

Talented CCS entry

BERKELEY — The Central Coast Section is represented by 55 boys and 39 girls in the California Interscholastic Federation Track & Field Championships which started with trials today at Edwards Stadium.

Today's qualifying will determine the field for the finals Saturday starting with field events at 12:30 and track events at 1:30.

The CCS sent its most talented group of girls in the three years the meet has been held and the boys contingent is not as balanced as some in recent years but is strong in the sprints, relays, hurdles and jumping events.

Hamilton and San Fernando, both from the Los Angeles City Section, are expected to battle for team honors in the Boys' Division and Berkeley figures to regain the Girls' crown it lost to Washington of Los Angeles last year.

Silver Creek girl rated state threat

Marquita Belk (Silver Creek) and Susan Springer (Salinas) take the best marks from 10 Section qualifying meets into the third annual Girls' CIF Track & Field Championships Friday and Saturday in Berkeley.

They, along with Pam Blackburn (Cubberley) are given the best chance among girls from the Central Coast Section to cart off victories.

Miss Blackburn will be trying to regain the high jump crown she lost last year after winning the first-ever girls state title the previous season in Bakersfield.

Pam cleared 5-8 in the CCS finals, a mark surpassed by only one other competitor in California's 10 Section finals. Chris Remmling (San Dieguito of Encinitas) won the San Diego Section crown with a 5-8¼ effort.

Miss Belk clocked 56.0 in the CCS 440, nearly a full second faster than the next fastest qualifier, Robbie Mitchell (Fremont of Los Angeles) who captured the Los Angeles Section crown in 56.9.

Miss Springer powered the discus 133-5 in the CCS meet, just under her season best of 135-10 and well ahead of her closest pursuer going into the meet. Kathy Middleton (Poway) posted the second best winning effort with her 129-1 in the San Diego Section finals.

Maria Garcia (Harbor) 43-9 and Sheila Pannell (Leland) 42-11½ posted the second and third best marks in Section finals with only Lori Lanseadel (Mt. Whit-

ney of Visalia) ranking ahead of them with a toss of 44-0¾.

Kris Costello (Lynbrook) won three CCS crowns but faces a much stiffer challenge this week. Her 10.6 for the 80 yard low hurdles, however, makes her a threat in that event. Jennifer Mann (Kennedy of Barstow) had the best mark with a 10.5 on a slow Cerritos College track in the Southern Section meet.

Although five of 27 entries had faster times and two others as good as her 5:04.6, Sue Munday of Lincoln rates among the favorites in the mile. She placed fifth in last year's meet and has the reputation of running only fast enough to win. Two broke 5:00 in Section meets, Linda Broderick (Tamalpais) doing 4:55.1 in the North Coast Section finals and Lynne Maltinski (Mira Costa of Manhattan Beach) 4:56.4 in the Southern Section meet.

Jody Anderson (Washington of Los Angeles) is shooting for her third successive long jump crown and her 19-3½ in the Los Angeles Section meet was the best. Only one other, Lisa Gourdine (El Toro), Southern Section champion, is close at 19-0.

Frieda Cobbs (Berkeley) is expected to win both

sprints and lead Berkeley to the team championship.

Competition both days will start at 12:30 and Friday's session will not close until the third heat of the Boys' mile relay at 6:40. Saturday's final event is set for 4:30.
