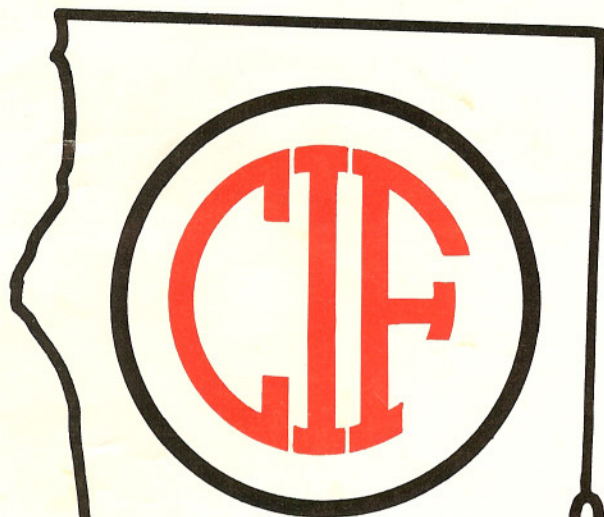

"THE CIF STORY"

California's State High School Track and Field Championship Meet is recognized as THE most outstanding interscholastic track event in the United States. The meet also signifies the leadership of the California Interscholastic Federation in fostering sportsman-like competition among public and private schools throughout the state.

Formed in 1914, the State Federation's general purposes have been to make possible uniform practices in the conduct of athletics and to centralize control. For the 59th year we look to the State Track Championships as a successful result of efforts in these areas. We welcome all athletes, coaches and patrons of the high school athletic program in California.

The quality of performances in the State Track Meet are perhaps best attested by comparing the State CIF Championship Meet record with the National record in each of the events. Many of the National records are held by California high school students. UCLA's track is known to be "fast." We may see some new State or National records set at the State CIF Meet this year.

While the State CIF Track Meet for boys has been conducted since 1915, the first State CIF Meet for girls was held in 1974 at Bakersfield. In today's meet the girls will enjoy their competition just as much as the boys.

Mr. William Russell, State CIF Commissioner, has a varied background in athletics and administration. He was an outstanding athlete at Santa Barbara State College (now UC Santa Barbara). He later served as graduate manager of his alma mater and Commissioner of the CIF Southern Section before being appointed Commissioner of the State CIF. Russell is Chairman of the National High School Track and Field Rules and Records Committee, and has served as a member of the National Federation Executive Committee.

