform all their athletes of the times at which they must report and the procedures to be followed in the Call Rooms. **Athletes who do not report to Call Room will be deleted from the start list and excluded from the event in question and may be excluded from any other event for which they are entered.**

Once in Call Room, the athletes will be identified by their accreditation and their competition number. Call Room Officials will check the following in accordance with IAAF Rules:

- Competition numbers
- Shoes and spikes
- Uniforms
- Bags (identification on and content of)
- Personal belongings (the use of video cameras, tape recorders, radios, CD players, radio transmitters, cell phones or similar devices in the Stadium will not be permitted – IAAF Rule 144.2)
- Magnesium powder (except for throwers and pole vaulters)
- Advertising

All items not authorised by IAAF regulations will be retained by the Judges, who will give a receipt to the athlete. The athletes will be able to collect such items from the TIC

When the control has been completed, Call Room Official will accompany the athletes from Call Room to the Stadium.

Combined Events (Octathlon and Heptathlon)

Competitors taking part in combined events must report to Call Room at the start of each day. More details concerning the subsequent reporting procedures will be given at the Technical Meeting.

Starter's Commands

The starter's orders will be in French.

For track events up to 400m (inclusive) including all relays, they will be:

- À vos marques
- Prêt
- Starting Pistol

For events 800m and over, they will be:

- À vos marques
- Starting Pistol

Protests and Appeals

Protests are allowed and shall be processed according to IAAF Rule 146. Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event must be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that event. Any protest shall, in the first instance, be made orally to the Referee by the athlete himself or by someone acting on his behalf.

An appeal to the Jury of Appeal must be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the decision made by the Referee, in writing on the official forms, signed by a responsible official on behalf of the athlete, and shall be accompanied by a deposit of US \$100, or its equivalent, which will be forfeited if the protest is not upheld.

All appeals must be submitted to the Technical Information Centre (TIC) in the Stadium, from where they will be immediately forwarded to the Secretary of the Jury of Appeal.

CEREMONIES

Opening Ceremony

Will take place in the competition stadium on Wednesday July 13 at 16H30.

Award Ceremony

Medal Ceremonies will, in principle, take place after the respective finals (there may be delays for protests to be finalised). After passing through the Mixed Zone and Post Event Control athletes will be escorted to the Medal Ceremonies marshalling area where they will be briefed by ceremonies staff. The athletes are led to and from the presentation area by an 'Athlete Escort'.

First, second and third place finishers are recognised according to IAAF protocol. The country flags of all the medallists are hoisted during the playing of the national anthem of the gold medallist's country.

Athletes are required to wear their official national tracksuit or uniform (regulations determined by the IAAF). IAAF medals will be awarded to the first three athletes of each event.

Closing Ceremony

Will take place at the competition stadium right after the last event.

Medical Services

Based on the IAAF Guidelines, a medical team will provide necessary healthcare for the World Championships participants. The city of Marrakech will make available emergency vehicles and medical teams at each accommodation centre as well as at the training and competition sites.

Participants are required to purchase their own health insurance prior to their arrival in Marrakech to cover any eventual and exceptional health care during their stay.

The medical services in Marrakech will be limited to first aid, physiotherapy and basic medical assistance.

