## 2007 Inductees

**Mimi Arnold, Sequoia High School**

At barely over 5 feet in height, the tiny Redwood City girl was a U.S. national hardcourt tennis champion. She won the 1957 Wimbledon Junior title as well. She also was a fixture on the professional Virginia Slims circuit in the 1960s.

**Dave Binn, San Mateo High School**

A true specialist in the tough world of professional football, he developed his long-snapping skills at San Mateo and at the University of California. After his days in Berkeley, he has been a valuable long-snapper for the NFL's San Diego Chargers since 1994. After the 2006 season, he was named to the Pro Bowl.

**Rich Bordi, El Camino High School**

A right-handed pitcher, he went from his prep days in South San Francisco to success at Fresno State University. He spent nine professional seasons in the major leagues. He had an overall 20-20 record, with 10 saves and 173 appearances, 156 of those in relief.

**Gloria Smith Corey, Westmoor High School  
College of San Mateo**

The first outstanding female point guard in county history, she led her basketball teams at Westmoor, CSM and the University of San Francisco to five championships. She was a key performer on a USF team that was nationally ranked in 1980.

**Cindy Galarza, Hillsdale High School  
College of San Mateo**

An exceptional all-around athlete as a youth growing up in San Mateo, she played six different sports at Hillsdale and then excelled on the basketball court at CSM and later at San Jose State University. Her two CSM teams were a combined 60-4.

**Walt Gilliam, San Mateo High School**

Playing as an amateur golfer, he won prestigious tournaments in San Francisco, Santa Barbara and on the Peninsula. In 1965, he was named Amateur of the Year. In 2005, he became a member of the Northern California Golf Hall of Fame.

**Marty Hull, Sequoia High School**

From the moment he entered the swimming pool, he was marked for stardom. He fulfilled that potential at Sequoia and later at Stanford University where he became an all-American. He set a number of national records at Stanford. He is also a successful inventor and businessman.

**Ben Parks, Menlo-Atherton High School**

A Peninsula coaching fixture through the better portion of four decades, he is the very definition of a teacher, mentor and friend for several generations of young people in the South County and beyond. He is a greatly respected community figure.

**Steve Shafer, College of San Mateo**

A football coach at CSM for eight seasons beginning in 1968, he went on from there to achieve great success at the professional level in both Canada and in the NFL. He was an assistant head coach with the 2000 Baltimore Ravens who won the Super Bowl.

**Mark Speckman, Carlmont High School  
Menlo College**

In the athletic annals of the Peninsula, there is no one else quite like him. Born without hands, he nonetheless played high school and college football. He has been a successful coach at both of those levels as well. He is currently the head coach at Willamette University.
