



Honorary Referee



Dr. Wilson Riles, Superintendent of Public Instruction, State of California, is the honorary referee for the 1973 California State High School Track and Field Championship Meet. CIF is extremely proud to have Dr. Riles serve in this capacity as it was Will C. Wood, then Commissioner of Secondary Education for the State of California, who requested that such an organization be formed. As a result of his request CIF was organized on March 28, 1914. Since that date CIF has worked closely with the State Department of Education to provide direction to the high school athletic program in the State.

Our honorary referee, Dr. Riles, graduated from Arizona State College in 1940 and completed his graduate work at Arizona State College in 1947. In addition to his degrees from Arizona State College, Dr. Riles has received Honorary Doctorate Degrees from Pepperdine College, St. Mary's College, University of the Pacific, Claremont Graduate School and the University of Judaism in Los Angeles.

Dr. Riles is a World War II veteran serving with the Army Air Corps from 1943 to 1946. After his Air Corps service he served as an elementary teacher and administrator in the Arizona Public Schools. Prior to becoming Superintendent of Public Instruction, State of California, Dr. Riles served as Consultant and Chief of the Department's Bureau of Intergroup Relations; Director of Compensatory Education and Associate Superintendent of Public Instruction, and Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction for Program and Legislation.

In addition to his many responsibilities on the State Level, our Honorary Referee has been most active nationally. He has served as Chairman of President Nixon's Task Force on Urban Education; President Johnson's Task Force on Urban Educational Opportunities; National Advisory Committee on the Teachers Corps; NEA Task Force on Urban Education; Ad Hoc Advisory Committee on Financial Statistics for Urban Education, U.S. Office of Education.

CIF salutes Dr. Wilson Riles for his many contributions to Education on the State and National scene. CIF also thanks Dr. Riles for his support in helping to make the 1973 State CIF Track Meet a reality and a success.



California's 10 CIF Section Honor Coaches

Annually, each high school section selects a man for honors, who has contributed notably to the sport of track and field




J. BERNARD "TUFFY" BURTON, Central Section, started his coaching career at Lemoore High in September, 1929. He retired in May, 1965. During his 36 years of coaching, Lemoore won several league, division and sectional championships in track, basketball and football. His coaching produced several outstanding athletes such as Olympic sprint champion Tommy Smith, and Dale Messer former State CIF hurdle champion and a San Francisco Forty-Niner football player.

EARL LOVE, Oakland Section, is presently the track coach at Oakland High. He has also coached the cross country and gymnastics teams as well as being assistant coach in football. His 1972 track team was undefeated. One of his outstanding graduates was Warren Edmonson who was a member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic Track Team and presently running professional track events.





VICTOR A. MANGINI, Central Coast Section, coached track, cross country and football at Burlingame High from 1946 through 1959. In his 12 years at the helm of the Burlingame track and football teams, the Panthers won an even 12 cinder championships and 4 gridiron crowns. His work in recreation, physical education and athletics on a professional basis spans a period of 22 years.

ROBERT "SCOTTY" BINGHAM, Sacramento Section, is a graduate of San Jose State where he was co-captain of the track team. He has been track coach at Sacramento High for the past seven years and coached at McClatchy High for eleven seasons prior to that. His track teams have won eight league championships. Bingham's most outstanding performer was Carl McCullough who took two first places in last year's State meet. His track team won the State Meet Championship last year.





BLAIR FICTUM, Los Angeles Section, graduated from Occidental College and received his Master Degree from U.S.C. He has coached at Barstow, Riis and Hamilton High Schools prior to coming to Canoga Park High in 1954. Fictum has been the track coach at Canoga Park since that time. He also has had coaching experiences in Basketball, football, cross country and gymnastics. Fictum has tutored many outstanding athletes, and four of them have become coaches.

MARTIN PEDIGO, San Diego Section, graduated from the University of Oregon in 1957 where he was an outstanding long jumper and triple jumper. He coached the University of Oregon frosh team in 1958 and the varsity team at Pendleton High in Oregon, for four years. Pedigo has been the track coach at San Diego High since 1962, establishing a log of 59-23-1 for that time. His overall track coaching record is 88-24-1.



PHIL HEMPLER, North Coast Section, currently in his 23rd year as Commissioner of the Alameda County League, was athletic director and track coach at Richmond High from 1929-49, an era in which Richmond's teams dominated league competition. As Section Commissioner and Federated Council Member 1962-72, he was also a member of the State Track Committee. Forty-four years of CIF service mark him as the veteran member still currently active and contributing to the sport of track and field, and to CIF ideals.

ERNIE McNEALY, San Francisco Section, graduated from the University of California in 1953 and earned his Master Degree in P.E. from San Francisco State. During World War II he served in the Armed Forces. McNealy had the opportunity of running against the great Jesse Owens in an exhibition race in the low hurdles. He started coaching at Mission High in 1963 and won the league championship his first year. He has the reputation of doing an outstanding job with little material and no track on which to practice.



GARY BURTON, Northern Section, graduated from Chico State in 1959 where he lettered two years in track. Burton has been teaching at Corning High for eleven years and has been track coach for ten seasons. During this time, the varsity has won six league championships and has a dual or three way record of 71 wins and 3 losses. His teams also won numerous invitationals in the section and Corning has sent several performers to the State meet.

WALTER OPP, Southern Section, of Muir High from Pasadena has been a high school track coach for the past 27 years and his overall record is 242 wins and 22 losses. His teams have won 12 league championships and have a record of 53 straight dual meet wins. His teams have won the section championships four different years and have been runners up twice. Opp's Muir varsity team won the State Championship in 1967 and was runner up in the 1958, 1964 and 1965.