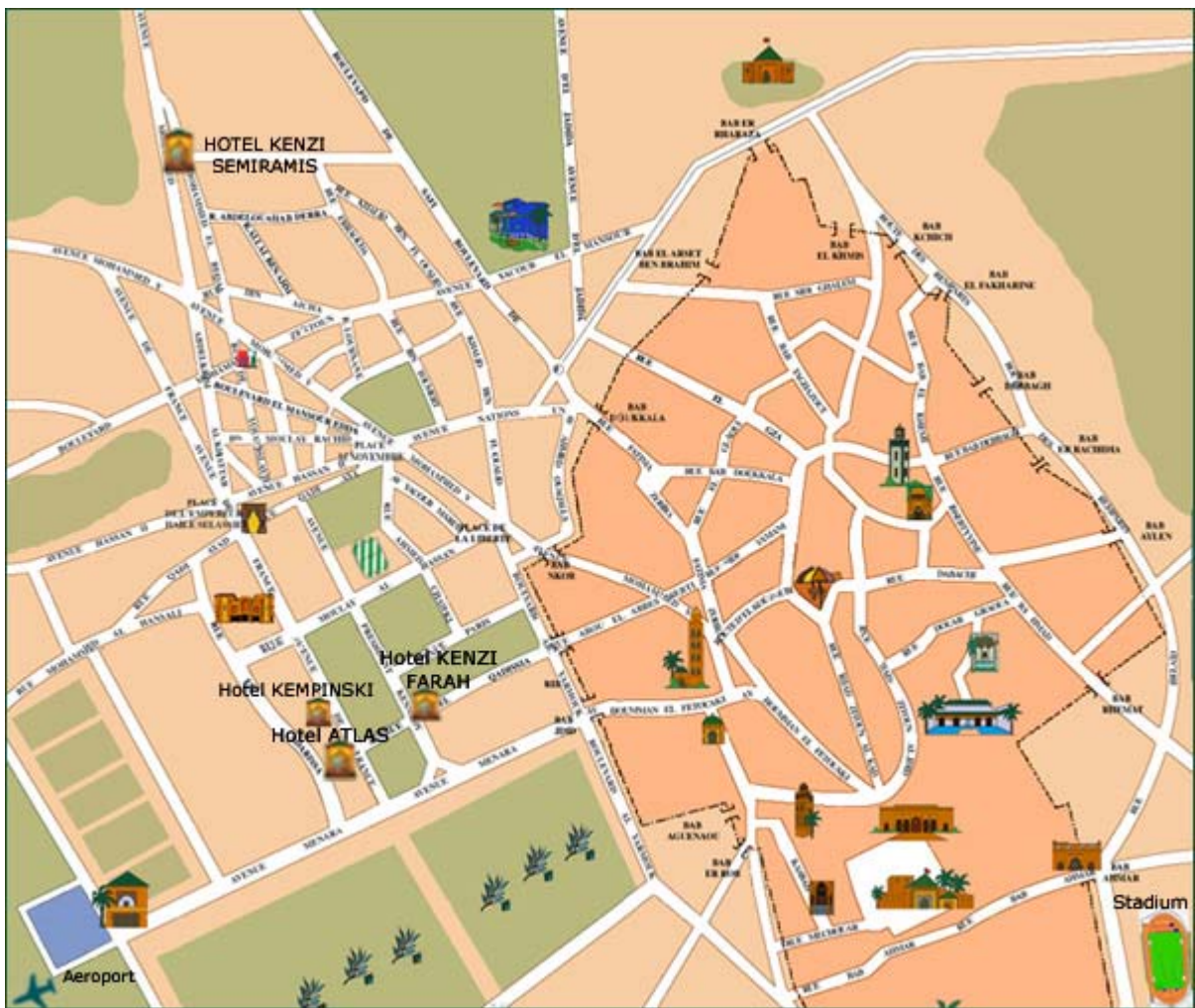
Doping Control

The athletes are advised to check with their team doctors, or the LOC medical staff, before buying or taking any medication.