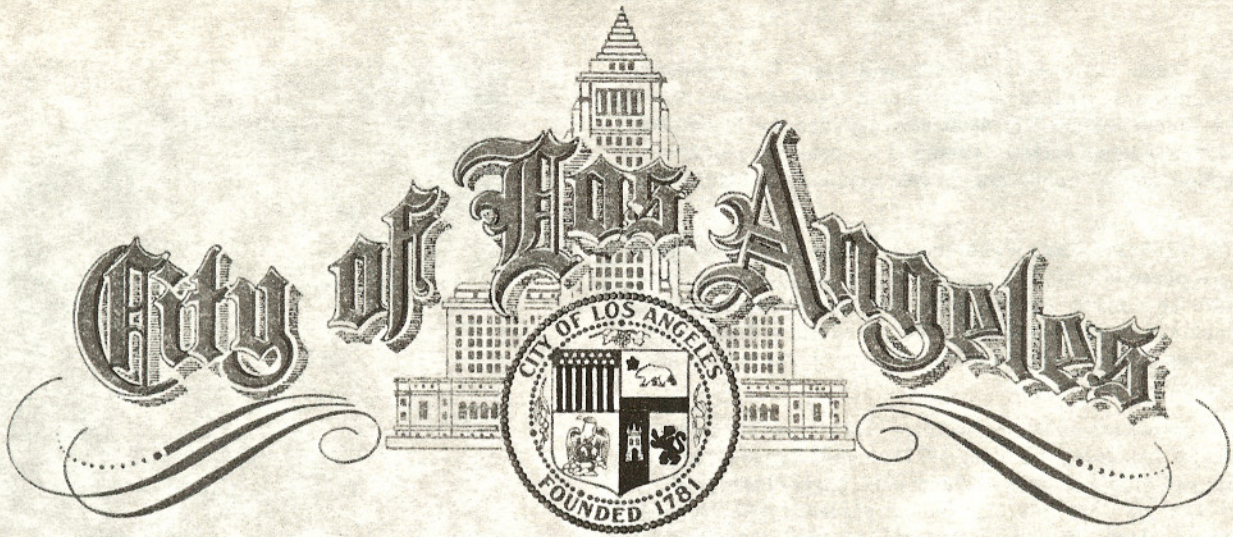

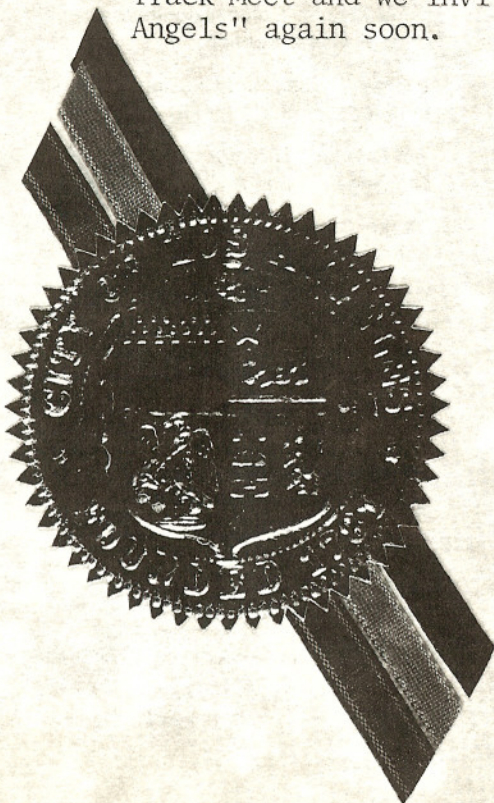

'ALL ROADS LEAD TO UCLA'S DRAKE STADIUM' FOR GREAT C.I.F. TRACK AND FIELD MEET!

Talk about your "show of shows" and "show of the world," the biggest spectacular in California high school sports comes to town this weekend as the 59th Annual California Interscholastic Federation Track and Field Championships are conducted for the third time on this beautiful Drake Stadium facility on the UCLA campus. The running track is exceptionally fast, the field pits, rings, and runways geared to exceptional performances—and that's exactly what is in store for what could be a capacity crowd in Saturday's finals.

What a State basketball tournament is to Indiana, what football playoffs are to Texas, that's what the State C.I.F. track and field meet has been to California since its inception back in 1915. Many national interscholastic records have been set in these meets and a generous number of world recordholders, Olympic Games gold medal winners and team members have all been products of this competition, which is traditionally the only statewide championship in which the California high schools participate. Even that was in jeopardy this year as plans had been made to separate the meet into two one-day sectional championships, but, fortunately, that was set aside and another brilliant program awaits—for both the boys and the girls.

Indeed, all roads do lead to UCLA's Drake Stadium this weekend as many of the finest young athletes in America converge on this "battlefield" to decide who is *numero uno* in their respective specialties.

The leading boys' prospects with the informative assistance of Los Angeles Times track expert Mike Kennedy, in order of events, include:

POLE VAULT—Anthony Curran, Crespi-Encino, who went 16-1 in the Southern Section finals and has a season high of 16-4 $\frac{1}{4}$, is opposed by five others who did 15 feet plus in their sectionals. One is Steve Rakshani, Edison-Huntington Beach, who was runner-up to Curran at 15-6 and has sailed 15-8 $\frac{1}{2}$. Jim Westlund, Fremont-Sunnyvale, went 15-3 last weekend and Billy Pierce, Sanger, vaulted 15-0 $\frac{1}{4}$, but has negotiated 16-1 $\frac{1}{2}$.

