Elwood "China" Lang, who retired last fall after over 35 years of service as a teacher, coach and school administrator, co-Honorary Referee for the 1974 California State High School Track and Field Championship Meet.

It is fitting that Elwood Lang should be so honored since he has served as Meet Director for the State CIF Championship Track and Field Meet on several occasions, and has served as Chairman of the State CIF Track Standards Committee for ten years. Lang coached interscholastic athletic teams at both Yreka High School and Oroville High School shortly after he received his A.B. Degree from St. Mary's College in 1936 and completed graduate work at University of Southern California in 1937. Lang has served as a teacher, coach and athletic administrator for the San Francisco Unified School District since 1940. Lang has earned an enviable reputation as a topnotch school administrator, setting high standards and working zealously to achieve them. He was well liked by athletes, coaches and fellow school administrators.

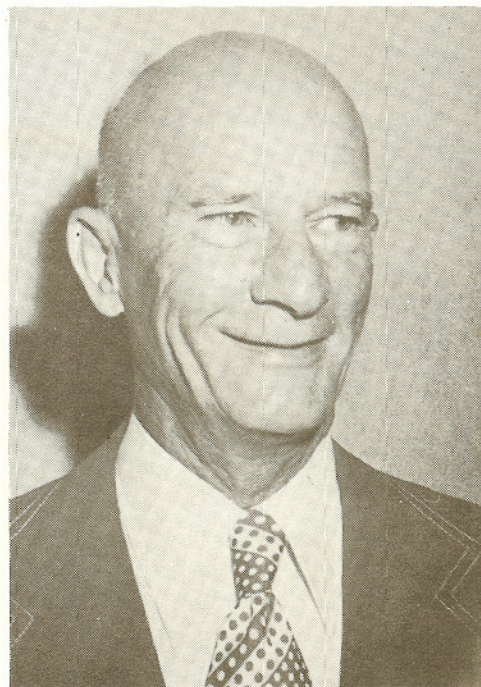

Dr. Grant W. Jensen

Dr. Grant W. Jensen has participated in athletics as a player, coach, school administrator and C.I.F. official during his life. His playing record includes high school basketball, American Legion baseball in Utah, and baseball at the University of California, Berkeley.

He assisted as a football coach at East Bakersfield High School from 1940 and was freshman baseball coach. In recent years he coached in J.B.A. ball.

C.I.F. claimed his attention in 1948 and since that time he has served as president of two leagues, member of many local, section, and state committees, President of Central Section, and member of the State Council of C.I.F.

Dr. Jensen, who received his bachelor's degree from California and doctorate at Stanford, served as principal at the McFarland, Shafter and South high schools before becoming assistant superintendent, instruction, Kern High School District.

Among his contributions to C.I.F.: 1. Committee chairman studying future development of C.I.F.; 2. A leader in planning for state playoffs in all sports under jurisdiction of C.I.F.; 3. Active in the development of a program for girls' athletics; 4. Instrumental in setting up plans for the first California state high school wrestling tournament.

Back in 1949 Dr. Jensen spear-headed activity which led to the formation of leagues within Central Section. He continues to help in the growth of participation of students in athletics and believes firmly that highest standards for athletic qualification should be maintained for participants and spectators.

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Weather, Facilities Make Memorial Stadium Excellent Place for Track Records

Since the California state high school track meet was last held in Bakersfield in 1965, the Memorial Stadium surface has changed from crushed brick to Tartan.

One thing remains constant among the athletes from high school to world ranking who compete at Memorial Stadium, however. They all agree that the warm weather and excellent facilities make it a great place to ply their trade.

Five national prep marks have been set at Memorial Stadium over the past 15 years.

In the 1959 state meet, Dale Story of Orange High School ran a mile in 4:11.0. The 1965 state meet saw Richard Joyce of Sierra (Whittier) running a 1:48.8 in the 880.

