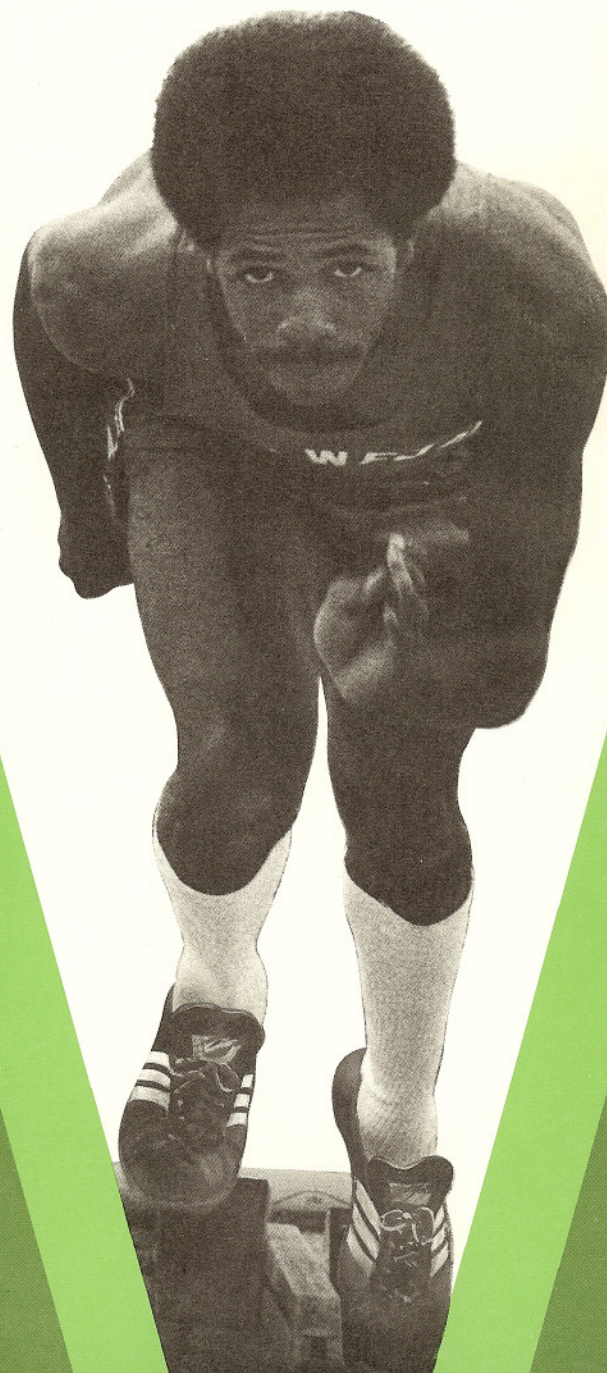

California's State High School Track and Field Championship meet is recognized as *THE* most outstanding interscholastic event for the sport in the United States. The meet also signifies the leadership of the California Interscholastic Federation in fostering sportsman-like competition among public and private schools throughout the state. Formed in 1914, the state federation's general purposes have also been to make possible uniform practices in the conduct of athletics and to centralize control. For the fifty-seventh year we look to the State Track Championships as a successful result of efforts in these areas. We welcome all athletes, coaches and patrons of the high school athletic program in California.

Mr. William Russell, state CIF commissioner, has an excellent background in athletics and administration. He was an outstanding athlete at Santa Barbara State College (now UC Santa Barbara). He later served as graduate manager at his alma mater and commissioner of the CIF, Southern Section, before being appointed commissioner of the state CIF.