DISCUS—Three giants surpassed 180 feet in sectional qualifying—Mark Bryant, Antelope Valley-Lancaster, 185-2; David Porath, Atwater, 181-10, and David Thomson, Santa Ynez, 180-11. Thomson had a season best of 194-10, Matt Gauthier of Valhalla-El Cajon, 191-2, Porath, 189-2, and Bryant, 186-7.

LONG JUMP—Kurt Durham, Oakland, got out to 25-1 last week and has to be tabbed the man to beat, with Fremont-L.A. sophomore Donnie Butler having just gone 24-4 $\frac{3}{4}$ himself. Eleven others surpassed 23 feet in sectional meets, including Kennedy-Barstow's Larry Jones, 23-7 $\frac{1}{2}$ (24-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ -wind aided earlier), Roosevelt-Fresno's Robert Walker, 23-8 $\frac{1}{2}$, and Willie Alexander, 23-6 $\frac{1}{4}$ (23-11 $\frac{1}{2}$ best), and Lutheran-L.A.'s Chip Benson, 23-6 $\frac{1}{4}$. El Camino-San Diego's Dokie Williams has a 23-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ on the year.

TRIPLE JUMP—El Camino's Williams is coming off a 50-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ sectional effort (he's done 51-2 $\frac{1}{2}$) and Menlo-Atherton's Paul Bates and Washington-L.A.'s Cary Tyler did 49-2 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 49-2 $\frac{1}{4}$, respectively. Big question is about Bates' possible leg injury. Oakland's Durham leaped 49-2 and Benson had a 48-2, but boasts a wind-aided 48-8 $\frac{1}{2}$. Serramonte's Lorern Leberz has achieved 49-0 $\frac{3}{4}$.

SHOT PUT—This is a "down" year—only six 60-footers in the meet. Kevin Messenger, Highlands-Sacramento, went 64-2 $\frac{1}{4}$ last week and Craig Polley, Sunny Hills-Fullerton, made it to 63-6 $\frac{1}{2}$. Atwater's Porath has put 62-5 $\frac{1}{4}$ (60-7 $\frac{1}{4}$ last week), Valhalla's Gauthier, 62-4 $\frac{1}{4}$; Katella-Anaheim's Steve Defferrest, 60-4 $\frac{1}{2}$; and Leland's Pat Graham, 60-11.

HIGH JUMP—As weak as is the shot, so is the field bristling here. El Camino Real-L.A.'s Rob Olson went 7-1 in his finals and Oakland's Bill Hice leaped 7-0 $\frac{1}{4}$, while Santa Monica's Dennis Smith has topped 7-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ (6-10 last week); Fremont-L.A.'s James Frazier 7-0 (6-11); Thousand Oaks' Gary Lawrence, 7-0 $\frac{1}{2}$; Kennedy-Sacramento's Steve Link, 7-0; Claremont's Kelly Gordien, 6-11 $\frac{1}{4}$; and Sanger's Bret Bell, 6-10 $\frac{3}{4}$.

440 RELAY—Pasadena ran 41.8 last week and has a 41.4 for the year. Fremont-L.A. did 42-flat in its City finals, with a 41.8 overall best. Edison-Fresno is coming off a 42.1.

880—Estancia's Jim Walters ran 1:52.0 in the Southern Section, followed by El Modena's Dave Kingsland, 1:53.1, Notre Dame-Sherman Oaks' Tim Macauley, 1:53.5, and Simi Valley's Bob Bouillon, 1:53.8. Earlier, Kingsland edged Walters in a near-dead heat 1:51.3. Richmond's Mike White, 1:53.2, and Buchser-San Jose's Bruce Jensen, 1:53.3, are apparently the north's best.

100—Patrick Henry-San Diego's David Russell and Piner-Santa Rosa's Jim Burrell are fresh from 9.7, with just three more having run 9.8 in their finals, Pasadena's Ivan Cleveland, Hanford's Ken Thomas, and Oakland's Durham. Chatsworth-L.A.'s Ron Williams won his section in 9.9, but has a 9:5 best, while Cleveland has a 9.5w, Russell and Burrell bobs 9.6, and Thomas, 9.6w.

