

Carl Berra Honorary Referee

A hearty salute and encomiums are herewith offered Mr. Carl Berra, who for the past five years has served with distinction in his role as Executive Secretary of the Central Section of CIF.

Athletics and Carl Berra go hand in hand. At the University of Arizona he excelled in football and basketball and preceding his college career scintillated in sports and in the classroom at Morenci High in Arizona. While confessing to be no Bobby Riggs or Bill Tilden, Berra did win the state high school tennis crown his senior year.

Berra received his bachelors degree at Arizona U. in 1941, his Masters some years later at the University of Southern California. Following four years in the service during World War II, he returned to coaching and teaching duties at Fontana Junior High School. In 1946 Berra made the big leap to Bakersfield and for the next 32 years served in various roles with the Kern High School District. A brief run-down gives ample evidence he has played a prominent role in Kern County athletics:

- 1. P.E. instructor and varsity head basketball-baseball coach for ten years at Bakersfield High School, producing many championship teams.
- 2. Bakersfield High counselor and athletic director for six years.
- 3. Ten year director and commissioner Bakersfield Junior Baseball Association.
- 4. For 20 years outstanding basketball-football official on the high school and community college level. Past-president Kern County Coaches-Officials Association and inductee into Association's Hall of Fame.
- 5. Recipient of California State Athletic Directors award for his contributions to athletics.
- 6. Director General Services, athletics, driver training, welfare and attendance, Kern High School District 10 years.

Thomas E. Frederick *Referee*

Thomas E. Frederick has had a distinguished career in athletics, first as an outstanding athlete and later as a coach and athletic administrator. He earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees in Physical Education from the University of Wisconsin.

Mr. Frederick coached football at Barrington (Illinois) High School for 13 years, during which time his teams won 80% of their football games and six conference championships. Four teams went undefeated. He led Barrington's track program for six years, coaching two squads to conference championships. In 1981 he was inducted into the Illinois Football Coaches Hall of Fame.

Mr. Frederick was director of athletics at Barrington for 11 years before being named assistant executive secretary of the Illinois High School Association in 1963. He joined the staff of the National Federation of State High School Associations in 1967 as director of its sports film program. He has served as associate executive director of the National Federation since 1977. His principal responsibilities now include coordinating National Federation services for high school athletic directors, meeting planner, and editor of National Federation track and field rules publications.

THE CIF:

Doing the Job for Prep Sports Since 1914

In 1914, as high school athletic teams began crossing district lines to compete with neighboring schools, the CIF was established to provide consistency in sports rules and a safe, rewarding environment for young California athletes. Since that beginning, with fewer than 20,000 athletes, the organization has grown to become the largest youth agency in the state, serving over 320,000 young student-athletes each year.

During dynamic growth years, the CIF saw participation in high school sports double (for both boys and girls) between 1965-1975, and, although since 1978 some leveling-off has occurred in numbers of students participating, indications are that such a trend is due more to a lack of available school programs rather than to a lack of interest or desire on the students' part.

Few Californians realize that the CIF, the sole administrative body of interscholastic athletics, is an independent organization that has been carefully structured to provide needed services to the youth of the state without placing unfair burdens on the public education system. Athletic programs conducted in all 1200 secondary-schools in the state do not exist simply because students desire to participate in sports. The CIF utilizes the volunteer services of over 10,000 persons who are charged with the task of ensuring effective athletic programs for all of the public, private, and parochial high schools of the state.

As a result of effective planning, sound program administration, and a determination to support the philosophy that all student-athletes in our state should be provided with equal participation opportunities, the CIF has propelled California into uncontested leadership in the nurturing of outstanding athletes. Former and current California high school athletes hold more national records than do students from any other state – and our youngsters continue to be highly recruited by top-notch universities across the country. Many of the names are legend – Amy Alcott, Rick Monday, Bill Walton, Pat Haden, John McKay, Scott McGregor, Ron Cuccia, Jill Sterkel, Sherri Howard; all former CIF athletes, all outstanding men and women of whom Californians can be proud.

