Five teams dash for SCVAL title

THIS YEAR'S SCVAL track and field championship meet promises to be the most exciting clash of local powers yet as over five squads have a shot at the team title this Saturday night on Cupertino's oval.

Field events are scheduled to start at 6 p.m. while the first running event will take place at 7 p.m.

If the coaches' statements on a predicted team winner are any indication of what the competition will be like, the meet should prove to be fascinating.

"I THINK THIS IS the most balanced league meet we've had in a long time," noted Cupertino mentor Norm Eliason. "There is so much strength spread around that it has got to be a great meet."

"It looks right now like Los Altos has the inside path with Buchser and ourselves right behind, but Homestead, Lynbrook and Awalt are all potentially large point winners."

Meet director Ron Ross of Monta Vista seems to feel that no team has a superior shot at the team crown. "You'll have to flip a coin between Los Altos, Cupertino, Homestead, Lynbrook and Buchser in deciding the championship.

"I IMAGINE IT WILL take only around 70 team points to win this year, whereas the average winner in the past has accumulated over 80 points," he said.

Ross hopes to add a little glamor to the meet this year by placing special emphasis on varsity competition. "We are going to try to spotlight all varsity events and hopefully introduce each competitor.

"We moved the discus ring to the infield, since the discus throwing event is highlighted by two nationally rated athletes in Allen of Lynbrook and Pushkin of Los Altos. It ought to be one of the best meets around."

THE JUMPING EVENTS in the finals should give spectators something special to watch. Cupertino dominates this area with Mark Thorp and Kevin McCarthy both long jumping over 23-feet and triple jumping over the 48-foot

High jumpers Robert Lema, Mark Insley and Jim Roberts have all cleared 6-6, and all stand an excellent chance to break the league standard of 6-6 set by Max Lowe of Awalt in

In the sprints, Thorp, Steve Marcki of Buchser and Steve Bumbaca of Monta Vista could all go under 10-flat in the century, although Bumbaca suffered a hamstring injury in the trials and may not compete.