While not in state meet competition, Alvin Mann of Edison (Fresno) with a 18.3 in the 180 low hurdles, Otis Hailey of Wasco with a 7-1 $\frac{1}{4}$ in the high jump and David Tucker of San Joaquin Memorial (Fresno) with a 52-6 $\frac{1}{4}$ in the triple jump all set national records here. Tucker's mark still stands.

The prospects of more national records being broken in the 56th annual California Interscholastic Federation State Track and Field Championships appear to be very good.

Two of the newest national record holders will be in the field. Vacaville's Ray Burton, second in the state last year, has thrown the discus 201-6. Mark Wilson of Monte Vista (Danville) has high jumped 7-1 $\frac{1}{4}$ and he will be facing two other 7-footers, Mark Ridge of Merced and Clark Beddley of LaSierra (Sacramento).

There are two returning state champions. Elijah Jefferson of Crawford (San Diego) won the state 100 title in 1973 while Willie Banks of Oceanside was the triple jump winner. Banks has improved his winning mark last year by over a foot with a state leading 50-7 $\frac{1}{4}$.

The sprint field includes Mike Farmer, who helped lead Wilson (San Francisco) to the team title last year. He has run 9.5 and 20.8 for the 220. Millard Hampton of Silver Creek (San Jose) is a 9.5, 20.9 sprintman.

Rich Kimball of DeLaSalle (Concord) turned in one of the finest distance doubles in prep history earlier this year, running a 4:02.6 mile then coming back that evening in another meet for a 8:51.0 two-mile.

Wilson stands a good chance of repeating as state champion. The greatest challenge should come from Muir (Pasadena), with current state leaders in three events.

An outside possibility could be Hoover (Fresno), whose coach, Frank Fletcher, had a state championship team at Edison (Fresno) in 1963.

State meets at Bakersfield, which in 1959 first saw the discus thrown for points and in 1965 saw the two mile run for the first time, will have another first in 1974.

The girls have joined the boys on the program this year and their events will be interspersed with the boys Saturday night. Each girl competing will be a champion, having to win her sectional meet in order to qualify for the state finals.

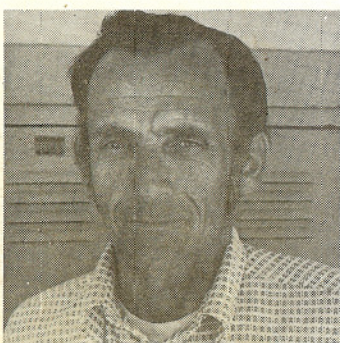
California's 10 CIF Sections Honor Coaches

Annually, each high school section selects a man for honors, who has contributed notably to the sport of track and field



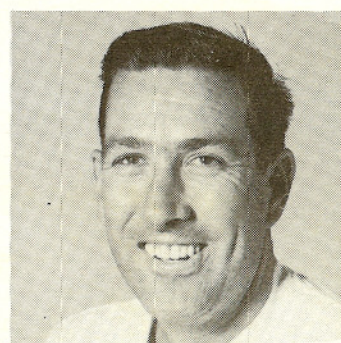

Among his top athletes have been Larance Jones (46.6, 440), Bob Newton (1:53.0 880), Greg Jones (9.5 100, 47.3 440). Fraley organized the Fellowship of Christian Athletes club in the Lemoore area.

JIM DOWNS, San Diego Section, graduate of San Jose State and coach at Vista High past 16 years. Coached cross-country, tennis and track, producing ten league titles and two CIF championships. Overall dual meet record at Vista is 70-16. During past five seasons has developed six shot putters over 56', five discus throwers over 163' and four half-milers under 1:54.7. Named San Diego Section "Coach of the Year" in 1972.