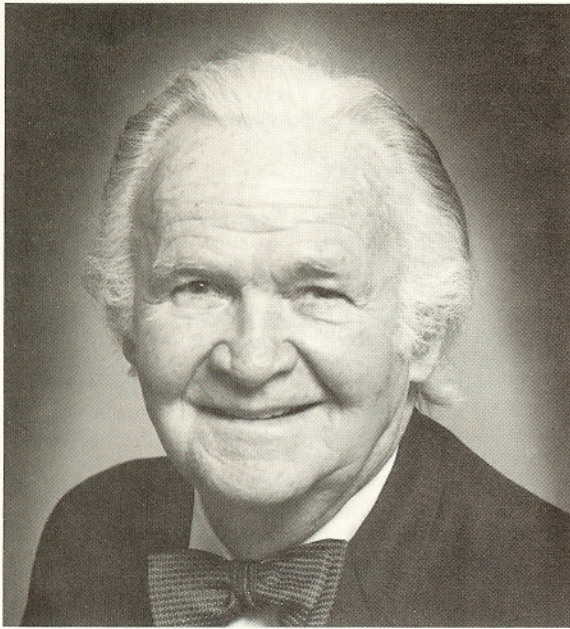

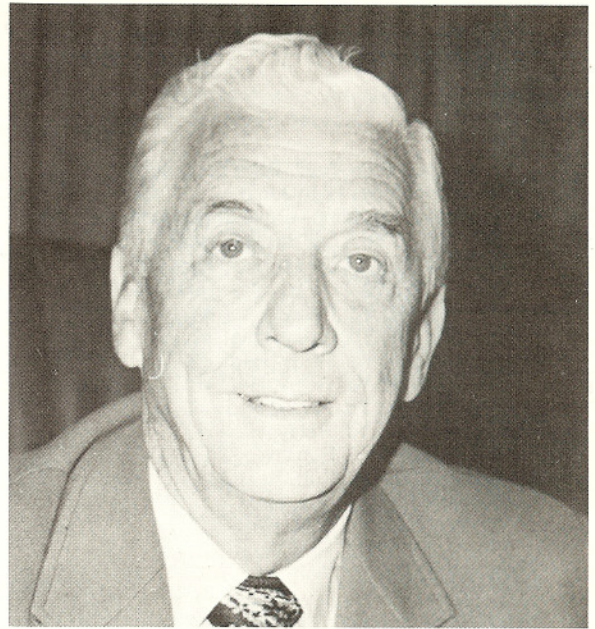

HONORARY REFEREES



J. Kenneth Fagans

Every man is the creature of the age in which he lives; very few are able to raise themselves above the ideas of the times. Glenn Broderick, co-Honorary Referee of the 57th renewal of the California State High School Track and Field Championships, is such a man. Broderick encountered many trials and tribulations before he could stand head-and-shoulders above his peers. But he marked his time and guarded it well.

It is fitting, then, that Broderick should be so honored this weekend because he is one of two men to have coached three or more state CIF champions. While coaching the San Diego High Cavers Broderick's athletes captured the 1929, 1930 and 1938 state titles. Broderick tutored such standouts as Bill Miller, the pole vault champion (14-1 $\frac{7}{8}$) of the 1932 Los Angeles Olympics and the winner of three (1927-29) state pole vaults. These feats were accomplished with a bamboo pole. Jimmy Willson, a :09.8 sprinter who won the 1929 100-yard dash and was a national record holder in this event; Bert Ritchey, one of the greatest athletes to ever perform for the Cavers and who later ran for the USC Trojans; Irvine "Cotton" Warburton, winner of the 440 in a then-record tying :49.6 at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

Before all this, however, Broderick graduated from University of Arizona in 1922, where he started for the Wildcats football team for three years. He made his way to the West Coast in 1926. That year he began coaching at San Diego High. Two years later he led the Cavers' Class B football team to the Southern California championship. His first varsity football team was the first to defeat Long Beach Poly in 11 years. Warburton, who later was an All-American quarterback at USC in 1933, and Amby Schindler, one of USC's all-time running backs, paced Broderick's attack.

Broderick has continued his interest in track and has been a volunteer official at high school, college and AAU meets for more than 20 years. He is one of our timers for today's meet.

J. Kenneth "Tanglefoot" Fagans is retiring this year after a nearly 50-year association with athletics in the West. As a small token of appreciation for his enormous contributions to high school athletics he joins Glenn Broderick as co-Honorary Referee for this weekend's state track and field championships.

While he was coaching basketball at Compton High Fagans had a record streak—53 straight, 1951 through 1953—as well as two CIF championships. He turned out such athletes as George Selleck, Ed Tucker, Woody Sauldsberry and Jim Marshall (now manager of the Chicago Cubs).

That was after Tanglefoot moved from Huntington Park to become a three-year starter and All-Coast guard at Oregon State, pick up a master's degree at USC, play AAU basketball for 20th Century-Fox and serve five years as an Air Force captain during World War II . . . and before he spent the last 20 years as commissioner of the largest network of high school athletic leagues in the world.

The Fagans story as CIF commissioner is one of fantastic growth and continued expansion despite rising financial burdens and the accompanying headaches of the changing times.

Member schools in his Southern Section mushroomed from 218 to 458. The number of sports multiplied from 11—all boys—to 22, of which 13 are for boys, nine for girls.

The CIF playoffs in four classifications (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A) in football, basketball and baseball, in particular, are known as the best-run in the nation. Fagans' crowd-control clinics have had a nationwide following.

That's what's made him tick, and old Tanglefoot has been on his toes for a long time. He's earned his dance.

COVER—Elijah Jefferson, :09.4 sprinter from Crawford of San Diego, will be gunning for an unprecedented third straight victory in the 100-yard dash. He tied the state meet record of :09.4 last year in a heat race at Bakersfield.

If you're looking for a sure winner in this weekend's 57th California High School track and field championships, forget about Elijah Jefferson, Eric Hulst or Dedy Cooper.

The shortest shot in the entire field has to be an 18-year-old entrant from nearby Mission Bay High.

Her name is Kathy Devine.

The 5-foot-11 and 190-pound Miss Devine's name should be familiar to those who attended last year's state meet in Bakersfield.

She won the shot put competition with a heave of 47-4½, which is well behind her national High School record of 51-1½.

Even Kathy admits she's a prohibitive favorite.

"The defending champion is always favored," she says, "and it's even more so with the girls. The boys know who is coming back and what to expect.

"I had no idea who I'd be throwing against last year until we met in Bakersfield. Girls track just isn't as easy to figure as boys."

With that in mind, Kathy plans to be in good enough shape to get somewhere near her national record and have the others try to match her.

Trying not to start too quickly because of the length of the AAU season, Miss Devine's best prior to the San Diego Section championships was "only" 49-4.

San Diego split its CIF championship qualifying into two divisions and Kathy won her section at 46-5. It was 13 feet better than the other division.

The next week she tossed the 9-pound shot 48-11 in an AAU meet, which she figures would have been near her National prep record.

So much for the slow start.

Kathy is among a group of five girls who are vying for the No. 2 spot in America behind current champ Maren Seidler. The goal is obvious.

"I'm looking to make the U.S. Olympic team for Montreal," says Kathy. "That's why I started late this year. I want to build so my best efforts are keyed toward the Olympic Games and if I can win the state high school meet along the way, all the better."