120 HIGH HURDLES—No one ran 14-flat or better in sectional meets, but five did 14.1—Gardena-L.A.'s Phillip Johnson, DeAnza-Richmond's Jim Patterson, Fountain Valley's Ken Margerum, West Covina's Milan Stewart, and Paradise's Greg Marjama. Johnson and Margerum have both run 13.9, however. The guy to watch for may be Banning-L.A.'s Curtis Perry, 13.8 earlier and not beaten by Johnson until the finals.

TWO-MILE—Eisenhower-Rialto's fabulous Assumma brothers, Chuck (8:55.4 last week) and Frank (9:00.5), plus Kennedy-Barstow's Steve Ortiz, 8:55.4, Coachella's Frank Alvarez, 8:57.5, and San Geronio's Dave Daniels, 8:58.8, suggest an all-Southern Section show. Sac-Joaquin sends Redwood's Rod Berry, 9:05.3, Downey-Modesto's Tim Holmes, 9:05.3, and Jesuit-Sacramento's Tim O'Neill, 9:05.8.

440—This is one of THE races of the meet: Pasadena's James Sanford, 47.5 last week (46.7 on the season) vs. Chatsworth's Williams, 47.4 and improving rapidly. Fremont-L.A.'s Percy Smith and Richmond's Mike White ran 48.2, Morse-San Diego's Tony Banks clocked 48.1, and Fontana's Rod Bethany has done 48.1.

220—A three-cornered version of the 440: Patrick Henry's Russell, Pasadena's Sanford, and Chatsworth Williams zipped 21.0, 21.1, and 21.1, all winning with ease last week. Ayer-Malpais' Dwayne Green has a 21.2, Overfelt-San Jose's Dwayne Taylor, 21.3, Fremont's Smith and University-L.A.'s Baxter Slaton, both 21.4.

330 LOW HURDLES—Andre Phillips of Silver Creek-San Jose zipped 36.5 in his sectional and has a 36.2 best; Banning-L.A.'s Perry ran his best-ever 36.6 to defeat Taft-L.A.'s Rich Hohmann, who was timed in 36.9. Yerba Buena's Mark Chapman has a 36.9.

MILE—Willow Glen-San Jose's Mark Stillman stepped a 4:08.7 and Serra-San Mateo's Stan Ross blazed a 4:09.8 last week, with Hemet's Mark Fricker, 4:10.7, Agoura's Jon Stormo, 4:11.2, and Edison-Fresno's Charles Christensen, 4:12.5, en route to this meet. Ross and Fricker both have PR's of 4:08.2, Stormo, 4:10.2, and Christensen, 4:11.4. Paradise's Larry Greer, 4:11.4, and Palma's John Sup, 4:12.1, have to be rated, too. San Pedro-L.A.'s Ron Cornell, 4:14.4, is undefeated, untested.

MILE RELAY—Fremont-L.A. had a 3:17.0 with two aces out last week and has a best close to 3:16.1, while Kennedy-Richmond ran 3:17.1 in its City finals as Richmond followed at 3:18.0. Pasadena, anchored by Sanford, had a 3:18.7. Other good season times belong to Banning-L.A., 3:16.4, Morse-San Diego, 3:17.7, Muir-Pasadena, 3:17.9.

The girls' meet features defending high jump champ Kari Gosswiller, Upland, 5-8; long jumper-low hurdler Lisa Gourdine, El Toro, 19-0 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 14.2; Crawford-San Diego's 440 relay, 46.6; Linda Goen, North Bakersfield, national 880 record-holder and defending State champ, 2:08.2, and trying for a double in the mile, 5:01.1; Westchester-L.A.'s Kim Robinson, 100 and 220, 10.8 and 24.2; Centennial's Jeanette Bolden, 100-220, 10.5 and 24.7; L.A. Lutheran's Pam Loud, 100-220-Long Jump, 10.9, 25.0, 19-10w; Locke-L.A.'s Valerie Brisco, 440, 55.5; Los Altos' Vickie Bray, mile, 4:52.9; Bonita Vista-San Diego, 3:55.6, Terra Linda, 3:57.4, and Locke, 3:57.5, all going in the mile relay.