Although the CIF has been serving California youth for nearly 70 years and can boast of having over four million "alumni," many are unaware of the diversity of CIF administrative responsibility. Day-to-day activities of the CIF state office in Fullerton include enforcing regulations, establishing state calendars' of events, arranging and supervising state championships in four sports, maintaining individual and team sports records, providing publicity to the media, publishing the *State News*, and maintaining legal and insurance services which ensure the very existence of prep sports. In addition, 10 section commissioners throughout the state maintain full-time schedules to ensure that prep athletic events in their areas are operated effectively, safely, and consistently.

The support of the California public has been responsible for the success and expansion of California athletic programs for 68 years. With the continued cooperation and dedication of school superintendents, principals, and athletic directors, as well as the keen interest of over one-half million students and their families each year, the future of prep sports would appear to be bright and healthy. The CIF urges you to lend your support to our young student-athletes by attending high school sporting events in your community on a regular basis. The CIF welcomes you to this championship event; a showcase of some of our finest young California athletes – our nation's future leaders.

CIF COACHES HONORED Those who have contributed notably to the sport of Track and Field



SHARON CHAPMAN Northern Section Anderson Union High School

Sharon (Shari) Lee Chapman graduated from California State University, Chico, in 1968 with a B.A. and in 1974 with an M.A. She received her M.L.S. from San Jose State University in 1980. Sharon associated with track and field from 1978 as Varsity Woman's Track Coach at Anderson Union High School. Highlights of Sharon's coaching career included an undefeated season in 1971; Northern Athletic League Championships 1974-'76; N.S.C.I.F. Semi-Final Championships in '73, '74, and '76; and 19 first place trophies. In all dual to quint meets she compiled a won/loss record of 38-8. She sent girls to the State Meets 4 out of 5 years from 1974-'78.



BURT WILLIAMS Northern Section Shasta High School

Burt Williams is a graduate of the University of Oregon, competed in the quarter mile and mile relay. Coached at Central High School in Oregon for three years. In 1961 and 1962 Central High School was second and third in Class A-2 State Meet. Coached at Central Valley High School and Shasta High School from 1966-1981. During these years initiated a cross-country program at Central Valley and developed the Central Valley Invitational. Has coached various state participants in the past fifteen years. He is a member of the CIF Section Track Committee.



DAVE CLARK North Coast Section Willits High School

Dave is in his ninth year as the head track coach at Willits High School. In 1977 the girls' track program was added at Willits and Dave accepted the combined duties. Willits had 55 of its 450 students out for track this year. "The flexibility of the individual athlete is what attracts me to track. They don't have to be champions of great athletes for a coach to enjoy working with students. Any kind of individual success an athlete has is enjoyable to me." He has directed two NCS Class A championship meets.



BOB WARREN North Coast Section Acalanes High School

Bob celebrated his silver anniversary as the Don's track coach. During that period, he amassed a record of 129 wins, 65 losses, and one tie. His teams have claimed the Foothill Athletic League title eight times, including the last five consecutive years. Under his leadership, the Dons won the North Coast Section Class 2A Boys Championship in 1980, '81, and '82. Scott Christenson, last year's State Meet pole vault champion, is one of his products. He has made many contributions to NCS track and field including serving as Class 2A Meet Director twice in the last five years.



LARRY WAYNE BERRYHILL Sac-Joaquin Section Ceres High School

Larry Berryhill is a graduate of Arizona State University where he earned his B.A. and M.A. degrees. In 1976 he rceived an Ed.D. from Brigham Young University. From 1968-1972 Larry was the varsity track coach at Westwood High School in Mesa, Arizona. While at Westwood his teams won two state championships and were twice state runner-ups. In 1976 he moved to Ceres High School, Ceres, California, where he presently is serving as the head track coach. At Ceres he has a dual meet record of 43 wins and 8 losses and has won four league championships.



HAROLD CLEMENTS Sac-Joaquin Section Bret Harte High School

Harold has coached track at Bret Harte High School from 1969 through 1982. In fourteen years of coaching he has won 12 league championships on the boys varsity, froshsoph and girls levels. He retired last year after winning nine straight league championships and has produced several state meet participants. He is founder and director of the Bret Harte Invitational, the largest small school track invitational, in Northern California.



GEORGE WHITE San Francisco Section Galileo High School

George White has been coaching in the San Francisco Unified School Distirct for the past 23 years. George coached track at Balboa High School for 10 years where he had six city championship teams. At his present school, Galileo High School, he has won the City Track Championship for the past six years. George also coaches football at Galileo. He was named the All-Northern California Football Coach of the Year in 1974, City Coach of the Year in 1978, and the All-Bay Area Coach of the Year in 1980.