Kathy does all the things a male shot putter would do to build himself up for international competition, including spending time in the weight room at Mission Bay High.

She admits it was a bit awkward at first.

"The guys were really nice . . . almost too nice," she says with a chuckle. "Now, even though I'm accepted, I still feel like an outsider.

"I don't lift weights like an Al Feuerbach, but to get better I know I have to be stronger."

A girl shot putter has an image to overcome as well.

"I believe you can throw the shot and still be feminine," says Kathy. "You have to be big to be able to throw far, but you don't have to be masculine.

"Some people expect girl shotputters to walk like men and develop man-like muscle. I just try to be myself. My personality is such that no one questions my femininity."

This year's meet will include an exhibition discus, which Miss Devine welcomes.

"I haven't thrown the discus in two years," she admits, "but when I found out they were having it, I went out and tossed it 118 feet. That's within nine feet of my best without any practice.

"I'd like to see them add lots of new events, including the 2-mile run, to the girls program. The more competitors you have, the better chance you have of developing international talent."

Kathy is already at the international level. Which is the reason she would be something like a 1-100 shot if pari-mutuel betting were allowed.

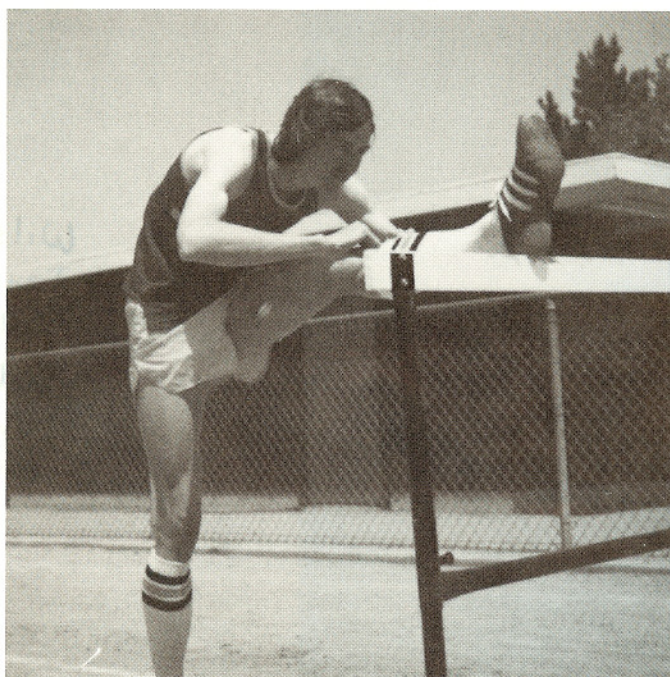

Some things in this world are better left undone.

For instance, you don't tug on Superman's cape; you don't spit into the wind; you don't pull the mask off the old Lone Ranger; and you don't mess around with Jefferson.

Elijah Jefferson dominates foot races at 100 yards the same way Perry Mason rules his courtroom opponents.

Mention Jefferson's name and sprinters come down with a case of the blahs; they're ready to pack their duffle bags and call it a day. Take last weekend, for example.

Elijah prepped for this weekend's State Meet by establishing two CIF, San Diego Section championship meet records in the sprints. He dashed :09.5 in the 100 and :21.1 in the 220. The old records were :09.6 and :21.4.

"I came to the meet with the records in mind," confessed Jefferson. "I wanted some fast times before the State Meet."

Jefferson, the senior with the quicksilver feet from San Diego's Crawford High, is looking for his third straight State Meet 100-yard dash rainbow, determined that no one will rain on his homecoming parade.

It's a feat never accomplished before. But for him to pull the hat trick he'll have to defeat some impressive foes. Joel Andrews of West Bakersfield High finished third in last year's state meet. He returns with :09.5, :21.0 speed. Ricky Jackson of Pasadena finished first in the CIF Masters Meet last Friday (:09.8) and has run :09.5. And there's junior Kevin Williams of San Fernando who won the Los Angeles City 100 title in :09.7 but has clocked :09.6.

Jefferson was asked if he could beat these fellows and repeat his feat.

"I believe I can," said the moustachioed Crawford Colt. "I have to take it."

Why?

"It's here. Those other two years will mean nothing if I don't win here in San Diego. It would be a great feeling to win with my family and friends and the people of San Diego watching. It would make me very happy."

Jefferson's rivals certainly haven't been wearing a happy face. Sprinters, especially those from San Diego, have been waiting three years for their ship to come in but all that ever came was the tide, as Jefferson sunk what hopes they had.

Low key and a bit on the shy side, Jefferson's personality has little in common with boastful sprinters who talk faster than their feet can carry them, saying things are gonna change . . . but then slip into patterns of what has happened before.

Their lessons—unpleasant ones—have been awful quick, as Jefferson, running well within himself, breezed to victory after victory. And that :21.1 he fashioned last week makes him a serious threat to run away with both sprint titles.

Jefferson shares the State Meet 100 record of :09.4 with Mel Gray.

Those who have followed Jefferson's liquid smooth form, his graceful strides for the last three years feel he is running better than he ever has.

"They'll have to shoot him to win," veteran prep track observer Rick Smith said of Jefferson's competitors for this weekend.

Jefferson's coach Dennis Lottermoser agrees. "He looks unbeatable."

He has rounded into this form virtually without local competition, running just fast enough, just fast enough for winning. "That's the thing about him," said Lottermoser, "he runs as fast as it takes to win."