At this point, the point should be pretty much made—it's going to be heckuva meet. But, then again, when isn't it?

STEVE MILETICH SERVES AS HONORARY REFEREE TODAY

Honorary Referee for the 59th Annual California State High School Track and Field Championships this weekend at UCLA's Drake Stadium is a very distinguished man in California Inter-scholastic Federation (C.I.F.) athletics, both boys and girls, who works and lives coincidentally close to this campus, but, ironically, is a very deeply loyal USC Trojan by preference, educational and athletic background, and loyalty over the past four decades. That gentleman is Stephen Thomas (Steve) Miletich, one of the best known, most respected, and well-liked people in California high school sports.

Steve Miletich was born 58 years ago—Dec. 16, 1918—in Albia, Iowa, where he attended high school, serving as class

president and winning 10 letters in athletics—four in basketball (All-State guard), three each in football (center) and track and field (pole vault). He came to California in 1937 on a basketball scholarship to the University of Southern California, playing under the late Justin M. (Sam) Barry and lettered twice. He obtained a Bachelor of Science degree in 1942 and Master of Science in 1948, plus completing 70 additional units beyond his M.S. He received a Blue Key Honorary Award while at USC and secured his General Elementary Teaching Credential and Administrative Credential.

After service in the U.S. Navy during World War II (1942-46), enlisting as a Chief Specialist and coming out as a Lieutenant (jg), with duty training recruits in Hollywood, Fla., and special services in Hawaii, Steve started his teaching career in 1947 at Beverly Hills High School. He coached basketball and Bee football, golf, tennis, was a counselor for a year, administrative assistant to the principal for one year, and has been Assistant Principal, Pupil Personnel, since 1958. In basketball, he had a team that was 30-1 in 1955, then 24-2 in 1956, and 18-7 in

1957, his last year of coaching. Among his proteges were Don Long (UCLA football tailback under Red Sanders), Ned Eckert (Chapman College), and Don Walker (University of Colorado).

In related professional activities, Miletich has been a member of the CIF Southern Section, Executive Committee, from 1965-73, and served three terms as President of the CIF, SS (1964, 1972, 1973). He has been chairman of the Releaguings Committee for eight years (1964-72), on the Board of Directors of the CIF State Federated Council (1966-74), and President of the State CIF for the past three years (1974-77). He is a past President of the Southern California Basketball Officials Association (1958); Instructional Chairman of the Southern California Basketball Officials Association, which has 2,000 members, since 1966; on the Board of Directors, Scholastic Press Association; and is a first term member of the Board of National Basketball Committee for United States and Canada, which will find him representing all of the high schools in those two countries on that group for the next three years, at least.

Steve was one of the pioneers in working toward equal opportunity for girls in high school athletics and the development of the girls' programs is largely due to efforts by people such as himself. He recently commented, "We saw it coming even before Title IX and felt that the girls should have the same opportunity as the boys. I have two daughters of my own, but that really had nothing to do with it." State CIF Executive Secretary William W. Russell stated, "Steve has been a vital factor in the growth of girls' athletics on the league, district,

and state level and his effective and capable leadership as presiding officer on the CIF Federated Council have been uniquely outstanding."

Miletich has been a member of the Beverly Hills Exchange Club (1962-74) and was its president (1968). He has held membership in the Braemar Country Club and was president (1970). In addition, he is justly proud of having been on the board of directors for the Youth Olympic Committee since 1973 and a member of the board of directors for the Southern California Golf Association. In his spare time, he is an avid golfer, whose combined interests with that of interscholastic athletics has produced a State Girls' Invitational Tournament on June 13 at Lakeside Country Club.

Married to the former Margaret (Peggy) Boehm for the past 33 years, he has two grown daughters, Christy Farmer, 30 (married to ex-UCLA and Chicago Bears pro football star George Farmer), and Susan Stronsborg, 27, who have, in turn, presented him with three and two grandchildren, respectively. In fact, he just added twin grandsons, courtesy of daughter Christy.

