Guthrie defends crown against Jet 100 duo

NOW THAT THE De Anza Athletic League's dual meet season is over and Cupertino reigns as undisputed king, only the league meet remains before the tortuous path through the Region II, Central Coast Section and State Meets begins.

This year the DAL meet is being held at Fremont High School. The trials are going to be run on Monday, May 8, and Tuesday, May 9, with the finals following on May 11 and May 12.

In the track events the qualifiers are going to be separated into heats for the trials according to best previous times so that the heats are comparatively filled as to strength.

Only the two-mile, with 10 entrants, will have no trials.

FOR THE FIELD events, a rotation system will be used. Each school's athletes will go at one time, and be given three tries apiece with the top eight marks going to the finals.

The 100 promises to be a hotly contested race with Sunnyvale's pair of sub 10.0 sprinters, Dave Kennedy and John Lopez, along with Cupertino's Steve Guthrie, the defending champion and DAL record holder.

"The mile promises to be the quality distance race," states Chuck Bean, Cupertino's co-head coach, who helped arrange the seedings with Homestead's Rick Milam and Judy Benidt, track coaches there. Cupertino's Dave Avila is the defending champion.

BEAN ALSO THINKS that the 440 will be a good race and that it will be very tight in the 880 for third.

In the field events, the high jump, discus throw and pole vault are loaded with quality competitors.

"The high jump should be very interesting," Bean says. Lynbrook's Greg Hannah and Brian McGee have

cleared 6-5 and 6-4, respectively. Seven jumpers have done 6-2.

THE DISCUS THROW features Fremont's Bill Green at 181-7, Sunnyvale's Steve Struble at 174-7, and Cupertino's Carl Ezerski at 171-10. All these marks are of sectional excellence.

Three pole vaulters could very well go on to the CCS meet, indicating the DAL's dominance in the event. Monta Vista's Ross McAlexander and Homestead's Mitch Preciado have both achieved 15-0 this year while Fremont's Mark Kibort, also a sprinter, has gone 14-6.