He's sho 'nuff the fastest dude in this town.

"He's got to be San Diego's all-time best," said Vic Player, coach of Lincoln High, the perennial San Diego County champions. "Who's been close to him? Not my kids. Other than by Jefferson, my sprinters don't get beat. It's gotta be disheartening to them. They simply relegate themselves to second place."

Lincoln sprinters should not feel too embarrassed in becoming members of the not-so-exclusive I Lost To Jefferson Club because Jefferson has lost but one race at 100 yards.

Pardon Jefferson now while he finishes one thing he's left undone. And at the same time, excuse the hometown fans if they don't couch their WIN for Jefferson enthusiasm.

A year ago, Harry Ells High's Dedy Cooper was a one-man track team. Now, because of his talent and because of concentrated efforts of a handful of teammates, the Falcons may be in the thick of the State Meet championship.

Cooper, whose collegiate future is undecided, is undefeated this year. However, not all of his races have been easy ones. Less than a mile away from Harry Ells High resides Kennedy High's Robert Gaines. Together, they make up the top two prep hurdlers in California.

"Dedy has to go in eight races in two days," sighs his coach Vic Cary, previewing the State Meet this weekend. "He's a tremendously hard worker. It depends on his frame of mind, but he has the ability to do all this."

Cooper's best over the 120 highs in 1974 was 13.7, a tenth off the state record. He has since improved to 13.4 while counterpart Gaines has run 13.5.

Though the records won't show it, perhaps his best race came May 14 at the Alameda County Athletic League meet, held at the University of California's Edwards Stadium. It was there he got his best start of his career, bolting from the blocks.

Gaines, again his competition, usually gets a better jump than Cooper, only to watch Dedy catch him over the final three hurdles. Such was not the case that day last month, though, because at the first hurdle Cooper was in control.

His time was a legal 13.7, but that doesn't tell the entire story. He was running into a chilly wind and the University of California's dirt track is not known to be one of the fastest around. "That would have been 13.4 or 13.5," said an admiring Cal coach Erv Hunt, "if he wasn't running into a wind."

Cooper, after yet another championship, was asked if he was satisfied with his race. "Oh, no," he recalls. "You can never be satisfied. I still think I could have gotten out of the blocks a little bit better."

Physically, Cooper is a rare specimen, seemingly made for the hurdles. Ultimately, though, his forte may be the 440 intermediates in college, since his tremendous quarter-mile speed lends him toward the longer races.

"He'll fill out a little bit," notes Cary, "but I don't know if he'll get much taller. He will get much stronger. He wants to be a high hurdler and the man has got the kind of instinct that he can go out and do it all in the highs, too. But my personal thinking is that he would be tremendous in the intermediates."

The runner-up in the State Meet 440 last year at 48.2, Cooper won't be entered in that event in 1975. The time schedule, plus the fact Dedy runs both relays as well as the highs and 330s, virtually eliminated him from the quarter-mile.

The ability is there if Cooper wanted to run 440 yards. His only open effort this season resulted in a 49.6 and he had a 47.4 relay leg at Fresno's West Coast Relays. "I'm sure he's capable of running under 48," adds Cary, "but who can say how much under? There's no way of telling."

Though Cooper stood out as a junior at last year's State Meet, Cary quickly points to areas of improvement. "The biggest thing is experience," explains Cary. "He's gotten stronger, too, and his start is better. What he really needs is somebody like the kid in Florida (Mike Roberson). That would really make him go. In this kind of race (at the State Meet), he'll run 13.6 or 13.5."

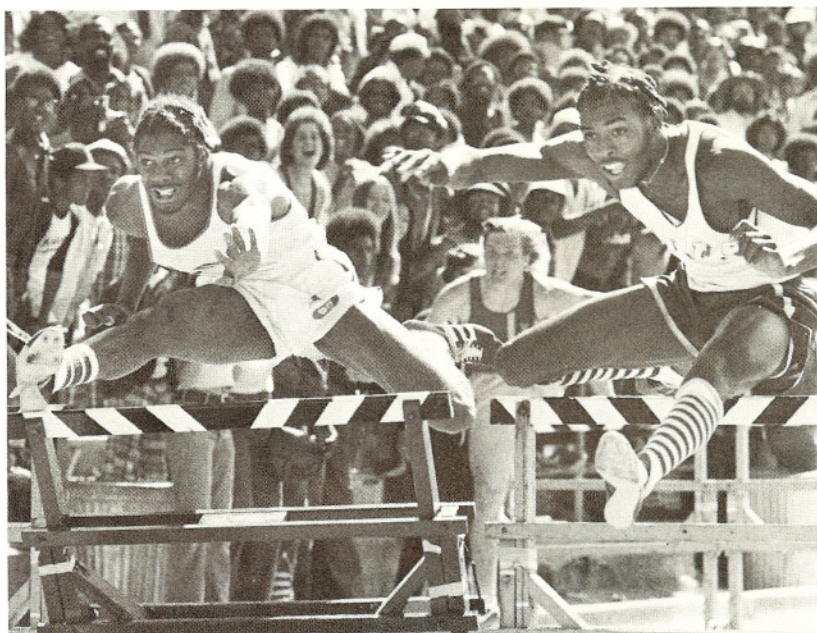
He'll be entered in the 330 lows, too, and his ability here is difficult to estimate. Because of his other duties, his participation in the longer race has been limited, but his quarter-mile speed should make him a threat. "It's difficult to train for," admits Cary. "Most people who are hurdlers are concentrating on the highs. The 330s are sort of an afterthought. People who have run good times in the lows are basically 100-yard dashmen."