This weekend he adds one more richly deserved distinction to a long and seemingly inexhaustible list of activities and involvements on behalf of youth, education, and athletics—and it permits a moment of well-deserved tribute and recognition of a man whose tireless and progressive efforts have made so much of the C.I.F. high school sports program what it is, Honorary Referee Steve Miletich.

Annually, each CIF section selects a man or woman for honors who has contributed notably to the sport of track and field. Annually, who has

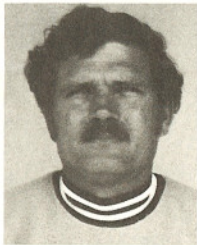

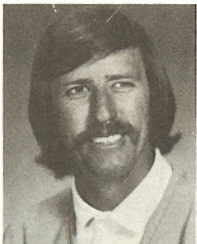

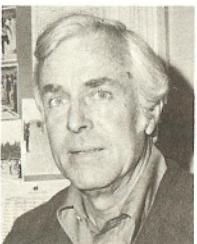

Ken Johnson of Willow Glen High School in San Jose graduated from Whitman College in Walla Walla, Wash., with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1957. He received his M.A. from the University of Oregon in 1961 and has been head track coach at Willow Glen High since 1963. He has served as Central Coast Section Championship Meet director in 1976 and 1977 and is chairperson of the Santa Teresa Athletic League Track Committee.

George White of Galileo High School took over as head football and track coach at Galileo in 1973 after 10 years as track coach at Balboa in San Francisco. He graduated from Occidental College, where he competed in football and track under Chuck Coker, in 1959.

Tim Brancheau has won Sierra League championships at West Covina High School nine out of the past 11 years. Currently, his team has 49 straight dual meet victories and since the CIFSS has adopted frosh, soph, and JV teams, the Spartans are undefeated, presently holding 42 consecutive dual victories. Since 1969, the overall combined record on all levels is 224 victories and 10 losses. Tim gives credit to the many assistant coaches who have made this record possible, including Ralph Craig, Doug Agatep, Doug Karl, and Jim Mandalla.

Bob Hadley of Anderson Union High School started coaching track in 1962 and took over the head coaching position several years later. He helped develop a full track program in the next few years to include a three-division boys', girls, and varsity-junior varsity cross country schedule. With the help of other Northern Section CIF coaches, these activities grew and developed into the excellent opportunity they are today. He was appointed District Athletic Director and has just this year relinquished his coaching activities, expressing regret, to devote more time to his new assignment. Bob regards the past 14 years of working with young people of Northern California as most rewarding.

It was twenty years ago (June 2, 1957) that young **Jim Cerveny** of Mission Bay High School in San Diego won the State CIF 880 at Berkeley with a meet record-breaking mark of 1:52.7. As a student at Occidental College he won the National AAU 800 meter title in 1960. For the last 15 years Jim has coached in the San Diego Section and for the last six years has been head coach for the boys' cross country and track and field teams at **Morse High School**. His well-coached teams are always highly competitive and the 1977 track and field edition was a contender for the San Diego Section Championship at press time. Coach Cerveny is quite active in physical education curriculum development for the San Diego Unified School District and his peers have elected him to the presidency and other offices of the San Diego Track Coaches Association and the California Association of Health, Physical Education, and Recreation.

Don Phillips of Miramonte High School has coached track and football for the past 26 years. Girls Track Coach Anne McIntyre described Don as "A coach who is more concerned with the athlete than the team record." "Don has been tremendously helpful, supportive and understanding to me, a very novice girls track coach." He coached three time State CIF Champion Dixon Farmer, George Coon (880 - 1:50), Dave Deubner (mile - 4:11), Mark Behr (PV - 14-6), Rich Gunther (discus - 184) and Shannon Duthie (G - discus - 128). Don's cross country teams have won 5 consecutive league titles, all the more remarkable when you realize that he coaches football and cross country concurrently. He is an experienced, knowledgeable coach who has demonstrated the highest ideals of coaching.