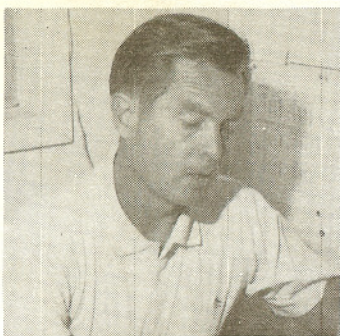
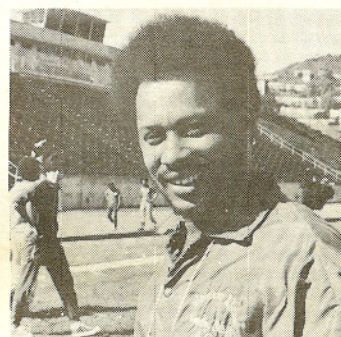

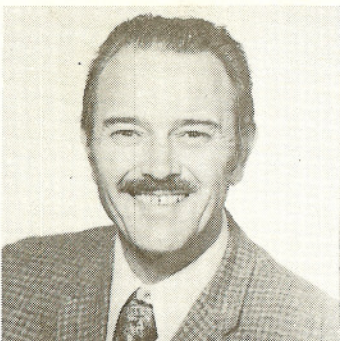
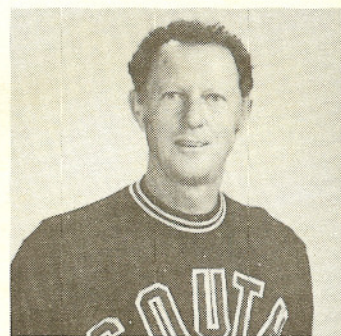
CHARLES BAYLISS, Oakland Section, graduate of Cal State, Hayward where he was a star performer on the Pioneer track squad. Mentored Jimmie Deckard (47.6 for the 440) and sprinters Antonio Watkins (9.6) and George Griffin (9.7). At McClymonds Bayliss is physical education instructor and director of student activities.

ADAM BANKS, San Francisco Section, graduated from SFCC and Sacramento State. At SF's Woodrow Wilson H. S., Banks has developed some of the finest trackmen in the country. Some of his outstanding athletes are sprinter Ron Whitaker (9.7, 21.6), Michael Farmer (9.4, 20.8), high jumpers Randy Turner (6' 9 1/2") and Charles Hatch (6' 10") and hurdler Mike Kirtman (13.9). At City College Banks ran on the same 440 relay team with O. J. Simpson which set a national mark. Holds Far Western Conference 100 record (9.4).



CLARKE MASSEY, Sac-Joaquin Section, has coached track and cross-country for 20 years throughout northern California, the last ten at Cordova H. S. Owns 104-8 dual record in track, 99-9 in cross country and teams have won 208 trophies the last ten years in both sports combined. The Lancers have won the Delta title the past ten years and cross-country Section meet four times. Massey's 1973 mile relay team won the state crown. Co-authored Section handbook for track and cross-country and serves as meet director for Cordova Relays and W. E. Mitchell Invitational.

DICK SCULLY, Southern Section, track coach at South Torrance H. S. past 17 years. In two decades of coaching, Scully has 137 wins and only 35 defeats. Included among the many fine athletes he has guided are five high school All-Americans, including Steve Smith, world record holder in the pole vault. As author of several articles on long distance running, Scully has impressive credentials to back up his philosophy. His cross-country teams over the past 14 years have won 128 meets while losing only 25.



BOB LINEBARGER, Northern Section, began coaching career at Weed High in 1954 and since that time his Cougars have won 25 divisional or league titles and 18 open invitationals. His '57 squad won Northern Section title. One of the founding members of the NSCIF Track Committee, "Line" has directed numerous invitationals and relay meets. Head of the science dept. at Weed H. S., he has parlayed interest in science education and self-improvement into a track and field tradition with his soft-sell approach to coaching.

ESTEL JOHNSON, Los Angeles Section, during his coaching career has turned out five state championship teams, seven L. A. City champs and 12 league title winners at Jefferson High. An alternate on the U.S. Olympic team in the 400 meter hurdles, Johnson ran the 880 at USC, holding school record in the early 1940's. Also was 400 meter hurdle record holder for SoCal AAU and member of mile relay team which held world's record.