Cooper, the national junior recordholder at 14.1 over college highs, has not had a prep race above 14.2 this season. Nine times he has been under 14 seconds and on 11 straight occasions, he has defeated his top rival, Gaines.

Gaines, an outstanding long jumper also who scratched from that event because of a mild back injury, refuses to be psyched out by Cooper's 11-race winning streak. "Before the year's over," he predicts, "I'm going to get him. Look who the pressure's on. It's not on me."

The road to the state meet has been smoother than expected for Thom Hunt. Before the year began, the Patrick Henry High junior considered himself anything but a top mile prospect. He thought he might be a two-miler but figured his best distance would be three miles or over.

But the first big race of the year changed Hunt's thoughts. On March 22, in the Balboa Relays, Hunt raced to a 4:07.9 mile, the third-fastest ever recorded by a San Diego prep. And he defeated an excellent field in the process. Vista's Jay Woods was runner-up in 4:13.3, Granite Hills' Tim Earle next in 4:14.2, Skyline Oakland's John Johnson fourth in 4:15.1, and Gahr Cerritos' Jim Arriola fifth in 4:18.6. Arriola has since run a 4:09.1.

"Really, I still don't consider myself that much of a speed man," said Hunt. "I train differently than most runners do. Other guys do more track work—they work on their speed. I only get on the track once a week and run some 880s and 440s."

His early-season exploits brought him instant national prestige but in no way did the likeable, 5-8, 120-pounder let it go to his head. Week after week, Hunt has performed and performed well. In most of Patrick Henry's dual meets this year, he competed in the 880, mile and two-mile. Hunt and teammate Paul Becklund, who is one of California's top half-milers, combined for one of the nation's more devastating distance pairs.

About the only time Hunt slipped all year was in the Arcadia Invitational and still, he had a brilliant evening. His 4:08.1 mile was second to Anaheim Loara's Ralph Serna who won it in 4:07.0. Hunt then came back to finish second in the two-mile in 9:02.6. Corona del Mar's Brian Hunsaker won the race in 8:58.6. Serna was third behind Hunt.

It was the Mt. Sac Relays where Hunt really showed his stuff. Bucking a biting cold and a stiff breeze, Hunt won the two-mile in 9:06.2, 11 seconds ahead of Santa Barbara's Richard Aguirre. Then, 15 minutes later, Hunt came back and anchored Henry's winning distance medley relay team. Running the mile leg, Hunt blew past Serna who held a 10-yard advantage heading into the stretch.

"I really don't think I've been in the right two-mile race yet," says Hunt. "In Arcadia, I ran the mile before running the two-mile and I was tired going into the last lap (Hunsaker, who set a rapid 4:24 pace in the race did not compete in the mile that night). Then, at Mt. Sac, I was disappointed because Hunsaker didn't run in the race. I think both of us could have gone under nine minutes that night."

Hunt isn't the only San Diego athlete who has shot into national prominence this year. Besides Crawford's Elijah Jefferson, who's gone a long way toward being famous in winning back-to-back state 100-yard dash titles, there's El Cajon weightman Mark Malone.

Malone, a 16-year-old junior, appears on the brink of greatness. A three-sport star for El Cajon, Malone first garnered attention when he won the San Diego County discus championship as a soph. Last fall, the 6-5, 210-pounder quarterbacked his team to the league championship. He averaged over 10 yards a carry from scrimmage, was named the league's football player of the year and also was an all-county choice. He also was a member of the Braves' basketball team, where he was the team's leading scorer.

Malone is so versatile, there has been talk of him trying his hand at the decathlon. At times this year, Malone entered the shot put, discus, triple jump, long jump, 220 and relays. He has been the county leader in the discus and shot put all year. He reportedly has :04.6 speed in the 40 but he still has doubts about the decathlon.

"I guess the decathlon really wouldn't be so bad," he says. "I guess if I got involved and worked at it I could do all right. But there's a couple events in the decathlon I'm not so sure about—like the pole vault and mile."

Wayne Layton, Malone's coach, feels there's no limit to Mark's potential. "He's so easy to coach," he says. "The amazing thing about him is that he picks things up so quick. The first time he ever ran the hurdles in practice he looked as good as any hurdler I've ever had here—and I've had a :14.6 hurdler."

