







# Orlando, FL December 12

## 1999 Orlando, FL December 11

The boys race was dominated by a close, tight pack until Midwest Regional champion Dathan Ritzenhein, a junior at Rockford High School, broke away in the last half-mile to win the race in 14:29, breaking the course record by 47 seconds. 




## **Girls**