Bill Pothoff, Los Angeles, has been track coach at three L.A. High Schools. He began at L.A. Jordan in 1950, in five years of Marine League competition they were undefeated in all three classes. In 1955 they tied Jefferson High in the famous 54-54 meet. The same year they won the city championship and finished second to Centennial in the state. He worked with Joe Barry at Washington 11 of 14 years in the tough Southern League. In 1965 Washington tied Manual Arts for the L.A. City Championship. He took over the **Banning** Track Team in 1973, since they Banning has won eight of the fifteen championships in track. In 1976 they won Marine League Championships in Varsity, Bee, and Cee as well as the Burbank Invitational and Hawthorne Distance Carnival.

CALIFORNIA'S CIF SECTIONS HONOR COACHES – GIRLS' TRACK AND FIELD

Annually, each CIF section selects a man or woman for honors, who has contributed notably to the sport of track and field.

Cheryl Rieck attended Concordia Teachers College in Seward, Nebraska, where she majored in secondary education with a major emphasis on physical education and a minor in history. Upon graduation, she joined the staff at **Lutheran High School** in Los Angeles and has taught there for three years, instructing physical education and coaching girls' teams in volleyball, basketball, and track and field. Last year Lutheran's girls' track team was the CIF Southern Section 1-A runner-up and this year they took first place in that division.

Carol Cuccia of **Los Angeles Polytechnic High** was born and raised in Ohio, receiving her Bachelor of Science degree from Bowling Green State University in 1971 in health and physical education. Carol has been teaching physical education at Polytechnic High since her arrival in California six years ago. She has been a very active leader in fostering girls' track and field in Los Angeles, helping launch the first track program at Poly in 1972. Her teams have lost only one meet in the last two years and won the Valley-East League title in 1975 and 1976. She has coached track for five of her six years of teaching and has been an assistant coordinator for the City program since 1975. Her contributions, dedications, and concern for her track program has been surpassed only by her knowledge of the sport, delightful naivety, sense of humor, and personal charm.

Mary Lasagna of **Oak Grove High School** in San Jose graduated from California State Polytechnic College with a B.S. degree in 1966 and obtained an M.S. at Cal Poly in 1967. She became girls' track coach at Oak Grove in 1967 and has served as meet director for the Central Coast Section championships each of the past two years, as well as chairperson of the Mt. Hamilton Athletic League Track Committee.

Willie White of **Berkeley High School** attended Jefferson High School in Los Angeles and won the 100-yard dash, setting a new State record in 1956 with a time of 9.5, also tying the existing state record of 18.9 in the 180 low hurdles. He also ran on the 880 relay which set a new national record in the time of 1:25.9. The following year, Willie ran at Harbor College in San Pedro and was league, Southern California, and State JC champion in the 100 and 220 low hurdles, setting national records in both events. His best times were 9.4 in the 100 and 22.6 in the 220 LH. White also placed third in the National AAU LH and sixth in the 100. He has been coaching girls' track and field at Berkeley High since 1972. During that time, his won-lost record has been 28-1-2 with four league championships, three North Coast Section championships, and State titles in 1974 and 1976.

Carol Johnson has coached girls' track and field at **Gridley High School** for the past 10 years. She has served as a member of the girls' North Section track committee for the past five years and is currently the committee chairperson.

A UCLA graduate, **Jerri Minott** coached at **Pt. Loma High School** in the San Diego Section for three years before transferring to the new Mira Mesa High School this school year. She sports a four-year dual meet record of 30-3. Her teams have won three league championships, one of which was in the first year of Mira Mesa's existence. As a coach, she has not lost a league dual meet in three years. Seven San Diego Section records were established in the space of two years by her teams. Jerri's girls had earned 38 San Diego Section medals, including 13 gold, over the last three years and prior to the 1977 Championships and press time. Ms. Minott has been the coach of 10 girls qualifying for the 1974, 1975, and 1976 State Meets.

Lindy Jack, **Cordova High**, is just in her second year, but has already made a big impression as girls' track coach. A 1975 graduate of the University of the Pacific, her team was undefeated this year. The 1977 Lancer mile relay team has also been undefeated and posted a 4:05.5 clocking earlier in the season. Lindy's squads have amassed a 22-1 record overall, including back-to-back league championships. This year's squad has dominated two large invitationals in addition to winning the sub-section meet. A very active person, Lindy is the girls' track representative to the Metropolitan League and was co-meet director for the section track meet. Her current squad is largely made up of underclass girls.