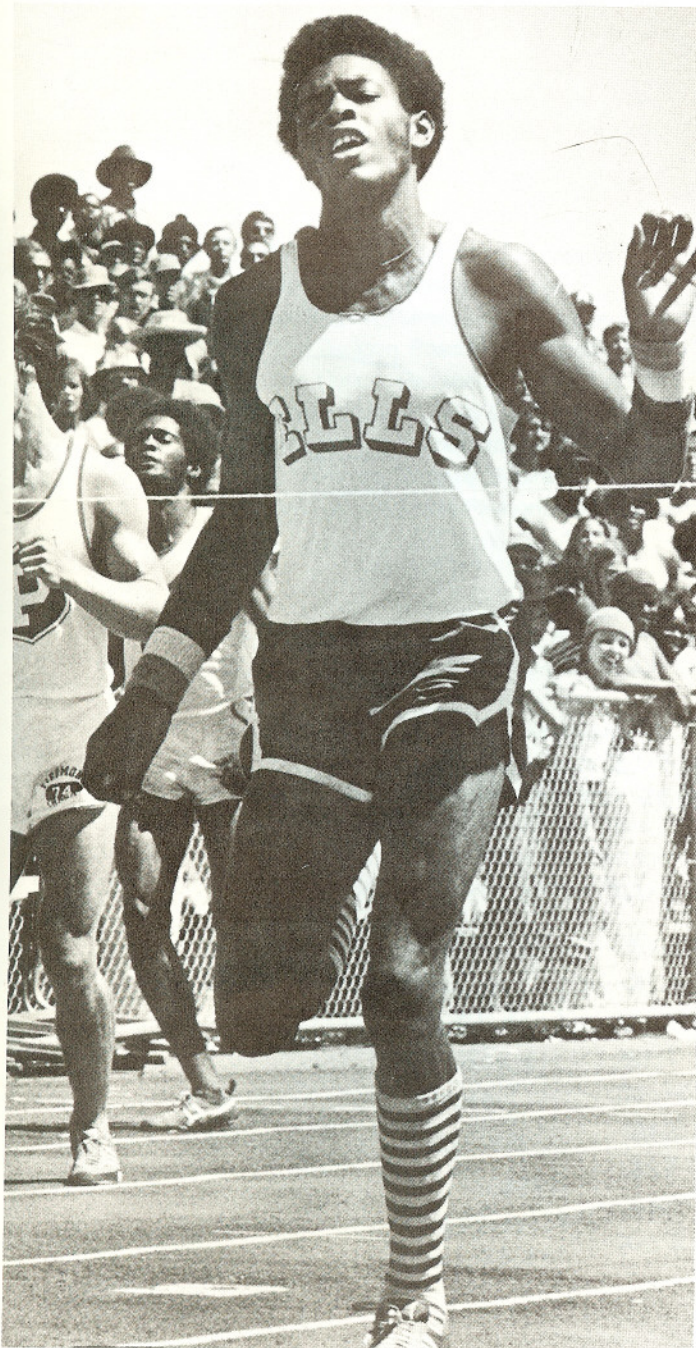

Millard Hampton of Silver Creek (San Jose) won the 220 last year in Bakersfield for the Central Coast Section's lone gold medal in the last two California State Track & Field Championships.

Hampton is no longer on the prep scene, but Keith Taylor, a junior from Piedmont Hills (San Jose), is perhaps the best bet from the CCS for a win in this year's State meet in San Diego.

And, like Hampton, Taylor is a sprinter who goes into the big test with an unbeaten record in the 220, his lone loss an early season 100 yard dash to Joel Andrews of West Bakersfield in the San Jose Relays in 9.5. He defeated Andrews in the 220 later in the same meet with the first of many 21.3s.

He's run 21.3 four times and his best in the 100 is a windy 9.4 at the San Jose Invitational on May 5. He won the century in 9.7 at the West Coast Relays in Fresno.

He does have a weakness, but not an uncommon one for a 6-4 and 180-pound sprinter. He has a poor start, in fact, "a lousy start," in the words of his coach, Al Vacio.

Few 6-4 sprinters, however, have been known for their quick get-offs. Especially one as inexperienced as Taylor. He's just a junior and didn't compete as a sophomore after transferring from Bellarmine Prep in San Jose.

And, it is not surprising that Vacio, along with many others, believe Taylor's best race will eventually be the 440. He ran the one-lapper in 49.6 his first time out, and in his league finals meet, ran the anchor of the mile relay in 47.7.

His frame, if not his potential as a runner, remind many of Tommie Smith, 1968 Olympic 200 meter champion who was a sprinter-long jumper at Lemoore High School before turning to the 440 where he won the CIF crown in 1963 with a swift 47.3.

Although Taylor's best chance in San Diego appears to be in the 220, he also has designs on the 100 crown. Even with poor starts, he's beaten the likes of Glenn Cannon (Mt. Pleasant of San Jose) and Maurice Glass (Castlemont of Oakland) in big invitational meets.

Winning the 100 may be even more important to Taylor as it would deprive Elijah Jefferson (Crawford, San Diego) of a third straight State title in the event, something no other runner has accomplished.

"He may not be a smooth starter," notes Vacio, "but he's a determined finisher—his strength and competitive drive are a tough combination for the opposition to overcome."

By no means is Taylor the lone athlete the CCS will have in San Diego.

This figures as one of the finest crops in recent years with the talent also including Gary Bersano (Los Gatos) who finished third in the shot put last June in Bakersfield. He's reached his peak later this year, getting his first 60 footer in the West Valley League finals on May 16 when he hit 60-4½. He did 61-2 last year.

A few others with high hopes include Cannon in the sprints where he has bests of 9.7 and 21.5; Ron Kennedy (Serramonte of Daly City) 13.7 in high hurdles and 48.0 in 440; Conrad Suhr (Leigh), a finalist in the mile last year but who is going in the 880 this time; two-miler Jerry Emory (Gunn of Palo Alto) who has a 9:10.4 to his credit, and Junior Rojas (Overfelt) spanned 49-5¾ with wind and 49-0½ without in the triple jump early in the season.

Making their third appearance in the State meet are Mitch Kingery (San Carlos) who did 9:05 in the two-mile as a junior and who has been coming on strong late in the season, and high jumper Kirk Collins (Monterey) who has soared 6-10 and who has gained a pattern of consistency in his senior campaign.

