## Ruling costs Los Altos SCVAL title **Cupertino track champ**

The Santa Clara Valley Athletic League track and field championships . rode to an emotional roller coaster finish Saturday night.

And it was host Cupertino which finally emerged with the best ride, even though defending champion Los Altos prempted the Pioneers' 104-941/2 victory celebration.

Los Altos apparently had won the meet-1041/2 to 104-with a clutch, come-from-behind triumph in the night's last event, the mile relay.

But anchorman Doug Hill, who flashed from far back to win going away, was ruled to have stepped over the back line of the passing zone prior to the final exchange and Los Altos was disqualified.

Then came the Pioneer victory party.

It was Cupertino's first SCVAL crown. Los Altos was seeking No. 14 in 16 years.

While the Pioneers' final winning margin came on a technicality, it was their simply amazing prowess afield which earned the championship.

They piled up 64 of their total points in the field events, with 56 coming in the jumps.

Mark Thorp and Kevin McCarthy traded one-two finishes in the long and triple jumps respectively, and led by Bob Lema's meet record 6-61/4, pioneers placed one-three-four in the high jump.

Thorp added a second in the 100 yard dash to personally account for 26 points.

Cupertino's second place time of 3:28.1 in the mile relay-which became the winning mark-set a school record.

Hill and distance ace Jeff Norton were outstanding for Los Altos and were the meet's only double winners. Hill took the sprints in 10.0 and 22.2

### **Pioneers nail first** Thorp's 26 points track title prove big boost

CUPERTINO'S MASSIVE STRENGTH in the jumping events proved indomitable Saturday night as the Pioneers upset highly-touted Los Altos to earn their first SCVAL track and field championship ever.

The Pioneers tallied an awesome 106 points to overshadow the Knights' 941/2 and Lynbrook's 831/2. Buchser finished in fourth place at 70 points while Homestead followed with 38.

Cupertino amassed an unbelievable 60 points in the four field jumping events - the long jump, high jump, triple jump and pole vault - and performed well enough in the sprinting events to annex the elusive league crown that had previously slipped by them.

"WE'VE COME WITHIN a few points of winning the league meet many times in the past," related winning Pioneer mentor Norm-Eliason, "but were never able to actually win.'

It was senior Mark Thorp, however, that provided Cupertino with the biggest boost. The four-year varsity veteran uncorked a 23-7 in the long jump to win the competition, triple jumped 47-8 for a second place league medal, and blazed a 10.1 in the century for a strong second place finish. His performances accounted for 26 pioneer points.

"It was an unbelievable meet," affirmed Throp. "We knew going into the meet that we had a chance of winning and that we had to come through in certain events, which we did."

THORP TRACED HIS team's desire to win back to a meeting which took place that Saturday afternoon. A group of the varsity trackmen went over to visit Pioneer shot putter Will Dardis, who was in the hospital because of a hand injury suffered in a wood shop accident on Friday.

"We especially wanted to win the meet for Will," stated Thorp. "He was second place in the trials and was doing just fantastic in practice this week. We were really down when we learned he couldn't compete, but when we went over to see him that afternoon we decided to dedicate the meet to him. It really gave us an emotional lift.'

Dardis' put of 52-10 in the trials carried over into the finals and was good enough for a fourth place medal.

**KEVIN McCARTHY ALSO** provided Cupertino with outstanding performances as he earned second place in the long jump with a leap of 23-6 and came from behind in the triple jump to win at 47-9.

'Kevin really came through for us," noted Eliason, "because we knew we had to go one-two in both the long and triple jump in order to have a chance at winning."

Cupertino's vertical jumping trio brought in the most points for one event with 20 markers. Robert Lema sailed over the 6-6¼ mark in the high jump for a new league standard while Jim Roberts claimed third place at 6-4 and Mark Insley nabbed fourth at 6-4. Lema's jump breaks the nineyear-old record of 6-6 set by Max Lowe of Awalt in 1964.

MIKE JORDAN GAVE the Pioneer's another four points in the field events with a fourth place finish in the pole vault at 13-0.

Mark Mildbrandt earned a pair of third place finishes in the hurdle races, where he clocked a 15.1 in the highs and a 19.8 in the lows, while anchoring the mile relay quartet of Al Grayson, Dave Nolte and Don Finley to a winning 3:28.1 finish.