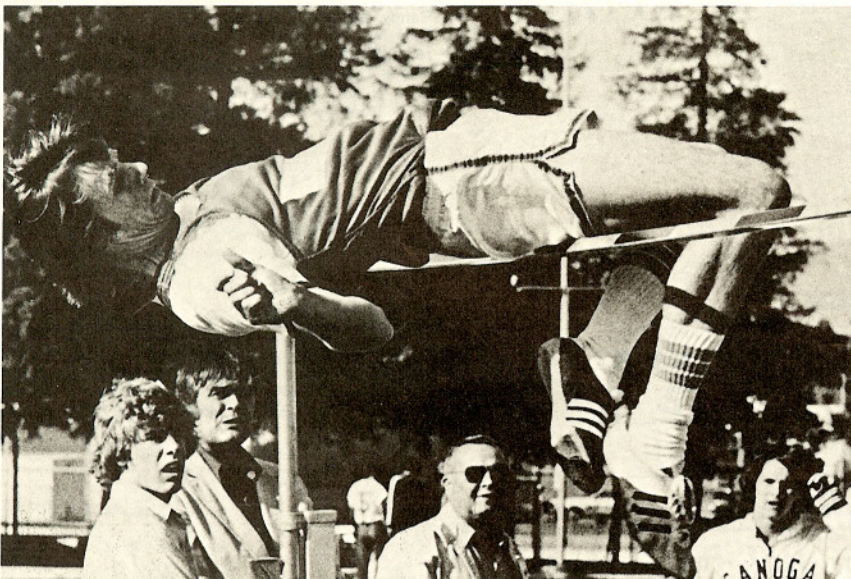

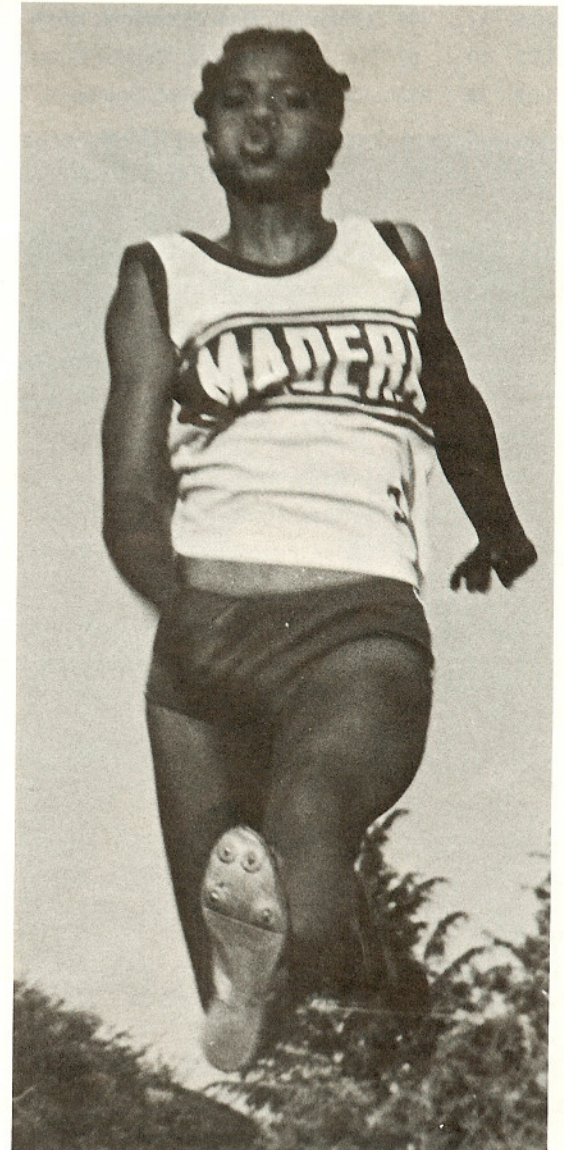