Easily the most versatile athlete is Don Finley (Cupertino) who won four events in the Fremont League finals (48-1 TJ, 23-6½ LJ, 14.2 HH, and 38.0 LH). He is a definite factor in the jumps, particularly the long jump where he has a windy 24-3¼ mark to his credit.

Despite the presence of the nation's best shot putter (Newport Harbor's David Kurrasch) and the best pole vaulter (Villa Park's Keith Schimmel), this has been the year of the distance runner in Orange County.

Living within 35 miles of each other are Ralph Serna of Loara (Anaheim), the nation's fastest miler at 4:07.0, Brian Hunsaker of Corona del Mar, the national early-season two-mile leader at 8:58.2, and Eric Hulst of Laguna Beach who was second in last year's two-mile as a sophomore. Add another 10 miles and you include Jim Arriola, a 4:09.1 junior miler at Gahr High in Ceritos which is just across the county line.

Those four along with Patrick Henry High junior Thom Hunt (4:07.9 and 9:02.6), Matt Bell (4:12.9) of Foothill (Tustin)—another Orange County runner—and Vista senior Jay Woods (4:13.3) figure to dominate the State Meet distance races.

"The way I see it," said Serna who is competing in his third straight State Meet mile, "it will take at least a 4:05 to win it."

Serna, who runs better as a follower than as a leader, would like to see a fast early pace. "I want to try just once going out on a super fast pace," he said, "coming by in 1:59 and a 3:02. At Arcadia I felt really strong and thought I could have gone faster if we had come by a little quicker at the 1320."

At the Arcadia Invitational where Serna ran his 4:07.0 to defeat Hunt, Arriola, and Hulst, he went past the 1320 in 3:07.2.

Hunsaker and Hulst will be concentrating on the two-mile in the State Meet.

A fast first mile has been Hunsaker's most effective weapon this year. At Arcadia where he clocked his 8:58.2 to defeat Hunt and Serna (after they had run their mile), Hunsaker was out in 4:24.0. "If I can start off faster it helps take away their speed and then it is a matter of who has the most endurance," said Hunsaker.

Hunsaker thinks it will take a sub 8:50 to win the State Meet. "I will need a faster second mile to achieve that," he said. "But I have not been pressed yet in my second mile."

With Hulst, another runner who likes to force a hot pace, also in the race, Hunsaker indicates he may change his tactics. "It is a lot easier when you are hanging on somebody than when you are setting the pace and right now I have a lot of confidence in my speed because of my halfmile (1:56.0) time."

Hulst, whose training was interrupted by a midseason injury, lacks the speed of Hunsaker, Hunt (1:55.1) or Serna (1:55.7). "His speed is not where it should be as far as 880 speed is concerned," admits Laguna Beach coach Jim Toomey. "But I don't think that is going to have too much effect in the two-mile."

Toomey is hopeful that Hulst can compensate for his lack of speed with strength. "Physically he is strong as heck," said Toomey. "His strength has improved so much that it kind of wipes out the lack of speed. I will really be disappointed if he does not break 8:50 in the State Meet."

The distance runners are not the only Orange County athletes in contention for a state championship.

Kurrasch, last year's shot put winner as a junior at Santa Ana High, has transferred to Newport Harbor where he joins quarter-miler Brian Theriot (47.4) to make the Tars a contender for the team title. Kurrasch, who has not lost a prep shot put competition since finishing eighth at Woodland two years ago as a sophomore, is the best (66-10¼) of the 11 state preps who have bettered 60-feet this year.

Villa Park's pole vaulting duo of Schimmel (16-3¼) and Tim Vahlstrom (16-1) join friendly rival Brian Worden (16-0) of Notre Dame (Sherman Oaks) to make up one of the strongest pole vault fields in State Meet history. Schimmel has wins over Vahlstrom and Worden in head-to-head competition at Arcadia and at the Mt. San Antonio Relays.

Theriot, who expects to meet Sacramento's Johnny Ware (47.5) for the 440 championship, has been pointing for the State Meet all season. "I want to make amends for what happened last year," he said, referring to Bakersfield where he finished ninth after going into the meet with the fastest time (47.7).

California's 10 CIF Sections Honor Coaches

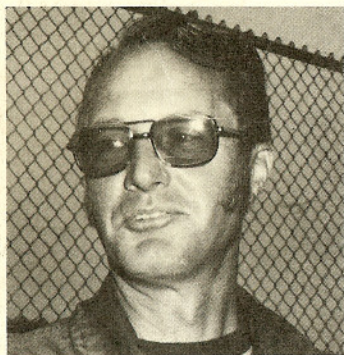
Annually, each high school section selects a man for honors, who has contributed notably to the sport of track and field



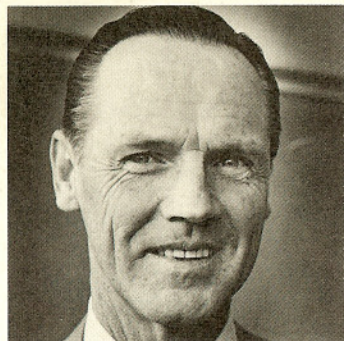
GEORGE W. KASTNER, Central Section, coached track at Clovis High School for ten years, during which time his teams won their league and division championships three times. Since leaving coaching he has advanced through the administration to his present position as Assistant Superintendent of Clovis Unified School District. He has served the CIF Central Section as its Track Advisory Committee Chairman for the last ten years. For the last fifteen years he has officiated at many major meets, the last one being the referee for the 1974 CIF State Championship Meet.