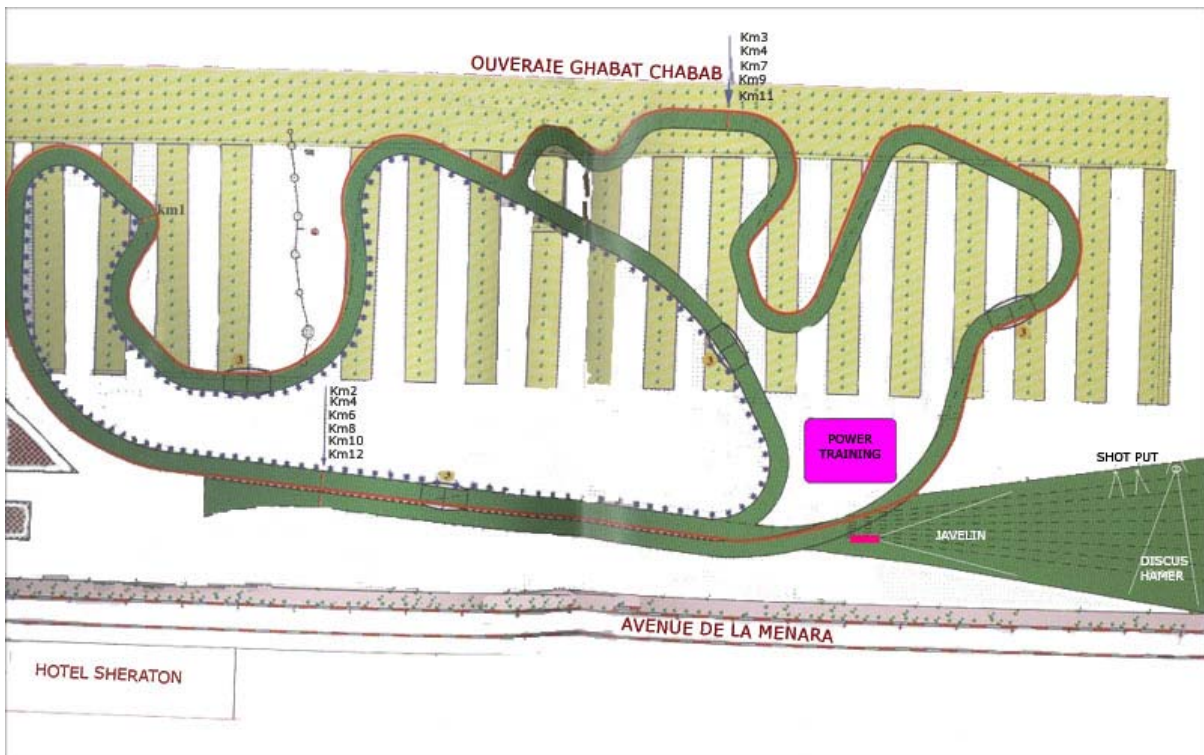
Appendix 1

Marrakesh City Map



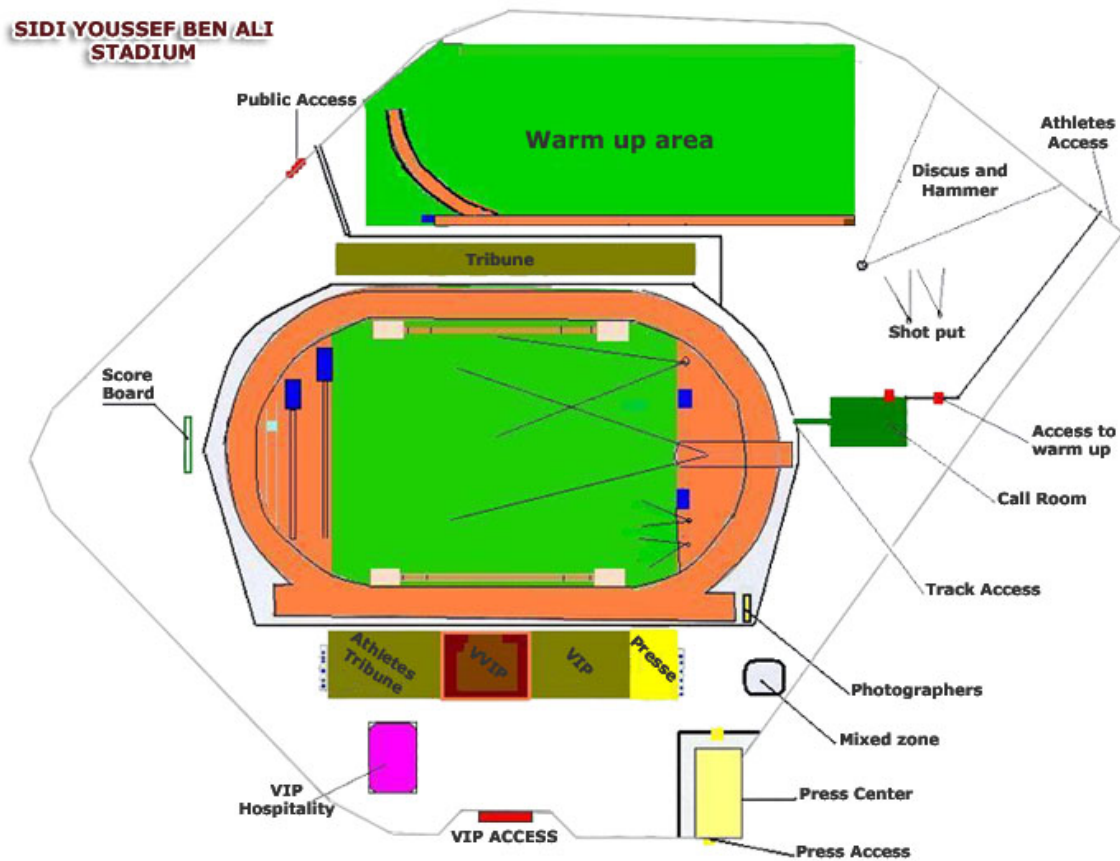
Appendix 2