DONALD H. BELL Central Coast Section Leland High School

Donald is a graduate of Stanford University and was a member of the varsity track team from 1960-1962 as a discus thrower.He served as the head track coach at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, assistant coach of the All-Army Track Team in 1964 and the head track coach of Pioneer High School, San Jose,California from 1965-1967. He has served as head track coach at Leland High School from 1967. He also serves as the organizer and director of the Quicksilver Classic. All of his 1983 track teams were Santa Teresa League Champions.



STAN DOWELL Central Coast Section Independence High School

Stan has been teaching physical education, art and coaching track for the past 20 years. He served as head track coach at Overfelt and Silver Creek High School, and he is currently the head track coach at Independence High School in San Jose, California. He is presently developing Eric Montgomery who has the pending national high school hurdle record.

Under her leadership the Immanuel girl teams have been undefeated and league champions for the last six years. Many of her athletes have also qualified for section and state meets. She has also served as league representative for girl's track and cross country for the last four years.



DAVE DODSON Central Section Sanger High School

Dave Dodson has been the head cross country and track coach at Sanger High for the past 19 years coaching both the boys and girls squads. During his tenure as the Sanger coach all boys school records (except two) have been broken and he has coached several nationally ranked athletes. His swuads are regularly ranked in the top level of the Central Section and his relay teams have been top ranked on several occassions. He has been meet director of the Sanger Metric Classic since 1966 as well as meet director of several section championships and numerous league, area and divisional championships.



JOHN ODEN Los Angeles City Section Eagle Rock High School

John is a graduate of Southern California University and after 33 years as the Eagle Rock High School track coach he is the dean of the Los Angeles city track coaches. Coach Oden has come up with solid teams every year even though Eagle Rock is one of the small schools in the area. He has won numerous league championships and each year has several finishers in the L.A. City Championship Meet. His girls' track team has won the Northern League Championship the last five years. He served as co-coach of the 1970 Sunair Invitational All-Star Track Meet.



DAN WYATT Los Angeles City Section Kennedy High School

He has been coaching track for 14 years, the last 5 at Kennedy. Overall, since 1979, the Golden Cougar track team has compiled a dual meet record of 42-0, captured 5 league titles, one L.A. City Championship, two second place finishes in L.A. City, the 1980 California State Championship, and finished second and third in the state in 1981 and 1982, respectively. He has worked with seven girls who have been named National High School Track All-Americans, and coached the Cougars to 5 national track records.

Kye is a graduate of Manhattan College where he particiapted in track and was a member of the two mile relay team that set the world indoor record in 1961. He was also the IC4-A 400 meter champion in 1961 and the Interservice 400 meter champion in 1962. He started his teaching and coaching career at Hawthorne High School in 1967. He was appointed head track coach in 1979. Since 1979 in the Pioneer and Ocean League competition he has a dual meet record of 52 wins and 7 losses. In his 13 years at La Jolla High School in the San Diego Section, Coach Boyer has strung together an impressive 82-13 dual meet record. After graduation from San Diego school at the high school and college level, Chuck returned to high school at the coaching level to gain 9 track and field league titles, 7 in succession. Notable athletes coached included Ann King, later to become National JC 400 meter hurdle champion and Karin Smith, American record holder in the javelin. In additin t his coaching duties, Chuck has been published in the "Athlete Journal" and the "Scholastic Coach".



DAN SCHAITEL San Diego Section St. Augustine High School

Coach Schaitel in 13 years at St. Augustine High School and one year at Poway High School is another San Diego student, athlete, coach who decided that living and coaching in the greater San Diego community was to his liking. At "Saints" he built the track and field program to an impressive level for a school of only 550 students. In addition to several section champions, he guided athletes to medalist honors in both running and field events. As a meet director, he has overseen a major invitational track and field event for the last 8 years. His "Titan Track Festival" last April attracted over 3,000 boys and girls, the largest field in San Diego Section history. In addition, Dan has found time to serve on both the Cross Country and Track and Field Advisory Committees as well as act as meet director for the San Diego Cross Country Championships.




1982-1983 SCHOLAR/ATHLETES OF THE YEAR