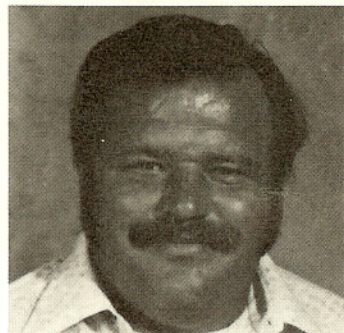
HENRY NORBERG, Central Coast, Fremont, receives this award posthumously. Hank died unexpectedly Dec. 4, 1974 in his home in Palo Alto. He began his athletic career at Palo Alto High before moving to Stanford University where he was a member of the "Vow Boys" of 1941-43. He traded his Stanford jersey for a San Francisco 49er uniform upon graduation. Norberg became Fremont's shot put and discus coach in 1950. Bruce Wilhelm, one of his pupils, won the state meet (1963, 63-4¼), while Wilhelm's brother, Steve, was runner-up.



BOB DALIGNEY, Los Angeles, has been the track coach at Gardena High since 1962. The Mohicans have lost just three dual meets since 1965 and none since 1970. They were City League champs last year when they also placed fourth in the State Meet at Bakersfield. Scholastic Magazine has honored five of Daligney's men on its All-American squad. Wayne Collett, the UCLA 440 runner who took a second in that event at the 1972 Munich Olympics, is a product of the 1967 Gardena team. Daligney was a standout performer himself while at UCLA.



BOB VINCENT, North Coast, San Ramon, began coaching in 1948 at Clarksburg High. Twice he has coached three consecutive undefeated league championship teams. San Ramon captured the Foothill Athletic League title from 1965-67 and in 1971-72. San Ramon won the East Bay League when it was realigned in 1973. His 1973 cross country squad annexed the section's crown. In fact, Vincent's thinclads have not finished lower than fifth in their section in the last four years. He has coached such outstanding runners as Roy Kissin (9:01); Mike Dayton (9:13.4); Dave Anderson (1:53.8) and long jumpers Kurt Hollmer (23-2½) and Tom Noy (23-½).



KEN BROOKS graduated from high school in 1961 from Dinuba H.S., attended College of the Sequoias in Visalia and graduated from Sacramento State College in 1965 with a major in Mathematics and a minor in Physical Education. Ken competed in football and track at the intercollegiate level for 4 years. His first teaching assignment was at Christian Brothers H.S. in Sacramento where he was an assistant in track and football. Ken has been teaching at Norte Del Rio High School for 4 years and has been head Track Coach for 3 years. In 1974 the Norte Track Team tied for the League Championship, won the Sub-Section and also the Sac-Joaquin Section Championship.

FRITZ SPARKS, Oakland, Skyline, is a 1967 graduate of California State University at Hayward. He served as assistant track coach at Oakland High in 1972 when it won the Oakland Athletic League. He moved to Skyline in 1973 as head track coach and assistant football coach. In his first year Skyline won their first track championship in 13 years and compiled a dual meet record of 10-1. Skyline repeated as O.A.L. champions in 1974 and again this year. Sparks' three-year track log reads 33-1 in dual meets.



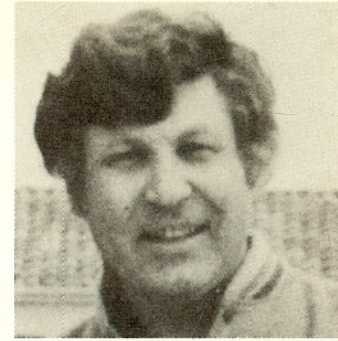
MEL JONES started in the Chico school system in 1951 after graduating from Chico State College. He has taught at Chico Jr. High, Bidwell Jr. High and made his way to Chico High School in 1958. For eleven years Mel's teams dominated the North Section. Mel's varsity team never lost a dual or three way meet, and they won 9 section championships, and numerous relays and invitationals. One of Mel's outstanding athletes was Doug Parker, who won the state meet one-half mile in 1962 with the time of 1:52.2. Mel has coached basketball and football. In 1968 he moved to Chico Jr. High to accept the position as Dean of Instruction and services, a position that he still holds.



SUNDAY DURLAND, San Diego, Coronado, launched his coaching career with the Islanders in 1944 as football coach. Eight years later he accepted the reins of track and field, a sport in which is known to have considerable expertise in developing quarter-milers. In his 31 years at Coronado, Sunday spent 15 years in football, 14 in cross country and 24 in track. His track teams claimed seven league titles, while the cross country squad had two. In his first 17 years his track teams had only one losing season. Sunday is a 1937 graduate of San Diego State, where he was an exceptional football player.



HARRY REDLICK, San Francisco, George Washington, has coached three section champions since coming to Washington 18 years ago. During that time his teams have amassed 96 victories, compared to 28 defeats in dual meets. Redlick shares Washington's success with assistant Bruce Nelson. Redlick has high hopes for sprinter Willie Purifoy and distance runner Steve DeFont in this year's state track and field championships.



TIM BRANCHEAU, Southern, West Covina, was named his section's Coach of the Year by his peers. Not only has track and field become a way of life with Brancheau but winning as well for the personable West Covina coach. Since taking the reins at West Covina in 1967 his teams have compiled one of the most impressive dual meet records in the section. In eight years his Spartans have recorded 60 wins and just three setbacks—not to mention that they are currently riding a 33-meet win streak. Brancheau is quick, however, to share the credit. He points to the work of assistants Doug Agatep and Doug Koel as having a direct bearing on the team's achievements.
